

Our Parish Council has alerted Burton to this issue and I would suggest that SLDC gets a Good Big Shakeup from Burton. I urge all Burton residents to apply for a Blue Box Wheelie. It's your taxes after all so you do have a say.

PC Observations...

Reporting from the
Parish Council meeting

April 21st Meeting

Almost a 'full house' of Councillors attended with two members of the public who were supporting a planning application request. Note that it's always a good idea to come to Parish Council if you have submitted a planning application. It helps Councillors to understand your case.

Nothing in the police report apart from a dog reported to be worrying sheep and an accusation that children had damaged a tree outside the school. Councillors observed that the children were not the culprits anyway – the damage was caused by trucks coming through the village. Are the police really bothered about the report? Two road crashes happened in Burton during April that were not even mentioned in the report!

There was an interesting discussion about the feasibility of bringing in a Community Speedwatch scheme to monitor speeders along the Clawthorpe stretch of the A6070. Councillors were doubtful about using volunteers from the community to run it preferring instead a fixed solar-powered speeding

indicator system which would tell drivers what speed they were doing and give them a smiling face if it was within the legal limit. There is a cost to this and Councillors were keen to explore various funding sources but also use their own resources if necessary. Let's hope this happens because speeding (along with dog poo and parking outside the school) is a big issue for Burtonians.

The Green Dragon Housing Development scheme (92 new houses in Burton) is the main topic for a Planning Workshop on 19 May. SLDC is calling for 3 Councillors and 3 members of the public to attend. The Workshop will be identifying how key issues such as pedestrian walkways, vehicular access, the mix of housing types and capacity of Burton's school, roads and other services to absorb such an expansion could be managed. Jane Hopwood, Alan Wren and George Isherwood volunteered as Councillors and several Burton residents will be invited too.

The Quarry run by Aggregate Industries is also running a public exhibition further to the likely expansion of the quarry's life by 20 years from 2024. It is in the interest of all Burtonians to attend because the expansion will affect road traffic through the village for many years to come. The existing 'gentleman's agreement' to limit trucks passing

through the village could also be under threat and Jane Hopwood called for action to make this agreement legally binding along with a renegotiated contract for the quarry to maintain the A6070 highway. Dates for the exhibition are as follows:

A post exhibition liaison meeting with Councillors will be held during the week commencing 6 June.

Further points in the meeting included:
Agreement for Ashlea Landscaping to carry out grass cutting in public spaces in Burton.
Welcoming the election for new Councillors on 5 May.
Agreeing to use updated financial regulations issued by the National Association of Local Councils.
Accepting the resignation of Peter Smith as a Parish Councillor with warm expressions of gratitude for all his service to the Council as both a Parish Clerk and a Councillor.
To consider more planting of daffodils alongside the A6070 coming into Burton because there has been such a good show this year (Jane Hopwood).
To observe that vigilante activity in Dalton Craggs (graffiti about cutting

down beech trees and cutting wires around a tree cultivation area) is completely unnecessary and Forestry Commission is investigating (Francis Mason-Hornby).

To report that Burton's Asset Register is now up-to-date (Paul Rogers).

To fix a slate on the Bus Shelter on the north A6070 side of Burton (George Isherwood).

To lament the complexity surrounding the flooding on the A6070 near the quarry exit (Mike Taylor). It is caused by the lack of coordination of agencies involved (United Utilities, the Quarry, Holme Park Bridle Way, County Council Highways) resulting in excessive run-off from the fell and blocked drains.

To warn Burton residents that the 0845 number to County Council Highways Department about flooding and highway problems is charged at 36p/minute but free by internet. Not bad for an emergency service!

To welcome the clearing of many drains along Main Street by Highways Department.

To get on with resurfacing of playground and tennis court areas as soon as possible.

The next PC Meeting will be on Wednesday 18 May at 7.30pm.

Vicar's Letter...

Plot Twist

Do you enjoy a story with a plot twist, a tale where the solidly reliable character suddenly (and shockingly) turns out to be working for the enemy, or so it seems, until eventually you discover that they've been set up by the other solid reliable character? It can be deeply unsettling to enter into a world like this where nothing is certain and no-one can be trusted but such a story will probably keep our interest right to the last chapter or scene.

