

Outdoors

Just lately my meetings with birds (the feathered kind, I mean) have been inspiring and upsetting, as their life has flowed and ebbed. Late in May, just downstream from Sheernest Bridge on the canal, I spent an hour or so watching a swan repairing the family nest. It has been their home (maybe for more than one pair in succession) since we came here in 1977. On the left bank, inside a deep bed of bulrushes, the platform of leaves and sedges bulks up each spring: about six feet in diameter and a foot and a half thick: a yellowish mattress half hidden in a forest of stems, with a short path trodden down to the water. Seven or eight cygnets come out of their shells early in May. One year I saw them making their way through the green hayfield nearby, each little white head pricking up, then disappearing, as though a cluster of button mushrooms were shooting up, shrinking down again, shooting up again...

Today the adult swan (a female, I think) must be doing maintenance work to keep the nest as a sound, dry roost. It has compressed down almost to water level and must be boosted up again and made comfy, like re-stuffing an old sofa. The swan grips a rush stem in her beak, tears it up from the canal bed with one or two sharp tugs, drops it in the water, and reaches out for another. When forty or fifty are floating close by, she backs up the bank a little, reaches out, and drops her harvest one by one onto the bedraggled nest, turning it gradually gold and green again after the

shabby brown of the time when the fledglings were still nestling under their parent. A pause in the work - the bird sails slowly across the canal, stops in midstream to preen her body-feathers, then glides back to carry on working.

The ordinary domestic life of a wild animal could hardly have been more plain to see or close at hand. It reminded me of seeing gannets patching their nests with seaweed a few yards from our feet on the Bass Rock in the Firth of Forth (and sometimes reaching across and pinching a beakful of weed from a neighbour's nest.) These bird lives are also hazardous. In mid-May, before a bowls match against Windermere. I had to clear the carcase of a collared dove from the green before practice started. Probably a sparrowhawk and killed it and gobbled up its flesh. Not much was left - the wings, some ribcage, moist red bits of bone. Early in June the carcase of a homing pigeon was lying amongst the weeds at the northwest corner of the Royal on Main Street. It was almost intact. I read the number on its leg ring and phoned the racing-pigeon centre in Wales to let them know. They put me onto their Newcastle office: the bird was traced to its owner. a Mr Buchanan in Whitehaven. He rang me a few days later. His birds had set off home from Plymouth. Fifteen out of forty had been brought down and killed by westerly gales.

After such mishaps, it was reassuring a few weeks ago to see, in the hayfield next to Boon Walks path, a cock blackbird feeding two fully-fledged young. They ran expectantly up to their father. He pecked up something from the grass, fed one of them, then the





other - ran a few yards off - pecked again and filled their beaks again. After five minutes or so the two young ones suddenly flew off over the path into the overgrown beer garden. Was Dad not giving them enough? Was there a cat about? A minute later he flew off after them. By now they may have learned to fend for themselves and their parents will have started another brood. For the time being it was a sweet family scene, like breakfast at home on a Saturday morning.



Roger Reports...

July came in splendidly along with the 3339 votes which gained us the grant for the Memorial Hall - so Well Done! to all concerned. Other happy notes included BADS' production of Dick Barton which was 'smashing' - though - as a minor member of the cast - I says it meself.

As a Governor I witnessed whole bevies of Burton scholars winning annual awards at Queen Elizabeth School, while the Dalton Open Gardens had a fantastic turn out on one of the most glorious summer days ever. Also, I've had it confirmed that a £1500 grant I've asked for the recreation area will come through in September along with a contribution of £2000 for the drainage scheme on the mosses.

Since I first represented you in 1984 I have moaned about the lack of 'plain English' in council communications. Yet, subsequently, we have had 'synergy', 'silo', 'out-of-the-box', 'systems thinking', 'outcomes', 'fiduciary', 'infrastructure delivery plan' (for a road map) and 'paradigm shift', but a step in the right direction was made at the June County Council when the Cabinet member for roads announced that he had sent a document back for re-writing 'as he couldn't understands a word of it' although he had been in the

road transport business all his life. Even so I detected 'benchmark' and 'visitors beacon net' - for a busy tourist spot. Please let me know any other candidates for 'jargon busting.'

