# Outdoors

I'm standing at the top of an outcrop in Patterdale called Oxford Slabs. Why

Oxford? Nowhere in England could be less like Oxford - no ornate buildings, no factories, no sluggish willow-bordered backwaters. They might as well have called it Bangkok or Monte Carlo. A better name would be something like Gimmer Knott or Hollin Pike. We're here to climb, and as usual the steep green uplands and the ragged bones of them showing through the pastures enfold and open out, rise up and stretch away, in a state of perfect beauty.

The bays at the south end of Ullswater shine blue-grey between steep fellsides. A well-beaten path slants brown up the flank of Grisedale Brow like a discarded snake-slough. The football/cricket ground down below makes a pond of clean green. Monumental broadleaved trees in Glenamara Park stand about like moored galleons. Invisible cuckoos give out their double-notes which sound unreal or offbeat, like echoes, 'At once far-off and near.' The bird is so elusive, and so odd in its habits, that it seems the epitome of otherness - the underside of nature that we can be fascinated by and never get close to or into.

The way up to this little crag led from the car park opposite the White Lion through a birchwood, across acres of young bracken where the plants were uncurling their fiddle-heads through last year's brown mulch. Amongst it a horned ewe lay dead - intact - its half-closed eyes staring straight up at the clouds. The

path hugs a five-foot drystone dyke, built skilfully with irregular stones, bulging and sagging where the biggest sycamore I've ever seen is gradually destabilising it. The diameter of the tree-trunk is at least seven feet, made up of several columns. Dense beds of fern have colonised the lower branches and a sycamore sapling is springing up from the humus that has gathered in one fork. The many massive branches crisscross overhead like the heart of a very old city.

The climbing wasn't hard. It was hard enough for my second outing on rock in eighteen months. The grain of the crag consists of strata tilted through 80 degrees or so, such that the tops of the exposed or broken-off layers make sharp holds for the reaching hands while the toes find small squared-off steps on rock so rough, so crystalline, that my finger-ends felt sand-papered for days after. The routes we found, three of them, are not in the climbing guidebook to the Eastern Crags, so Chris and I had the joy of exploring. Groups must come here, from the nearby Outward Bound School or somewhere, because the rock was worn in places and the ground at the foot of the crag was trodden dusty.

Today just two walkers came past and two more showed on the skyline of Gavel Pike between Grisedale and Deepdale. From time to time the air throbbed with the rotors of helicopters - maybe carrying up stone for footpath repairs. We never saw them, so their chugging and roaring made it seem as though the fells were bellowing to each other in an unknown language.



### Roger Reports...

Cuts are still at the forefront of the Councils' work as we are enjoined to become 'leaner, smarter and fitter'. Happily this healthy aspiration has not been applied to councillors - yet! A suggestion that the number of county councillors should be reduced from the current number of 82 has, however, been rejected. The two main objections were the diverse nature and large area often in difficult terrain of the rural divisions and the extra pressure an increase in constituents would place on councillors. I already represent six parishes which stretch from upper Lunesdale near Sedbergh to the Kent Estuary on the far side of Heversham. If for instance, Milnthorpe and/or Arnside were added then I would find it difficult to represent the electorate in the way I have tried to do previously. Already parish, school and trustees meetings are on every week night plus village functions at weekends. Such a time demand would not normally be possible for someone working elsewhere and so the proportion of early retired (and older) councillors would increase.

On SLDC plans to transform Kendal's New Road (free) car park, which figured in the recent election campaign, may now be shelved. On parking we have asked for a notice to be placed on disabled parking bays stating that disabled drivers, since April, must pay for a parking ticket. We have also asked that the ticket machines be

adapted for wheel chair users. This followed a disabled driver being 'booked' after the new rule was posted on the ticket machine which the disabled driver had, previously, not needed to visit.

After our difficulties in getting Rail Track to sort out the flooding under the Moss Lane bridge I have asked that the district council appoint a Task and Finish Group to investigate similar problems reportedly experienced by other councillors in dealing with Rail Track. On flooding I understand that the problems near The Creamery on Main St are caused by a blocked drain pipe. Following complaints at May's Parish Council I was able to inform members within 24 hours that faulty gulley grids and other remedial work needed after the recent resurfacing are being dealt with.