Jesus also tells stories with plot twists. There is a man who knows how to run a profitable business and who has future-proofed his enterprise by covering every angle, or has he? In another of his stories there is the young waster who is on his way to well-deserved ruin while his diligent brother is on course for taking over the family farm. What could possibly go wrong?

But Jesus does not tell this kind of story just to give the thrill of riding a scary roller-coaster through a contorted plot. He wants people to be shocked now by the way his stories end so that they won't end up being shocked later by the way that their own life-story ends. And

Wholesome Milk From Happy Cows!

We are Tom and Clare Noblet, we farm in partnership with Max and Jenny Burrow at Whin Yeats, Hutton Roof. Last year, with falling milk prices threatening the future sustainability of the farm, we put in a small dairy and started to make some of our cow's milk into unpasteurised cheese. It's been a huge learning curve and we are continuing to refine our recipes all the time. We make two types – Whin Yeats Farmhouse, a smooth, creamy textured cheese, cloth bound and buttered, and matured for at least 12 weeks, and Fellstone - a Wensleydale-type with a drier texture and fresher taste, cloth bound, buttered and matured for 8 weeks.

We are also now able to sell our lovely, fresh, unpasteurised milk directly from the farm. Straight from the cows, cooled in the tank and then bottled, we believe this is milk at it's best – fresh, unprocessed, not stored or transported. It's becoming more widely recognised that processes such as pasteurisation and homogenisation (which all supermarket milk goes through) could actually contribute to some of the ever-increasing dairy intolerances, allergies and skin and digestive disorders seen; homogenisation of milk (breaking up of

fat particle) is thought to cause fats in milk to be absorbed into the bloodstream more easily, contributing to obesity.

With spring starting to make an appearance, we're pleased to now be able to offer our cheese, milk and eggs for sale from the farm on Saturdays 10am – 12pm, for other times please call us, or we may be able to deliver locally. To find us, follow the road up from Clawthorpe to the top of the fell – we're over the brow on the left.

Those of you who are observant will have noticed that Burton Memorial Hall has gained a new circular green box with a green light on it at the Southern entrance. This is a 'Public Access Defibrillator' it has been erected by Burton First Responders and part funded by money raised at the Onion Show.

The AED (Defibrillator) is registered with NWS (North West Ambulance Service) and is part of a network of AED's around the country.

The password code for the door is given to a member of the public by NWS if deemed necessary during a 999 call.

The AED inside the box is designed to be used by an unqualified person and is simple to use with voice prompts.

However, I will be carrying out training on how to use an AED to various community groups in the near future.

It's all started again for another year with almost all of our regular Chiffchaffs having now returned to their regular haunts, at the time of writing (21st April) I think we are still waiting for "Pear" of Pear Tree Cottage. The earliest I had this year was Craig and Craggy who hail from Plain Quarry and whom I first recorded on the 31st March.

Back to the Warblers and for me it's always great to hear the very first Willow Warbler, even if it is only singing in broken song. My first was in lower Dalton Crag when I just could make out dear Willow as she sung in half-hearted song. The date was 9th April with more and more of the little beauties arriving daily. So far in April I have been fortunate to count large falls within Dalton especially on 12th, 15th with a peak over the mornings of 20th and 21st.

I am told early Swallows had been seen at the usual "early spot" over by Whasset. For me this year the earliest

birds seen were on the 12th April over near the Borwick fisheries. The first main entry at local sites came over the weekend of the 15th and 16th April. Since that date birds have been coming through in good numbers and also it was noted odd birds were back on territory at Russell Farm, Green Dragon and elsewhere.

My first returning Blackcap was on 17th April in or around Plain Quarry.

My first Tree Pipits arrived yesterday (20th April) when three were recorded in upper Dalton Crag (deforested area) they are still very quiet – no song being offered just the odd three syllables, but any day now they will crack up in song!

