Reporting from the Parish Council meeting

The parish council meeting proved to be hard work. There were difficult planning recommendations and one or apparently minor items which two needed fairly careful consideration. To deal with one of those first, the council is still looking for a volunteer from the village who would like to maintain the shrub bed at the junction of Tanpits Lane and Station Lane. Mike Taylor volunteered to help weed and tidy the bed to start with if someone was willing to take on the task. If no one came forward, the council agreed that the bed would be cleared and grassed over.

The two difficult planning recommendations were the continuing school alterations and the wind-turbine above Burton Services. The council agreed not to object to the school's plan for alterations and extensions to the infant block. However, the council will ask that, as a condition of the approval, the school be required to consider measures to alleviate the danger and inconvenience caused by the morning and afternoon school runs, and that the school be required to address the need for more on-site parking for staff and visitors.

The wind turbine involved a long After discussion the council debate. resolved by a vote of 5 to 3 to object to the 70 metre high wind-turbine at Burton Motorway Services. Cllr Mason-Hornby asked that his vote in favour of allowing the turbine be recorded. He believes that it is an appropriate site for a turbine. Other councillors believed that the landscape impact of the turbine, especially when considered in the context of other turbines in the vicinity, is unacceptable in an area of unspoilt rolling farmland. The turbine would be a visible anomaly when seen from all the many local access areas. The application notes that a minority of suffer residents would significant adverse impact from the turbine and no justification or benefit is presented for this unneighbourly proposal. One councillor considered that it was impossible for MOTO to justify the turbine to generate power to light advertising signs for the services. It noted that the government's was attitude to on-shore wind-turbines was changing, and it was felt that by rejecting this proposal now would give time to see how the national policy developed.

Separately the council noted a letter from Seren Energy who are managing the wind-turbine proposal on behalf of MOTO services. If the turbine is built MOTO would make an initial community





fund payment of £20,000 of which Burton-in-Kendal would receive a part share with Yealand Redmayne. Subsequently payments of £1,000 per year would be made to the MOTO in the Community Trust.

The county council proposal to repair and maintain Slape Lane was also discussed. The county have proposed a graded stone repair to the low lying wet section. The cost is estimated at about £12,000 of which the parish council are being asked to raise £6,000. The council agreed to apply for grants to see if this sum could be raised.

It was reported that rats had been seen on Main Street. Unfortunately South Lakeland District Council no longer have a pest control service. They do, however, require land owners to control pests and they can recommend commercial pest control services.

Finally, councillors were pleased to see that the refurbishment of the milepost at Heron Syke is underway. In case you have noticed that it is missing, the cast iron plaque, which is believed to be original, has been taken away for cleaning and repair.

GIFT CARDS

We now sell one of the most popular gift cards - "iTunes" - great news if you have a friend or relative who is an iPod music fan. Our "One-4-All" Gift Cards can now be accepted at a number of online retailers and can also be exchanged for Amazon Gift Cards.

BANKING AT THE POST OFFICE COUNTER

Want to get at your money and do your banking without charge and without leaving the village? Now that NatWest, HSBC and First Direct banks have joined the P.O. Banking scheme, you can withdraw cash, free of charge, at the post office counter for nearly all UK banks.

It is also possible to deposit cash and or cheques for many of these banks. Please ask at the counter for more details.

PARCELS

There are some items which Royal Mail and Parcelforce Worldwide are unable to carry for legal or health and safety reasons; this means that we have to ask you what your parcel contains.

This already applies to items being sent to international destinations, and from 15 July will also affect parcels being sent inland.

So, if you are helping out a neighbour and bring a parcel to post for someone else, please check first exactly what it contains... if you are unable to tell us, we will be unable to accept the parcel.

There are specific regulations regarding posting items with batteries so it might be worth a chat with us first before you wrap your parcel.


The Casson Trophy, for the best non-NCO for uniform and attendance, this year went to George Pickering.