Meanwhile the County Council had welcome financial news with a reported surplus £3.1m over the projected budget for 2010-11. Planned staff reductions are largely completed but pressure to lessen some of the pay reductions for teachers assistants continues. Increased school transport charges have also been criticised. Burton's years 7-11 pupils will still travel to QES free of charge. Assistance for 16-19 travel will be replaced with an annual £350 charge for all students starting the VI form in September. A 'hardship fund' is being created 'so that no young person from a low income household is prevented from accessing 16-19 education.'

On roads our Kent Estuary Division was one of the few where all the allocated money was spent - mainly on pot holes and major resurfacing works. Currently the layby near Junction 36 has been refurbished to help car-sharers, and white lining especially on the A6070 should be done by the time BN comes out. I hope the Main Street flood abatement work at The Creamery will be made before the roads repairs are started. Another long term goal (which goes back to the campaign to limit quarry lorries on Main St) has also has been achieved as the Forestry Commission have secured agreement from the local timber yard to transport timber via Dalton Lane, left onto A6070 and access from the M6 from there. In future neither Clawthorpe nor Vicarage Lane will be used.

I continue to be very busy on a Dementia Task and Finish Group as a member of the county's Health Scrutiny panel. So far we have learned that 25% of all hospital patients suffer from a form of dementia and that Cumbria's NHS elderly patients records are incomplete regarding some aspects of Dementia treatment, though they 'are the ninth best in the country.' In some hospitals Alzheimer's disease is treated as a psychological rather than a neurological condition. Carlisle's West Cumberland Infirmary is Cumbria's only hospital providing comprehensive Dementia treatment along with other forms of medical care. So far we believe that there is need for further training for hospital and GP staff and for more community psychiatric nurses. I have also highlighted my own concern, 'care for the carers' as I see old people being worn out by lovingly looking after the very old. I would be grateful to receive in confidence any information about any aspect of caring for older people.

Commenting on the goings-on at the Parish Council meetings

Shuttle Bus

Milnthorpe main road closed for road works, 25 July for 6 weeks, but if you're going there by bus, don't worry. A shuttle service will run from Burton, instead of the usual 555 bus.

Congratulations!

Once again the Memorial Hall Cttee was congratulated, this time by the Parish Council, for securing the prize for the Jubilee People's Millions poll. The PCllr Rep on that Cttee reported the money hadn't yet been received. (He also said, in reply to a question, that it was unlikely that the bright suggestion to have fairy lights on the trees in the BMH carpark was to be realised this Christmas. Pity.)

The Aggregates Levy

It had seemed that this "tax" or sum that quarries had to pay as a sort of recompense, was no longer to be levied. The PC Chairman reported that our MP, Tim Farron, has written to them to give information about a new proposal. The area has previously benefited in many ways from this levy, so it is to be hoped it will continue in some form.

Burton Market Cross

PCIIrs agreed that repairs and repointing of the plinth of the cross should be carried out. Able Memorials will carry out the work, and repairs to the Jubilee lamp collar will be carried out. (That was agreed AGES ago!)

Parking in Kendal

SLDC Parking Consultation. The PC will point out that free or cheap parking is important to residents of outlying villages who work or shop in Kendal. A subsidised scheme used elsewhere where a parking subsidy was linked to prompt payment of Council Tax was mentioned with approval.

The Parish Plan (or what's going on in Burton)

- a) A PCIIr will attach the bus-stop sign to the post at Green Dragon.
- b) The street light on Main St has been replaced.
- c) Kidnapper Lane has been tidied (sort of).
- d) The Parish Council IT system has been bought at a cost of £451.83. VAT will be reclaimed.
- e) Carparking Survey. Results: the working party reported there was adequate parking in the village, though it would become a problem in the future. They stressed the importance of making it absolutely clear that future housing should provide for at least parking space for two cars.
- f)They also noted that the green slope at the foot of Boon Town had no clear owner, and the suggestion was made that if ownership was not made clear, the PC should try to register this space which for years it had been maintaining.

