PC Observations...

Reporting from the Parish Council meeting

There was almost a full house for the 19 November meeting. Seven members of the public attended for the discussion of planning applications and their contributions were very useful.

The first planning application to be discussed was a small scale standby electricity generation plant to be built by a company, TGC Renewables, in Tarn Lane nearby where it crosses the M6. It is one of 40 to be built across the UK. It runs on Red Diesel and at 4.5 MW, it is very much a reserve facility to be activated when the National Grid comes under strain – 50 to 250 hours per year – usually between 4pm and 7pm on cold winter days. In a very helpful report covering security, impact on the environment, noise risk and transport implications, the TGC Manager was able to calm any doubts councillors might have had and the application was passed unanimously. Construction is likely to start in the summer of 2016 to be operational by November 2016.

A second planning application – rebuilding the Old Station Inn as a private dwelling – was introduced by Allison Powell of architects the Wright Design Partnership. Although the

building will be demolished, the new build will look very similar to the existing building. Councillors had no objections and the application was passed unanimously.

The meeting continued with its regular business. There was no Police Report so councillors moved on to the draft budget for 2015/16 (approved) and then the proposed Library Room to replace the now defunct mobile Library Van. Councillors agreed to pay the rent for the room and this service will be open to all-comers during opening times.

Alan Wren reported that a new defibrillator is being installed on the wall of the Memorial Hall with full instructions. If you need to use it, dial 999 to get a code to unlock the case in which it is kept. Alan is also training up teachers and representatives of village groups.

Moira Rowley has been beavering away raising money from the Hadfield Trust, Cumbria County Council and the Onion Show Committee and has struck a deal to replace the seesaw on the children's playground. She also reported that dog waste dispenser bags are now available on Burton's dog walking trails – please use them! Moira also reported that Bonfire night had been a great success.

Peter Smith asked Roger Bingham what was happening with the proposed 'Cumbria Deal' proposal to change the way in which the county's economy and public services are run - www.cumbria.gov.uk/eLibrary/Content/Internet/536/6181/42251145142.pdf.

Roger reported that the idea was still being discussed but it depended on agreement by the six district councils and the county council. That will be a challenge!

Councillors were generally annoyed at the confusion that has resulted from the reorganisation of the refuse collection system by South Lakeland District Council. Roger Bingham agreed that it was a mess. Councillors asked for transparency in finding out about the costs and benefits from the reorganisation. I don't want to sound pessimistic but will this ever happen? Very unlikely.

The overall impression from the discussions at PC meetings is that whereas small local enterprise initiatives such as those carried out by Burton's local councillors are happening, if there is a need for district and county councillors to agree, it means delay and confusion.


The New Library Service

Vicar's Letter...

Before its time

Biographies are normally written after the subject has died. Of course, if you are confident of the significance of your life you could try writing 'My life, Part 1' while you are still alive. Would it not be very strange though to find a story of someone's life that was written before they were born? That is what Jesus claimed had happened to him.

The people of his day diligently studied the Old Testament hoping to find the secret of life but Jesus said that the book was all about him. His life was mapped out before his birth in the stories of kings who were shepherds of God's people before the coming of The King, and prophets who were God's mouthpieces before the coming of The Word. And the priests who made sacrifices for sin on behalf of their people were foreshadowing The Priest who would give up his own life as The Sacrifice for our sin. Every story in the Old Testament, from beginning to end, whispers the name of Jesus. Every word teaches us about Jesus, shows our need of Jesus or prepares us to receive Jesus.

We would find it difficult to accept that someone had drawn up a plan for our life that we must follow. But God's Son played it by the book, built his life according to his Father's blueprint, accepted the plot handed to him – including even the violence against him. And through everything he kept looking forward to the glorious ending already written - the rescue from judgment of many, many people who have distanced themselves from God, bringing them into the peace and prosperity of his eternal kingdom.

Some people live lives that result in a book. Jesus came to fulfil the story already written for him. *All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had said through the prophet: 'The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel' – which means, 'God with us.'* (Matthew 1:22-23)



Extended Opening Hours for Christmas 2015

Christmas is "just around the corner" and soon there will be cards and presents to post and the inevitable home-shopping items to return.