Historical Footnote

A 'befuddled' neighbour

Three hundred years ago one of South Westmorland's most notorious residents was George Hilton 1673-1725. He lived firstly at Čappleside Hall (whose ruins are in the meadows north of Beetham Nurseries) and subsequently at Hale. Coming from only two miles away he often mentioned visits to Burton in a diary he kept between 1700 and 1705. His boon companion was Thomas Barbon, the vicar of Burton from 1694-1722. Barbon, also, was often in trouble so that he was eventually forced to leave Burton for the poorer parish of Cockerham. Because George was a Roman Catholic he was not allowed to belong to a learned profession. Instead he divided his time - unevenly between farming 'scotch' cattle, taking grain to Clawthorpe (Ewan) Mill, 'playin bowles', 'ashutting on Hale mosses', and 'to Holme Parke to see ahunting (sic) with Colonel Graham and the Kendalers'.

Drinking bouts, for which he recorded the expenses, invariably left him 'egregiously befuddled'. Thus he recorded 'att Bethom in the afternoon went to Mr Barbon at Burton stayd all night - 1s 6d'; 'rid out with Mr Taylour as far as Holme Parke playd with Mr Brabin both forenoon and after at



backgammon - 0.6d'; 'went with Mr Brabin to Burton mett with Mr Barbon stayd till 11 - 10s'; 'went to Mlllthropp and after to Burton - 2s' and 'with Cornett Suckling and wife to Burton playd at cards with Dr Askew, Mr Pinder & his Lady - 7s 6d'.

Inevitably drink got the better - or worse - of him. In 1702 he was fined 'for taking out a man's eye at Appleby'; while in 1704 when 'on the road to Kendal he got fuddled and fought and gott my close torn'. In 1715 he joined the Roman Catholic Jacobite rebels but on their defeat at the Battle of Preston he escaped and, it is said, literally laid low in an underground passage at Cappleside and so avoided being hanged for treason.

His final violent exploit occurred at Burton where after being struck by Thomas Brabin at the Manor Court at Beetham 'he vowed he would have his ends although it cost him his heart's blood'. Being 'pretty much in drink' he followed Brabin to Burton and in a 'most violent manner he got out his sword demanding a duel'. Only the intervention of George Wilson of Dallam prevented fatalities. Tower Consequently, George Hilton was able to fuddle on to his peaceful death in 1725 when his 'Gunn, swords and pistolls' were valued at £1:10s while his - presumably empty - wine bottles were worth £1.

Roger Reports...

from the District & County Councils

The new Labour/Lib Dem County Council administration is settling down while my party and the Independents are getting use to opposition which means that we hold fewer positions. I am still on the Grundy Trust which provides special grants for people with specific needs. If you know any one who may be eligible please contact in confidence either myself or Linder Myers Solicitors, 21-23 Park St., Lytham, LA7 7DU.

Following the coalition government's changes to benefits, people can get additional emergency help through a voucher scheme, but extra cash is not given. The vouchers can be used for food (but not drink, tobacco or betting) and similar tokens can be provided for food banks in Kendal, Carnforth and soon, I understand, in Milnthorpe. The Ways Welfare to database is www.intouch.ccc/welfare. Т hope to provide more e-mail contacts next month. In the scheme's first nine weeks 24 people have applied for help in South Lakeland compared with 147 in Carlisle (which has the same population), 82 in Barrow, 49 Copeland, 76 Allerdale and 27 in Eden.

I have recently spent much time on young people's affairs. We now have over 600 looked-after children, who are



mainly in foster care. Sadly some 'challenging' young people are difficult to accommodate and one girl has had 60 different 'homes' in a few years.

Most of Cumbria's 324 schools are judged by OFSTED to be good and our two local comprehensives are 'outstanding', but there are several schools needing special measures. In future there will be only two OFSTED categories: 'good' or 'inadeguate'. A further complication that is the aovernment is now reauirina that children aged or above from two 'disadvantaged' backgrounds must be allowed to go to school. Already 600 of these young pupils are in Cumbria's schools but there is a need for over 200 more places. If they go to a 'maintained' school, and not to a privately run nursery, they are bound by the National Curriculum which includes the compulsory provision of Religious Education. At a meeting of the Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education (SACRE) l asked how parents could exercise the conscience clause to withdraw their infant from any religious element as every subject is integrated. No one knew how this would be done, but I learnt a lot of phrases unused in my 30 years as a teacher, like 'obtaining profound moments when learning through play' and 'to develop the unique child continued by embedded improvement in strona practice and excellent outcomes.' So.