Reports from PCIIrs

- 1) A PCIIr suggested the possibility of having a Jubilee Beacon. To be discussed at a later PC mtg.
- 2) Verges have been trimmed round the Storth Machinery complex.
- 3) The War Memorial surround needs repair or replacement, reported a PCIIr.
- 4) No progress on the Speed Indicator Device.



Historical Footnote by Roger Bingham

FAITHFUL RELATIONSHIPS

The story goes that a deceased lady's relatives inscribed 'At Rest' on her gravestone, to which her longsuffering husband added 'Until We meet Again.' Historically, longer and less double-entendre epitaphs were the norm. I have been looking at some local examples for a talk I am giving, in my Lay Reader role, for Holme Mothers Union. Inevitably many refer to the loss of a spouse. Thus at Burton the 1837 gravestone of Thomas Atkinson of Holme states, 'A Husband dear, and a parent kind. Is here to earthly dust consigned. We trust his Soul has wing'd its flight, To realms of everlasting light.' In the same year John Kirkby of Burton, Cordwainer, was similarly extolled, 'Here lies a Husband, to a wife sincere, A tender Father, to his children dear, By cruel Death torn from them in his bloom, Haste and prepare thee for the Silent Tomb.'

There are frequent warnings of the dire consequences of not maintaining the most important 'faithful relationship' of all - with Almighty God. An 'altar tomb' in the south yard containing 'the remains of the offspring of William and Eleanor Coward: Matthew died aged 1 year and 2 months in 1777, Ann died aged 22 in 1796 and Alice died aged 19 in 1797' sternly warns, 'Stop, Friend, behold & cast an eye, Then go thy way, prepare to Die, Repent in time, make no delay. Death e'er (sic) our prime took us away.' Though equally solemn Isabella Nicholson's inscription, of 1798, dwells

on the means of Salvation, 'Say wouldst thou die in peace, then seek that blood Which reconciles a sinner to his God, This was the scheme of heaven, the mighty plan, By which God's justice pardons sinful man.'

A non-rhyming tribute to 'Mary Ann Jackson, the lamented daughter of John Willams esq., of Church Bank who died March 23rd 1838 in the 14th year of her age' states, 'this record is placed as a tribute of affection to the beloved memory of a fondly attached daughter whose short life gave every promise of future excellence and for whose early loss maternal sorrow can never cease, also of Isabella Williams mother of the above who died 2nd May 1859 aged 68 years.'

A typically optimistic epitaph to another Williams - Robert Williams of Dalton who died aged 26 in 1836 reads, 'Our Faithful Friend, our Partner dear, Is not deceas'd but sleepeth here, Great is the loss that we sustain, But Hope in Heaven to meet again.' Finally (literally) the tomb of Polly Wilkinson who died aged 24 in 1874 carries a reminder to all, 'My times are in Thy hand.'

Broadband Speed Survey

The Broadband Cumbria – Burton project is trying to establish where the hotspots and, more importantly, where the notspots – those places which do not get decent broadband speeds – are, and need your help to map them. Here in Burton some of us get good broadband speeds whilst others struggle to reach 1Mbsp or 2Mbps speeds, so to help work out a broadband map of the parish we'd like to ask you to take a speed test and then report the results to us.

It's simple to do: all you need is to visit http://www.speedtest.net/wave/01a36521cdd24e04 and click the big button that says JOIN THIS SPEED WAVE and when it loads the test screen click the BEGIN TEST button on the left. The test will start and run a ping, a download and an upload test, and then show your results on the Speedwave page. (Note: due to the way that determining your location works it probably won't show Burton – ours shows London! but don't worry about that, it's more to do with where your ISP connects to the internet infrastructure rather than where you connect to the internet!)