Today (21st April – our Queen's 90th birthday) I had my first Northern Greenland Wheatear with three beauties all stood to attention with their almost straight backs. Everything ticked the boxes for these beauties to have been the rarer "leucorhoa race" and to think they have travelled from far down in Africa and although only calling off here at Dalton Crag for a day or maybe two at the most, will then continue their journey all the way up to either the Faroes, Iceland or Greenland. They are one of the long distance travellers.

Butterflies recorded: Brimstone (19th April), also odd Small Tortoiseshell, and lots of Peacocks.

Flowers include: Wood Anemone, Wild Strawberry, Ground Ivy, Dog Violets, Red Campion, Stitchworts.

OURS SWIFTS ARE EXPECTED BACK ANYDAY NOW! And we have been busy clearing the Ivy away on the Royal so they will have a direct entry to their regular sites. Hopefully once the birds are back and established we can start to observe and report on our local populations. Hedgehogs need your help – new Cumbria Wildlife Trust online survey

The once-common hedgehog is now under threat. The loss of hedgerows, tidier gardens and an increase in the intensification of farming in our agricultural landscape are all reasons for the decline in hedgehogs.

In just the last 10 years, hedgehog numbers have fallen by 30%, and there are now thought to be fewer than one million left in the UK. They are disappearing from our countryside as fast as tigers are worldwide.

We don't know how many have gone from Cumbria but by asking people to complete the survey we can find out more about where hedgehogs are living, whether numbers are increasing, decreasing or staying the same and how many are dying on our roads.

Historical Footnote...

... by Roger Bingham

Burgundy & Burton

'Burgundy' nowadays generally refers to a darkish red colour for cloth or a wine of the same hue. But the name derives from a clutch of provinces covering parts of France, Belgium and Germany which, in the fifteenth century, were as rich and as powerful as neighbouring kingdoms including England.

A tantalising connection between Burgundy and Burton has recently been revealed by a Cumberland and Westmorland Archaeological & Antiquarian Society's article on *'Medieval coin finds in Cumbria 2015.'*

It reports, *'Only one continental coin has been recorded, a double patard of Grand Duke Charles the Bold of Burgundy dating from 1467-77 found near Burton-in-Kendal. This coin is probably a result of the English-Burgundy monetary alliance signed in 1469 between Edward IV and Charles. The alliance allowed English coins to be circulated in Charles' territories and coins of Burgundy in England.'*

The high value silver patard remained in circulation until Henry VIII called in all

coins for a re-coinage of English currency in 1527.

Consequently Burgundian coins could have come to our area over a long period. Trade in such products as Kendal Green cloth resulting from Westmorland's contemporary booming textile industry is the obvious reason for the coins arrival here.

It is, however, just possible that it might have been dropped during a rebellion against Henry VII who, as the representative of the House of Lancaster, had taken the English throne from the House of York in 1485.

The rebellion was spurred by Margaret of York, the widow of Charles the Bold and the sister of the dead Yorkist kings, Edward IV and Richard III. Notoriously, she championed a pretender to the throne, Lambert Simnel, who was in fact an English lad but whom the Burgundians and Yorkists claimed to be the Yorkist heir the Earl of Warwick.

As a start the rebels landed in Ireland, where the Yorkists were strong and crowned Lambert as King Edward VI in Dublin. Then, in May 1487 the Yorkist's forces invaded England via Piel island before splashing across Morecambe Bay into our area. Possibly arriving around Arnside and the port of Milnthorpe, they made for Kirkby

Lonsdale into Yorkshire and thence to the main invasion (A1) route into England.

Finally, on the 16 June, they were defeated on the borders of Nottinghamshire at the Battle of Stoke Field in the last battle of the Wars of the Roses.

Speculatively, as the invaders included a contingent of German and Flemish mercenaries, the patard might have been accidentally dropped or traded by one of them.

One wonders, also, if any Burton folk trekked over to see the invaders and to wave at the pretender king.

Poor, put-on Lambert, as everyone use to know, was spared execution and forced instead to work in the royal kitchens where any pay he got would be far less than the value of Burton's Burgundian patard.

We have covered the regular big village events such as the Daffodil and Onion Shows, Children's Sports Day, the 10K and Fun Run, and the two annual art and craft shows.