Roger Reports...

from the District & County Councils

As always, at this time of year, while we await the chancellor's Autumn Statement, local government is obsessed with finance. But already we know the strictures controlling 2016-17 budget. On the county council, we will need an additional £17.5m to help bridge the gap left by the anticipated reduction in the Government Support Grant, which in 2015 accounted for £148m out of Cumbria's £797m expenditure (which includes grants to schools.) Further savings will be required of £15.5m in 2017/18 and £22m in 2018/19.

The trouble is that one person's savings can, if they are directly affected, be regarded as unjustifiable cuts. Thus, there has been some criticism in the county council's Budget Consultation paper of the official view which, arguably, minimised the affect of reduced subsidised school transport as it stated that 'out of 74 bus routes the council used to help, 53 are carried on commercially without a subsidy. Post 16 Transport is now arranged by colleges and schools. Low income families continue to receive support.'

Another possible economy being considered is the amalgamation of the 'blue-lamp' services so that the

Ambulance, Police, Fire and Rescue services would be under one administrative umbrella. But fierce opposition to Cumbria's Fire and Recue Service being organised from Warrington and weaknesses in the 'integrated' all-Scotland single police force indicate that amalgamations can be controversial.

NB: Elections for the Police and Crime Commissioner will be held on the same day as the district and parish council elections on 5 May 2016.

Some of the cuts in Government grants will be covered by the recently approved decision to transfer the non-domestic rates to councils. So far it has not been calculated what proportion of the NDR will go to the county, police or district authorities.

Even so, the county has already envisaged the second rise, (after a county council tax freeze between 2011-15) of 2%. This would mean an increase £28.95 on a Band E property bringing its county rate up to £1476.81 pa. South Lakeland District Council has not yet proposed any Council Tax increases but has decided not to raise car parking charges, although fees for moorings etc on Lake Windermere will go up by 2%.

One of SLDC's major concerns remains housing. The number of households in

need of 'affordable' housing rose from 3,200 in 2011 to 3,435 in 2014. It is proposed to raise the value of affordable houses by 5% so a one bedroom flat would be £73,500, a two bed house £99,750 and a four bed house (if you can find one!) £131,250. The greatest perceived need is for 1-2 bedroom homes for young people, and secondly for 'independent living accommodation' for older people such as has recently been built in Kirkby Lonsdale.

SLDC is also tackling the problem of empty homes of which there are nearly a thousand in the district. 445 have been empty for more than two years including 89 empty flats in the long defunct K-Village in Kendal. Even so, the aim to bring 20% of long-term empty homes into use by 2025, and 70 empty homes back into use annually, will only go part of the way.

Moreover, the recent announcement of the extension of the Lake District and Yorkshire Dales National Parks, respectively, to include the Lyth Valley villages and Barbon and Middleton in Lunesdale may, by probably restricting developments there, force more building in the neighbouring areas like Burton as happened in 2010, when SLDC excluded the National Parks from its Local Development Plan. So old and some new problems remain.

Even so - have a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Historical Footnote...

... by Roger Bingham

BURTON ON THE WARPATH

Two hundred and thirty years ago this month Burton enjoyed (or suffered) its brightest moment in the limelight of history during the Second Jacobite Rebellion of 1745. An earlier rebellion had occurred in 1715 when an attempt was made to put the son of James II (deposed in 1688) on the throne. It was after his Latinised name of Jacobus that his supporters were called Jacobites. In both rebellions Westmorland was invaded by the Scots. But in 1715 the 'pretender' King was absent and the rebels missed Burton by going via Kirkby Lonsdale on the way to their defeat at Preston.

In 1745, however, Burton was twice on the main warpath as the rebels advanced and retreated through the village. Memorably also, their leader The Young Pretender, nicknamed Bonnie Prince Charlie, was present. As it was his custom to dismount when he reached a built-up area to lead his contingent on foot it is possible that he marched along Main Street. Sadly, no specific incident is recorded of his brief visit although he was followed by the journalistic rat-pack of the day including reporters from the Kendal Courant. Nevertheless, a myth arose that he took

refreshment at Hutton House which like several other Burton buildings already existed.

