




## Mobile Bank



# Outdoors

A track of crushed flint and chalkstones led us uphill between high dense hedges. Through rare gaps we could see the solid gold of wheat, almost ripe and waiting for the combine. No farms for miles - only these massed crops, which would be contract-mown in another fortnight.

We're in Hampshire, I keep telling myself - a place as foreign to me as Belgium until these last few years when young family have settled near Winchester. Today the countryside has looked unreal and tame, through the windows of trains that have whisked us through Cheshire, Staffordshire, Warwickshire, Oxfordshire, West Berkshire. Low-lying, gently contoured fields; broad-leaved trees rationed to about four per hedgerow, model oaks, model sycamores, like the logo on a packet of Country Life butter. Herds of Friesians browsing dutifully, as though modelling for a Drink More Milk ad. The occasional horse like a brown statue in a neglected corner of a pasture field, thinking or else just standing.

Here in Hampshire the land perks up, swelling into downs, and the soil is less claggy, more textured. Flints lie about like primitive netsukis, outsides coated with a millimetre of chalk, insides showing blue-black. I picked some up, and felt July warmth in the palm of my hand, at a place where a footpath choked with blackthorn forced us to walk on the beaten earth of the field edge. Here I touched wheat for the first time - after seventy years of eating bread made from it - and

brushed my hand against the bristling weight of the heads, and chewed an ear of it (sorry, farmer - just one, and you have trillions.) It tasted mildly of grass.

On the track, hemmed in by hedgerows, all we could see was the next fifty yards. Notices warned us repeatedly that this is the Military Firing Range of Chilcomb Down. No firing today. The verges are embroidered with the purple of knapweed and vetch, the yellow of an elegantly-balanced flower which Anne identifies as toadflax. After half an hour we come out onto an upland clearing and light beams all around us as though the sun has risen again. Short grass underfoot; a huge manure heap ready for ploughing in when autumn comes; double lines of track heading off towards distant roads. Poppies flare along the verge of a rape-field, whose flowers have turned into clusters of spiny pods full of round black seeds.

No hedge or further rise cuts short our vistas. Golden fields billow off eastward towards the terra incognita of Sussex; more golden waves to the west with the blue blur of Dorset beyond. To the south such a distance of sunny fields stretches away that the pale-blue plain beyond it could almost be the Channel. Our minds can cruise off here, like that single buzzard flying towards Twyford. Or they can speed from point to point like the hurtling wood pigeons which are the great bird of this country. Nothing comes between us and the sheer blue sky. The wind is blowing warm straight out of the sun. The wheat-heads are jostling each other as the wind brushes them. Their stalks - unripe turquoise or ripe bamboo yellow - flinch against each other like the plucked strings of a harp.



## *Roger Reports...*

Cuts are the name of the council's games now that the new coalition government is requiring substantial reductions in local government expenditure. If the councils limit any rise in expenditure to less than 2% (which is 'below inflation') then the extra sum will be paid by a central government grant so there would be NO increase in the county and district Council Tax in 2011. I am not yet sure whether the same conditions apply to the Police authority's and parish councils' share of 'the rates'. As 80%+ of all council spending is on staff costs (which are more than just salaries and pension contributions) the cuts could mean a drop in service provision. No one wants bureaucracy but when it comes to e.g. applications for or opposing planning permission we all want quick and accurate information all of which require 'bureaucrats'. Even so a step to cut down on quangos has started with the abolition of the North West Development Agency.

Some of the cuts implemented or proposed so far by Cumbria County Council include a pay freeze for all employees earning more than £21,000pa; rises for the lower paid will be limited to £250 p.a. Recruitment for new staff will be for 'essential purposes only' and, I hope, the selection/interview processes will be simplified to avoid costs like South Lakeland's

administration's provision of up to £50,000 for the appointment 'process' for a new Chief Executive. Some services will be protected particularly where vulnerable people are concerned but the children's service budget will be cut by £1.65m and the £65m Building Schools for the Future programme will be curtailed. The Health estimates are to be reduced by 25% over four years through 'efficiency savings' and not by cutting 'client care'. On roads last year's £12.2m increase will continue - which should pay for extra gritting - but there will be cuts of £200,000 in general road maintenance and of £255,000 for some road safety schemes.

The County Council has also planned to raise reserves to £12m after they had been reduced by the costs incurred by last winter's floods and snow. Plans for any cuts for South Lakeland are still being considered but I should have some information next month. Meanwhile, SLDC's plans to replace Kendal's New Road Car Park by a Common Land Park seem to be going ahead despite continuing opposition, while a major programme to enhance the waterfront area at Bowness is also being considered. But can they be afforded? We'll see!

