

Commenting on the goings-on at the Parish Council meetings

The Annual Parish Meeting on May 17 started in style with the bowing-out of the old Chair, Paul Rogers, and the bowing-in (if that's a word) of the new one, Mike Taylor. He was elected unanimously. He duly thanked Paul R. for his 'sterling work' and hoped that he himself 'wouldn't let us down.' The contrast between the two men is intriguing: Paul R., tall and slim and bearded, quick-spoken, with a light touch on the tiller; Mike T., burly, clean-shaven, determined to control debate with strict attention to the rules. He looks 'Anglo-Saxon', ruddy-cheeked, blue-eyed, a blond type I've seen among Dales farmers in Yorkshire and Cumbria. The new Vice-Chair, also elected unanimously, is to be Alan Wren - the new position didn't stop him cracking some good jokes.

This month's business was mainly routine, smartly coped with. Cllrs. were (re)appointed to the usual bodies - Education Foundation, Rec. Trust, Memorial Hall Committee, etc - and were assigned 'responsibility for activities': Boon Town playground, Plain Quarry Working Group, etc.

In the Open Forum a villager argued eloquently for something to be done about the drift of soil down onto Slape Lane. This is more complicated than you might think. Nobody likes the flooded mire that blocks two stretches of the footway. The P.C. is not empowered to maintain bridleways. Work has been done gratis by villagers - who will now expect improvements to be kept up. Alt.O. fears this is the sort of problem that will run and run, or rather ooze and ooze.

The umpteenth discussion of the Jubilee beacon ended on a downbeat: there will be no naked virgins at the ceremonial lighting, or so we gathered from the Cllr. who said he wouldn't bother to attend because of this sorry oversight. (Presumably he wasn't so sexist as to assume that if there had been some virgins, they'd have had to be female.)

Several villagers are bothered by the chronic parking chaos where Morewood Drive runs into Main Street. A Cllr. thought that the school should make car park space on unused grassland to the east of the buildings. Obviously there is a need to accommodate both staff vehicles and those belonging to parents picking up children in the afternoon (when all those off-road vehicles are decidedly on the road, where they look like some kind of task force waiting to deploy.) The Clerk is to forward material to the planning authority, so something or other is sure to happen: don't know where, don't know when, we'll meet again, etc.

The Chairman of the P.T.A. rushed in (hotfoot from a day helping to shepherd pupils round Walney Island) and reported that no less than £1,300 had been raised to pay for playground equipment. As this is open all the time, to everybody, it's only right that money should be donated to help the good work. After a complicated discussion about the pro's and con's of giving a lot, or

a little, or too much, it was decided to offer £100, as a donation, not as a grant.

Lots of financial business was then transacted. The details are in the Minutes, under 'Finance' and 'Accounts Approved for Payment and Cheques Signed', so Alt.O. need not list them here, especially since he'd probably get them wrong and make Income look like Expenditure or vice versa. (He has enough trouble with his own accounts.)

Growing things were then discussed, in one way or another. The Jubilee sapling (in Mrs. Parish Clerk's care) has burst into leaf. At least two footballs have punctured on the hedge round Boon Town playground. It's a hawthorn hedge, so what can you expect? A Cllr. suggested it might need trimming (not by a flail, one hopes.) Another Cllr. wanted daffodils to be planted on the village verges, since this looks so good each March and April. This will be further discussed next month. How nice it is to be looking forward to next year's renewal after this spring, which has been so cold, wet, and gusty. One casualty of early May was a rook's nest, one of the seven in the colossal beech tree in Rye Croft, next to the Memorial Hall, near the communal waste bins (which Cllrs. want to be adapted to take plastic.) This beautiful structure has been lying intact at the foot of the wall: two feet deep and a yard across, lined with moss and sheeps' wool, crafted of twigs each of which incurves to mesh with its neighbours. Will this rook pair build again? Hard to tell, as the canopy of leaves is becoming dense enough to make the rook village invisible to us lot down below.



News from Cumbria Police...

In the Holme and Burton area, three thefts of metal were reported as well as an attempt burglary, a theft and an incident of criminal damage. Recent Neighbourhood Alerts include warnings of door-to-door fish sellers, sightings of persons attempting to fiddle pub bandit machines, and thefts of waste cooking oil from commercial premises.



Outdoors

In the Plain Quarry, beside the road over the hill to Kirkby Lonsdale, they made a fine thing when the place was tidied up ten years

ago: a whorl of limestone boulders set in the short grass. At first sight it looks random, like quarrymen's spoil. Regarded more closely, especially from the rim above, it shows itself to be a shapely form, like a knot loosening. An information board tells us that it stands for the fossils embedded in some limestone - spiral casts of prehistoric shellfish, such as ammonites.

It's a perfect piece of land art - something made from the materials of the place. It expresses it. It doesn't burden it with an alien form (like a statue, or an obelisk to some old dignitary.) For thirty years it's been happening more and more in the countryside. Andy Goldsworthy has been the pioneer - a gardener from West Yorkshire who began by sticking icicles together, in a winter dale near Brough, to make shapes like a starburst or a spiny sea-urchin. Soon he was building drystone cairns or cones, inspired by the Nine Standards on the hill above Nateby, on the road from Kirkby Stephen to Swaledale.