On Cumbria County Council we are on the way to meeting the priority saving of £44m pa. After 600 staff cuts (mainly without compulsory redundancies), an amalgamation of 'directorates' and accommodation changes. Unfortunately, possible areas of economies might apply to two of my main personal interests: libraries and teaching. Locally, our nearest 'static library' at Milnthorpe should be safe, as issues have increased from 14,682 in 2004 to 16,633 in 2009. Kirkby Lonsdale's figures have also gone up from 23,376 to 25,224, but Kendal's figures have fallen from 356,572 to 253,561.

The mobile library's future is a big worry. Issues from the Kendal area van have more than halved from 22,088 in 2004 to 10,942 in 2009. I have received a petition signed by 111 people against a possibly mobile library closure and I have stressed how important the

Discussions about changes in teaching assistants terms of employment have gone on since equal status legislation was brought in by the Blair government. TA post groups have now been reduced from five to two categories. Category 2 for a 'Principal' TA qualification entitles an extra £1,700 pa. Officially, TA's pay have been 'evaluated by experts' who took into account that TA's work (again 'officially') 32 hours a week with 70 days leave compared to other staffs 37 hours and 30 days. So, it is asserted "TAs are not on 'equal terms' which is why they stand to lose." So far 20% of individual appeals by TA's against their own pay cuts have been accepted, but the appeals 'process' must finish by 30 September. I understand, that TA's current pay is protected until 2012. Even so I have stressed that most of the TA's are extremely conscientious who often work far longer hours than the 'offcial' time. Certainly, I would have valued a 'Teaching Assistant' in the many years when I taught in 'tough' schools. Despite our problems - best wishes

### **COUNCIL PLEDGES SUPPORT** FOR THE B.M.H. LOTTERY BID

-and the continued visits of the Library van

### 1. The Public Library – and its van

It seems Burtonians have been galvanised into action since the May Parish council meeting. A petition, with well over a hundred signatures requesting the continuation of the van's visits, has been forwarded to the appropriate Dist. Cllr.

Weekly Visits: Contrary to A.O.'s May report, the library van calls here weekly, not monthly. Everyone except A.O. seemed to know that anyway, judging from comments made (!) and she offers her apologies for this inaccuracy. By the time B.N. is published, reviews about the library service will have been held in Kirkby Lonsdale and Milnthorpe. Too late for comments after 30 June, but hopefully you all know that and have notified the service of your views already.

2. The People's Lottery (More about this elsewhere in BN.) Big Press Day - filming by TV crews, press presence, the lot, is hoped for on 22 June from 2 -8pm. Here's your chance to be on telly - and to do Burton's Memorial Hall a good turn. PCllrs unanimously agreed to support this bid wholeheartedly, and to put in an appearance on the day. They're a sensible lot, so hopefully the show won't be hogged by anyone too garrulous.

### 3. Age UK - Ruth Taylor, Special Agent

Ruth is now the locally-based agent for B-in-K, Milnthorpe and Holme. Possibly we may learn what her role is in more detail. She can be contacted on the AGE UK helpline. This number may also be published later – A.O. doesn't know it.

#### PLANNING - Burtlands

Storth Machinery, who have already had planning permission and have erected a warehouse on the Burtlands site, now wish to extend this to create an assembly shop. A neighbouring resident objected that this would increase noise, that lights remained on 24hrs a day, and that the site was only intended as a warehouse originally. PCIIrs were in a quandary. They wanted to support local enterprise, but at the same time they sympathised with the level of disruption caused by the site to the nearby householder. And some felt that the firm had gone beyond the agreement of the earlier planning permission. Traffic along Moss Lane would be large and unsuitable. 24-hr lighting was inappropriate, and in any case counter-productive, and it had never been the intention to agree to anything more than warehousing. In the end – after some argybargy - they voted to object to the extension.

The Parish Computer System (not one of A.O.'s favourite topics!)

It was agreed that the Clerk, with the help of a local technical support firm, should be granted funds to purchase a computer solely for the use of parish council business, which would be handed on to future parish clerks. Not a laptop. "Why?" asked someone. Because laptops are more vulnerable to theft, came the reply. (I

It's bad enough leaving it lying in the middle of the paths, when, as this PCIIr pointed out, it is simple to remove it with a handy stick. Mind you, it's a pity we can't do the same with the cow poo, which takes us to.....