A recent survey by the Highways department revealed just how much improvement is required. Thus only 34% of repair jobs were found to be right first time. One dropped kerb installation in Allerdale 'required' 17 visits and the 'end to end' time from report to completion was 232 days. As the number of requests for repairs has increased from 6,408 in 2008 to 9,839 in 2009-10 (perhaps because of the effects of bad weather) a reduced employee trial 'of a Two Man Find and Fix It' scheme is being tried out in Eden. By cutting down on

'inspectors' and consequent 'reports' the end to end fix rate has been cut from 183 to 34 days and the 'good' assessment has increased from 10% to 84.% I hope that the scheme will be extended to South Lakeland. In the meantime don't forget the Highways Hotline 0845 609 6609. I will myself soon be doing my annual survey of salt heap sites. Please let me know of any new requirements and of regular omissions - e.g. for several years 'they' seem to forget to replenish the heap at the top of Morewood Drive.

Two schemes just out of our area are likely to prompt concern locally. They are plans to extend the Yorkshire Dales National Park into our Lower Kentdale county division while also reducing membership and proposals for Longfield Tarn Wind Farm just over the county boundary from Burton and Hutton Roof. Perhaps comment should wait until plans are published.







**As there was no-one available to attend the meeting & write a report for BN this month, we bring you the Minutes of the latest Parish Council meeting...**

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 19 August 2010 at 7.30 pm in the Memorial Hall,

**PRESENT.** Cllrs P Rogers,(Chairman), R Boddy, J Hopwood, I Hunt, G Isherwood, M Taylor, A Wren, and Parish Clerk P Smith. District and County Cllr R Bingham was in attendance.

**PUBLIC IN ATTENDANCE.** Twenty five members of the public were present.

**1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE.** Apologies from F Mason-Hornby and Cllr J Brown were accepted. Apologies from Dist Cllr B Cooper were received.

**2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST.** Cllr I Hunt declared a prejudicial interest in Item 6a being one of the planning applicants. Cllr P Rogers declared a prejudicial interest in Item 6a having had a previous financial interest in the outcome. **3. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD 15 JULY 2010.** The minutes of the meeting held on 15 July 2010 were unanimously agreed and signed by the Chairman.

**4. CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS. (ACTION)**  
a. There will be a meeting of the Local Area Partnership on Thursday 26 August. Cllr Rogers will attend.  
b. CALC District Association AGM will be on 15 July at 7:00pm at the Time Out Project Brettargh Holt. The council will not be represented.  
c. Proposed subjects for the Autumn Newsletter should be passed to the Clerk by 31 August. (ALL)

### **5. OPEN FORUM.**

a. PCSO Jessica Bullock reported some minor anti-social behaviour which had been addressed at the time. She also reported that following the theft of a vehicle from Curwen Woods a man had been arrested and was being held on remand by Lancashire Police.  
b. Following on from the PCSO's report, Cllr Boddy noted that vehicle insurance policies may not cover theft if the keys have been left in an unattended vehicle.  
c. County Cllr Bingham reported a rise in the A-Level results achieved by Cumbrian schools broadly in line with the national average.

Cllr P Rogers and Cllr I Hunt stepped down from the Council at this point and joined the public for the public-participation discussion of the proposed development of the Royal Hotel site. Cllr G Isherwood was proposed by Cllr Wren, seconded by Cllr Taylor and unanimously elected chairman.

d. Cllr Hunt made a statement about the development of the Royal Hotel site, describing the objective as being to produce a development sympathetic to the central location in the village where smaller houses predominated. He noted that despite the requirement to include parking for one vehicle per dwelling, they had included 25 parking places for the sixteen properties and intended to make some of these

available for neighbouring residents. Two residents who neighbour the site both offered support to the development which they felt would enhance the centre of the village. They both submitted written evidence to the Council. One resident, whilst not opposing the development, expressed his concern that the loss of the site for casual car parking combined with the limited amount of parking included in the development would increase on-street parking on Main Street with consequential effects on pedestrian safety and traffic flow. He recommended that this be addressed by the Parish Council before the development was completed. He opposed the introduction of yellow lines to control parking and offered suggestions for alternative parking. One resident had commented by e-mail that the loss of parking was a concern and that the Parish Council should seek alternative solutions to the parking requirement. She also expressed her disappointment that renewable energy systems had not been designed into the planned new properties. The chairman of the Burton Recreation Trust which leases the land adjacent to the site welcomed the planned development which he felt would enhance the approach to the recreation area. Cllr Bingham commented that he was pleased that the plans had retained the historically important architectural features of the old hotel and the adjoining cottage. Cllr P Rogers and Cllr I Hunt left the room.

#### 6. PLANNING APPLICATIONS.

a. Applications received:

(i) SL/2010/0695 and 0696 - Demolition of outbuildings, conversion & alteration of the Royal Hotel to form 5 dwellings and construction of 10 dwellings with access road and car parking.

In discussion it was agreed to address car-parking in

the village as a separate agenda item and to consider whether the parish plan should require more than one parking space per dwelling for properties in the village because of the limited on-street parking. Cllr Wren proposed, Cllr Taylor seconded and it was unanimously resolved to offer support to the development. Cllr P Rogers and I Hunt returned to the room; Cllr P Rogers resumed the chair.