Andy is a master - tirelessly inventive, making long sinuous walls in Grizedale Forest and in California, putting up an arch of sandstones twenty-two times between Longtown and Casterton until it came to rest in an old shepherd's hut on Ireby Fell above Ingleton. Any of us can make something of materials from the ground - stones or sand or sticks or leaves. In our area full of limestone the opportunities are endless. You can

balance rough stones in towers that could almost have been left by ice or for some ancient purpose. To build up more than seven without their toppling is quite a feat. Or you can arrange stones into a circle or a hoofprint or a stream snaking over the ground - anything natural to the land around that doesn't deform it into a likeness of something else, something imported.

When you come across one, it's like a revelation, heartwarming. It links you to unknown persons or moments beyond your own self and your own time. If that sounds like Crusoe coming across Man Friday's footprint on the beach, it isn't really. That makes a social demand - who are they? friend or rival? The pieces of land art we come across are more like wild things - like animal traces. An emu's three-toed footprint, chipped out on a slab of red sandstone, that I found at Ewaninga in the Simpson Desert, an hour south of Alice Springs. A cougar's footprint with rounded pads, in the loose sand of the track up Keet Seel Canyon in Arizona - it had not been there the day before. The sharp-clawed prints of an otter's paws in mud below the Ure bridge in Wensleydale, between Leyburn and West Witton. The boot print which a friend saw fifty years ago on a silt beach in an old leadmine above Reeth in Swaledale. It must have been made by a miner before the Great War. It will still be there.

Land art works with the countryside, not against it. The whorl of boulders in the Plain Quarry reminds me of the cornucopia of forms that sculptors have made in the old limestone quarries on Portland Bill in Dorset. They include spirals carved on rock-faces, like the stone's own fossil ingredients magnified tenfold. Roaming down there through the maze of spoilheaps,





pits, and gullies, you come across all manner of chiselled flowerheads and cones and human bodies. It's as though you were entering the brain of the place and seeing its thoughts turned into stone that will last for centuries.

Eyes That Now Sparkle!

It's been two years since my honest and open account of suffering from post natal illness appeared in Burton News.

With help from family, friends and the amazing support of the village and local businesses, I raised £2,300 at the summer extravaganza I had arranged to raise awareness of this illness, and to ensure the local groups had the funds they desperately needed to improve the services and information provided, to offer support to the families that suffer with this illness.

It is, however, still misunderstood and it is an illness that is hard for the sufferer to understand, never mind their families beginning to comprehend it.

As part of my recovery I have found myself offering my support and help to people I have been told are suffering or who have directly trusted me to be their confidante in helping them with post natal illness.

The past two years have not been easy, out of nowhere the down days would come back or the anxiety would increase.

I joined the Burton Pre-school Committee, and even though I was very nervous to go to that first meeting, it has been one of the best things I have done to help my recovery.

I have found new friends, and it has given me the confidence to get to know people in the village, and encouraged me to say hello to people I don't know in the village. This would have been great for me a few years back, I would walk through the village with my pram, not wanting to say hi in case the person didn't want to speak to me, and I would struggle to go to the playgroup as I falsely presumed they would all know each other and I would feel left out, when really it was all in my mind.

As we all know, it takes less lines to smile than frown, so what I would say is if we see a new person in the village or a new mum, encourage them to get to know village life, give them a friendly smile, which I hope will enable them to make the step they need in getting out there.

On 30 June I have arranged a charity Zumbathon, it is to raise money for Burton playgroup, this is to improve the Wednesday session, especially when the health visitor visits. We are hoping to make a more private area for mums to have their children weighed, which would possibly help a mum to ask questions they are unsure of the answers or even ask for help if they are suffering.

Since my event my health visitor meets with mums if they are finding life a struggle, and it is in a group so it encourages the support they need and so they know they are not alone.

And finally Lancaster Oncology unit are desperate to raise funds for a new machine that will hopefully enable people to receive treatment in Lancaster and not have to travel to Preston. As three of the ladies on our Preschool staff and committee have been recently directly affected by cancer, I have chosen the Oncology Unit



Roger Reports...

from the district & county councils

Firstly, THANK YOU for re-electing me as your district Councillor on 3 May. The voting figures were Roger BINGHAM - Conservative 991. Victor BROWN - Liberal Democrat 666. The turnout at 55.7% was down on previous years but was at least 20% above the national average and also compares well locally where e.g. the turnout in an Ulverston Ward was 27%.

Secondly APOLOGIES for all the leaflets. Their number is a far cry from the days when we put out only one leaflet with a single photo of the candidate. Nowadays the party offices can print and fold (folding uses to be a major task) leaflets costing about 2p each - so we can retaliate quickly to any opponent's claims which we think are inaccurate or where the opposition has boasted of achievements obtained by others.