### 5. The cattle in Dalton Woods/Crags

Some PCIIrs expressed concern that there are too many, and they are damaging the undergrowth and breaking down the paths, in some places making them very rough going. All agreed that the cattle seemed docile, but it was a bit intimidating to come across them in considerable numbers. The clerk will make enquiries in a letter to the Forestry Commission.



### Historical Footnote by Roger Bingham

### A FAMOUS POET APPRECIATES OUR LIMESTONE LANDSCAPE

As far as I know, our greatest nineteenth century poet William Wordsworth never recorded a visit to Burton, although the main stagecoaches which he used came into and out of Westmorland through the village. In contrast. Lakeland's greatest twentieth century poet Norman Nicholson often extolled his fondness for our area. Unlike William, whose major prose work 'A Guide to the Lake District' was pedestrian in both senses, Norman's poetic eye shines forth in his description of landscape of our local limestone countryside where the sculptured clints and grikes in the exposed limestone pavements are adorned with unique plant life. Thus, in 1950, when describing 'the colder and bonier countryside between Carnforth and Kendal' he enthused 'the hills around Hutton Roof and north of Lupton are not bushy like Arnside Knott, but are bare, and seem at a distance to have been dusted over with lime or chalk. The beck bottoms are choked with accidental gargoyles of limestone. I have seen monoliths and hog-backs of limestone, six feet high and more, propped against the walls in Burton and Holme. Farleton Fell and (also) the little hills around the River Bela, have their own acres of wilderness. Here the rock is on the surface and the water has moulded it and carved it till it looks like cooled larva. Here grow the limestone flowers: lily-of-the-valley in late spring, and in summer, gentians, thyme, rockroses, a sampler of tight-stitched colour, with here and there the tall yellow turrets of golden-rod or ploughman's spikenard.'

Norman, moreover, perceived how the geology had fashioned the built heritage of our villages. He saw Burton as 'a little stage-set of a village with its square laid out, plumb and obvious to catch the eye of the road-user.' When the bold houses were built in the eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries they cannot have expected to see such traffic (what would Norman think today?) but they are not going to let themselves be surprised about it. All the villages with Burton and Holme in the middle are built of limestone, though often rough-cast and lime washed. They are full of nooks and angles, of big round chimneys and heavy porches. There are gardens sheltered by fat walls, often piled high with water-worn sculptures, miniature Henry Moores and Barbara Hepworths prised from the limestone clints on the Fellside. The walls are matted over with white and purple rock, with ivy-leaved toad flax, and often there are clipped yews (copied from Levens Hall) in front of houses and sprawling orchards at the back where the yellowing greens of plum and pear merge with the yellowing grey of stone until it is hard to tell which is garden and which is house.' Finally, Norman had worries about the safety of nature's geological art for 'hundreds of tons of weathered limestone have been carted off to make rock-gardens in the Lancashire holiday towns.' Happily this practice, nowadays, has been stopped, officially; so hopefully sixty years on from Norman's time our limestone features will be preserved in their proper natural setting.

# The Vicar Writes...

### **Bible Myths**

Many people warn us not to believe the "myths" in the Bible. For instance, it's commonly argued that the resurrection of Jesus from the dead – which is cited by Christians as the crowning confirmation of Jesus' divinity – was merely a mythological concept that developed over long periods of time as legends corrupted the eyewitness accounts of Christ's life and it's not what the earliest Christians believed. This argument holds no water whatsoever.

The following words, a summary of an early church creed, were written by the apostle Paul to a group of Christians in 54-55AD, 20 years after Jesus' died:

"For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures ... and that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures." (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)

He's reminding them of the teaching he passed on to them on his first visit 4-5 years earlier, c.50AD. So we can confirm that within 20 years of Jesus' life on earth, the official teaching of the church was that Christ died for our sins and was raised on the third day.

But we can go even further than that. Paul says he passed on to them what he "received". This is something he received in the early days after he became a Christian. When was that? Just a few months after Jesus' life on earth! (Acts 8-9)

Here we have solid evidence that the death of Jesus for our sins and the resurrection of Jesus on the third day is what the church in its earliest days believed and taught. The common idea that it was a myth that developed over time is totally false.

Be wary when someone speaks of the myths in the Bible. The real myths are the ones about the Bible and not in it.

But don't just take it from me, check it out yourself. The best argument for the Bible is the Bible itself. Do something outrageous this summer. Actually read it for yourself. The Gospel of Mark is a good place to begin. If you'd like a free copy, give me a call.