(ii) SL/2010/0630 – Erection of a conservatory at the rear of 1, Barker Close. Resolved to offer no objection.

(iii) SL/2010/0540 – Erection of Stable Block and creation of a Manege and associated works on land to the South of Burtlands Farm, at the junction of Moss Lane and Station Lane. Resolved to offer no objection

b. Applications refused: None

c. Applications granted: SL/2010/0386 – Erection of warehouse and associated development on land at the junction of Moss Lane and Station Lane.

## *Historical Footnote by Roger Bingham*

### **Historical Accounts**

The Georgian era from 1714 to 1830 was one of the most momentous in our history which saw the advent of the Industrial Revolutions, political developments and almost incessant wars. Yet most of these themes are hardly touched on in the most compendious Burton records of the period which are the 'Churchwardens Accounts'. They, nevertheless, shed light on day to day life. Fortunately the handwriting is legible and the spelling almost modern with a few exceptions like 'owl' (for oil), 'plaisterer', 'ffish' and 'Kendall'.

The Churchwardens had mixed social and ecclesiastical responsibilities. Hence we see '1717 - Given to a poor suffering traveller 2/6'; '1717 - given a poor man 1s6d'; 1721 'spent upon a stranger minister during the vicar's absence 11 shillings' and 1723 'expenses at Heversham in meeting Bishop - 6s 4d'. Normally they charged 12s - one shilling each - for attendance at their quarterly meetings which was about the daily rate for a workman - say about £80 in the values of today.

Rare references to national events include 'expenses at ye day of rejoicing - 6s' which followed the defeat of Bonny Prince Charlie whose rebel forces had twice come through Burton in December 1745; in 1759 'the year of Victories' which saw the conquest of Canada - 'to Ringers in ale' and in 1760 for the accession of George III 'drawing Proclamation' 5/-. In 1817 14s was spent on candles 'for Princess Charlotte's funeral'. As

she was the ultimate heir to the throne her death in childbirth was received with shock similar to that of Princess Diana. Other contemporary Royal events are ignored although every November 5th 12s was 'spent upon ringers on ye Gunpowder treason'.

Appended to the 1798 is a printed list of local 'Voluntary subscribers to the exigencies of Government required to fund the war against Revolutionary France. Heading the list was the vicar John Hutton who subscribed £21 followed by Thomas Sill with 12 guineas, Mr Waller Surgeon £1 1s, Mr Robinson Schoolmaster 5/- down to Widow Pearson 1/- and Robert Bleasdale 6d.

Improved communications are indicated in 1816 by 'Postage of letter from London' which had to be paid on receipt unlike the Penny Black stamps which were paid in advance when they began in 1840. Evidence that the Lancaster to Kendal Canal (which was not completed until 1819) had already reached the area is indicated in 1803 by '£1: 1s carriage 6 Bells and furniture from Lancaster by canal' but it was underlined 'No water there'.

Natural history is well recorded in the payments made for the heads of vermin like 'Foxes, magpies, ravens, badgers' for which 3s 4d was paid in 1721, 8s 8d in 1723, 9s 3d in 1727. In 1741 a table of fees was drawn up 'Fox 1s, Badger 4d, Wild Cats 2d, Raven 2d, Crow 1d, Sparrow 2d'. In 1781 10 shillings was paid 'for birds' and there's an occasional reference to 'foumarts' - pine martens.

Mostly the accounts are regular expenses especially for Communion wine which was also provided for



# *The Vicar Writes...*

## **Where faith begins, anxiety ends**

In 1653 Bulstrode Whitelock was about to set off to be Oliver Cromwell's envoy to Sweden. England had recently gone through civil war, executed its own king, and was being torn apart by arguments between the army and the government. It was difficult enough working out the direction the country was heading in, let alone representing it to Sweden. The night before his journey, Whitelock was nervously pacing the floor, unable to sleep, when a trusted servant approached him.

"Pray, sir, will you give me leave to ask you a question?" he asked. "Certainly," replied Whitelock.

"Pray, sir, do you not think that God governed the world very well before you came into it?" "Undoubtedly," replied Whitelock.

"And pray, sir, do you not think that He will govern it quite as well when you are gone out of it?" Whitelock answered, "Certainly."

To which the servant asked the searching question, "Then, sir, pray excuse me, but do not you think you may trust Him to govern it quite as well as long as you live?"

Whitelock was speechless, but he headed for bed and soon was fast asleep – testimony to George Mueller's view that "where faith begins, anxiety ends; where anxiety begins, faith ends."

Like Bulstrode, George was a Christian who trusted God's many assurances in the Bible for those who have taken the decision to follow Jesus. In situations where many of us would have been worried sick about the outcome, George had absolute trust in God, and he wasn't disappointed! His personal life was a testimony to his faith in Jesus Christ – his Lord and his Saviour. Ours can be too. Let faith begin, and anxiety end!