I was also able to respond quickly to breaking news such as rumours that the recently closed butcher's shop might be replaced by a take-away. (I have not yet heard of any planning applications for change of use.)

As in previous elections I refrained from asking anybody on the door step which political party they support. National issues, however, did come up. No one mentioned the pasty tax but there were grumbles about the granny tax and worries about immigration and the economy. No doubt because of his frequent visits and innumerable photos in his party's leaflets many people thought that our MP was a District Councillor, and some even thought he was a candidate for Burton! I concentrated on local issues.

Unlike last year, opposition to wind farms has dwindled following the (possibly temporary) withdrawal of applications for wind farms near Kirkby Lonsdale. Also I received little comment about broadband improvements.

The Local Development Framework's plan for 146 extra houses in Burton and 132 in Holme predictably aroused widespread opposition. I received many informative and detailed letters about the LDF, which included support for my view that it is inaccurate to call the LDF a South Lakeland plan when the two thirds of the District which are in the National Parks are excluded.

Highway matters - though they are a county and not a district council responsibility - included reports of numerous pot-holes, the need to resurface many side roads and also the A6070 in the Main Street and near Deerslet.

I was pleased to confirm that the 20MPH warning signs for near Morewood School which my committee approved on 17 February (before anybody else was agitating for them) should be installed shortly.

Though I received many requests for grants I had to

point out regretfully that, as both the district and county councils have had to make savings (AKA 'cuts') to avoid putting up the Council tax, there will be less money available than in previous years.

As always I enjoyed going round - and round - and round. Everybody was most friendly and occasionally I obtained shelter and hospitality from friends whose politics I don't share.

After a shirt-sleeve start in tropical late March until election day, when the sun came out, the weather got colder so our gardens were not quite as lovely as usual. Even so I wasn't put off and if asked again I might do it all again.

In the meantime warm regards and best wishes for an enjoyable and sunny Diamond Jubilee.

Historical Footnote by Roger Bingham

Burton during the reign of our first 'Jubilee Monarch'

The first English Monarch to achieve a Golden Jubilee was Henry III in 1266. He had succeeded, at the age of five, his father 'bad' King John in 1216 and reigned until 1272. He was our fourth longest-ruling sovereign after George III, 59 years and 3 months 1760-1820, and our two Diamond Jubilee Queens - Elizabeth II. 60 years 4 months (so far!) from 1952, and Victoria, 63 years 6 months 1837-1901. In his 56 years on the throne Henry was almost perpetually at war. Time and again his Westmorland subjects raised 'subsidies' to pay for campaigns in France and for the Crusades. A heriot or gnoutage tax, originally exacted to pay off Viking raiders, was still levied although Scandinavian incursions had long ceased. There was also a lull in border warfare, and most of the Pele towers built as small defensive fortresses against the Scots date from the period of Robert the Bruce fifty years after Henry's reign. Comparative peace was reflected in less stolid architecture. Henry rebuilt Westminster Abbey in a decorated Gothic style. At Burton church the intersected tracery of the thirteenth century vestry window and pointed arches of the south arcade contrast with the solidity of the round arched tower, which is a century older. Henry also fought many civil wars against his barons led by his brother-in-law Simon de Montfort who, in 1265, famously forced him to allow the 'Commons of England' to join the Lords in the council of the realm, an event generally regarded as

starting our Parliament. One of Westmorland's first 'burgesses' to choose a local MP was our local Lord of the Manor, Roger de Burton. In 1297 another Roger de Burton became MP for Westmorland. An earlier Roger de Burton, in c.1216, gave to Cockersand Abbey land in Burton 'sufficient for six score sheep, 32 beasts, eight horses or mares and 48 goats or swine.' Further donations included 'two acres in Burton, next the bounds with Dalton with all the demesne below the highway at Hildrestonhevet (Hilderstone) while, in 1265, Peter de Brus rented to John de Burton 342 acres of waste land, seven acres of meadow and nine of pasture to hold by rent of 6d or a pair of gilt spurs at Christmas.' England's climate was at its mildest during Henry's reign, which preceded the onset of 'the little ice age' in the fourteenth century. There might even have been a Chateau de Burton vintage, for 'John de Burton granted land between the road from Clerkthorp (Clawthorpe) through the vill of Burton to the vineyard of Dalton.' Grain was however the main crop. It was cultivated by feudal serfs whose ploughs were propelled by oxen from which we get 'Oxlands.' The workers were not paid wages but in return got free land. They worked on 'Boon Days' from which derive 'Boon Town' and 'Boon Walks.' The peasants' small holdings called 'crofts' or 'croftlands' were narrow strips of land behind the cottages or 'tofts' whose bounds may be faintly detected in the layout of property on either side of the southern end of Main Street. Grain was ground at the Lord's Mills. Ewan Mill might date from after the thirteenth century, but Holme Mills (parts of which are in Burton), first recorded in 1184, would have provided the staff of life for Burton folk during the reign of Henry III - England's first Jubilee Monarch.