Once you've run the test please make a note of the ID number you've generated alongside your results and post a Comment below the post at http://burton.broadbandcumbria.com/2011/07/21/broadband-speed-mapping/ along with a general indicator of where in the exchange area you are – e.g. Main Street Burton, Vicarage Lane Burton, Drovers Way, Dalton village, Clawthorpe, or if you're in Holme, Priest Hutton or Yealand etc... then we'll start to build up a picture of speed variations across the exchange

area. (Note: replies are moderated as a spamcheck so won't appear immediately unless you are a registered user of broadbandcumbria.com.) Alternatively you can use the Share Result button on the test page and send us the details at speedtest@burtonweb.org.uk so we can add them to the broadband parish map.

The Speedwave will run for a while so as to give as many people as possible time to test their connections.

Please only add your results to the Burton exchange Speedwave if you are connecting from a fixed phone line on the Burton Cumbria exchange – i.e. one which commences 01524 78xxxx or you'll skew our figures, and thank you for helping us with this project.

The top two news stories reminded me of that when I turned on the TV this morning: hundreds of thousands of people starving to death in East Africa! 76 Norwegian families in mourning following a madman's killing spree! And that's just today's news. There'll be other disturbing and depressing things tomorrow. That's how it is. We live in a world smudged with selfishness, wracked with pain, flooded with tears and overshadowed by death. Is it always going to be like this?

The Bible says "no" and points to a day when all that's wrong will be put right for good. Here's a description of the renewed world that Jesus will establish when He returns:

"Now the dwelling of God is with men, and he will live them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." (Revelation 21:3-4)

That's a description of the world we all long for deep down. But how do we know it's not a pipe dream? Answer: the one who promises it has already given us a preview.

When Jesus walked this earth he gave us glimpses of this new creation. He calmed a storm, delivered people from demons, healed people from sickness and fed a hungry crowd with just five small loaves and two fish. Three times we read of him walking into funerals. There is mourning, weeping and crying. Jesus commands the corpses to live and they obey.

When Jesus entered a situation the pain ended and the mourning and crying stopped. Nature was controlled, evil banished, suffering ended, hunger satisfied and death defeated. And Jesus did it again and again, giving us a glimpse of the new world to come, proving that he can deliver the goods and guaranteeing it through his own death and resurrection.

I don't know about you, but I see these wonderful previews and find myself wanting to be there for the real thing. The good news is that Jesus has made it possible for us to be there and he invites us to join him. That's what he meant when he said "Come to me all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28) The world we want is the world we can have – but only if we come to Jesus.



Burton Memorial Hall

Following on from last month's success in the Jubilee People's Millions telephone vote, the Hall's Management Committee has been finalising the grant contract with the Big Lottery Fund. This lengthy process is necessary to ensure that lottery grant funding, as public money, is safeguarded and that the Big Lottery Fund are happy with our plans for the work being paid for with it.

Once the grant set-up has been completed with our designated Lottery Officer we will be in a position to award the contracts for the work based on tenders submitted earlier in the year. It is envisaged this will happen in the first 2 weeks of August, barring any last minute hiccups.

The intention is to undertake as much of the work as possible during the summer holidays when the Hall is not as busy as during term time, although some work will need to be completed later in the year as well.

As part of the preparation for the work, it has been arranged that SLDC will remove the recycling bins currently in the Hall car park, so as to clear the access for the removal of waste material and for the deliveries of new building materials needed by the contractors.

We would ask that, once the recycling facilities have been removed, you do not leave material for recycling in the car park, as we will have no way of disposing of it. Alternative recycling facilities are available in Milnthorpe: Park Road car park, at the recycling centres at Keer Bridge Carnforth and Canal Head Kendal, as well as in the car parks of most of the local supermarkets. SLDC doorstep collection boxes for waste paper now also take envelopes.

If anyone wants to see the proposals for the new Preschool toilets and play area, they are currently displayed in the hallway at the south end of the Memorial Hall, along with the big presentation cheque from the Big Lottery Fund, and can be viewed whenever the Hall is open.

Access to the car park for Hall users and for the mobile library van, bank and the fishman should not be adversely affected by the work, but we would ask that everyone exercises patience during any disruption there may be.