We do know, however, that he did not sleep in Burton as the time table of his campaign was well recorded. Having landed in the outer isles in July, he'd scattered the government forces in August; then, as winter drew on he took the western route into England to evade the Royal army under Marshal Wade which was at Newcastle. Crossing the border on 8th November, the Jacobites quickly occupied Carlisle and were in Penrith by the 18th.

It was now that the local authorities panicked. Guns were imported through the port of Milnthorpe; valuables were hidden, so that at Heversham the churchwardens spent a shilling 'when the church plate was hid', and horses, carts and even ladders had to be spirited away. The weather was appalling. After crossing snow-covered Shap Fell, the rebels trudged into Kendal on the 20th where Charlie slept. The bulk of the cavalry, under Lord George Murray, left the next day and according to a documentary history the 'main body caught up the horse at Burton-in-Kendal on the Lancashire boundary on the 23rd.'

That night Charlie slept at Lancaster. Three weeks later, having lost their nerve and turned round at Derby, the

rebels under the Duke of Perth, retreated haphazardly back through Burton on Friday 13th December. Charlie slunk through on the 14th along with his cannon and baggage train. As they squelched ahead his jittery Jacobites increasingly found that 'the country was raised against them.'

On the Saturday, shots were fired at Kendal, warning beacons blazed on the hill tops and, two days later, 'the last battle on English soil' was fought at Clifton Moor in north Westmorland. To the south, around Burton, the rebels' rear guard was breaking up. 'Hundreds or so of horse were hunted round' but, having re-formed their forces, they managed to cross the border on the 21st December which happened to be Prince Charlie's not very happy 25th birthday.

By now the hero was the Prince William of his day, William Duke of Cumberland, the second son of King George II and commander of the royal army. As he advanced through Burton on the 16th December he was cheered for saving the district from rapine and massacre. It was as a token of this acclaim that pubs at Kendal and, nearer home, at Farleton were named 'the Duke of Cumberland.' Even so, it is Charlie's incursion into British - and into Burton's - history which is best remembered.

Recycling of unwanted medical equipment


For some time now I have been concerned about the waste of medical equipment, specifically disabled aids that cannot for various reasons be returned to the NHS.



It's that time of year again when the bulk of the bird migration has passed by us and there is little now in the skies to record. After saying that this year has been very poor in relation to our more common species like the Meadow Pipits or the Chaffinch with very few records compared to previous years. Although it's been poor in our area they have been doing OK at 50% of the national recording sites. Theories as to what might have gone wrong in the North West are already being submitted and the most likely maybe that they suffered earlier in the breeding season with the sudden change in weathers. I am sure that before long we should get some answers!

It was nice to see our wintering party of Yellowhammers mixed with Tree Sparrows were starting to collect around the Slape Lane/Vicarage Lane areas and I must have counted at least 15 Yellowhammers (6 November). Also I love to see and hear the hooting or kew-wick calls of our local Tawny Owl, but last month, it was even more

special to see a Barn Owl quartering the fields in our village.

Most days now are taken up going up on to Hutton Roof Common in search of the Great Grey Shrike, which up to today (20 November) has not been seen or recorded, but I will certainly let you know if any do turn up. The weather is forecast to turn this weekend (22 November) and bring in lots of cold weather from the North, and I'll bet a Shrike or two may just take advantage and cross over the North Sea from Scandinavia and into Cumbria!

What has turned up in good numbers so far this year are Snipe and Woodcock and I am accidently flushing them on most days whilst up on Ploverlands and throughout Hutton Roof. It's always said that the Woodcock will arrive on the first full moon in November! I was reading that Woodcock may be down in numbers by as much as 40% so it's great to see them up on Hutton Roof. We are also lucky locally in that Dr. Stuart Sharp from Lancaster University is currently conducting a survey on the numbers of Woodcock found breeding and wintering on the Dalton Hall Estate.

Little in the way of flora this last month, with the exception of some nice rare variant ferns which have been found in Dalton Craggs. Four different "scollies"