Holme and District Local History Society's Trip to Tatton Park

The day started with bright warm sunshine which continued to bless us all day for our trip. We picked up our group and made our way by coach to Cheshire and Tatton Park, arriving in time to enjoy tea and coffee at the Stables Restaurant prior to a private tour of the mansion. The guides were excellent, splitting our party into 2 groups for the tour; starting by relating the ownership of the estate purchased by Thomas Egerton in 1598. The first house being built by John Egerton in William 1716. with Egerton later employing Samuel Wyatt to re-build the "Grand mansion in the Desian". completed by later members of the Egerton family. The Egerton family continued ownership until 1958, when the estate was bequeathed to the National Trust.

We took in the various rooms of the house, many with fabulous examples of the work of Gillows of Lancaster. Unlike a lot of furniture designers and makers of the period, Gillows did not have a particular style, creating furniture to the tastes and desires of their clients. The Drawing Room, the walls of which are silk damask lined, boasted two early examples of views of Venice by Canaletto dated 1730. The Library contains one of the finest collections of



around 8,000 books, housed in Gillow bookcases. The earliest book dates back to 1513. The Dining Room, set with beautiful Minton porcelain, once catered for 43 guests to dinner. By the late 19th century the Dining Room together with the rest of the mansion was wired for electricity. This was reputed to give a "brilliant effect". The Staircase/Hall and Landing boasted an elegant wide cantilevered staircase with broad treads and low risers to allow ladies, in their full skirts, to ascend the steps without indelicately "revealing their ankles!"

There are 24 bedrooms, each named after a colour or type of drapery, only some of which are open to view. The Silk Dressing Room had a mid-19th century charcoal-heated tin bath, which was filled with hot water in special cans by the housemaids. We were then treated to life "below stairs", starting with the cellars where provisions, beer and coal was stored. The Scullerv and Kitchen at one time had 40 servants using the huge iron and copper pots, which must have been extremely heavy and difficult to handle, especially when filled with food! The tour concluded in the Still Room, and the Housekeeper's Sitting Room, where visitors could be received by her, and where she would manage the daily routine of the household. Following the tour, we had free time to take in the other delights of the parkland, home farm and especially

the gardens.

With the weather being so warm and lovely, the gardens had particular appeal. The rhododendrons, azaleas and handkerchief trees were all in full bloom and resplendent colour in the sunshine. The glittering lakes and ponds reflected the magnificence of the surrounding parkland. Of particular interest was the Japanese garden. delicately and tastefully laid out in inspiring oriental fashion, a treat to the eves and solace to the soul. The Vinerv impressive. tropical is giving а sensation with vines, ferns and abundant areenery complete with waterfall. With so many sights and experiences to be had, a full day is needed to do justice to the gardens.

Our group took lunch in the outside courtyard, inside the restaurant or enjoyed an "al fresco" picnic in the sunshine. Following our repast, we were taken by our coach to the Old Hall. It is not normally open to the public, but again we were given privileged access. The Old Hall has its origins dating back to the 15th century, but much altered externally over time. It has had a chequered history over its 500 years, with many owners and tenants. From manor house, farmhouse to workmen's cottages, it has seen many changes.

In the Great Hall our guide turned off all



lights and then lit 4 tallow candles to give us the experience of life of the early occupants in medieval England. He explained that the floor was originally just beaten earth, often rush covered. A large board was laid on trestles, where everyone sat on stools or benches, except the lord of the manor, who sat on the only high chair, higher than everyone else at the board, thus derives the expression "chairman of the board."

We climbed the stairs to the bedrooms to see the sleeping conditions in rooms with "daub and wattle" half-timbered walls. The wooden beds were rope strung, with straw mattresses, the ropes being pulled and tightened with wooden pegs, giving rise to the expression "sleep tight." The saying "don't let the bed bugs bite" was self evident from the straw mattresses and sleeping conditions in those days!

We concluded with a visit to the reconstructed Cruick Barn with its original curved cruicks intact. The "cruicks" being large crooked timbers. Our tour therefore reflected a journey through time.

We enjoyed more refreshments before departing from Tatton with great memories of a wonderful day full of interest and delight.

The AA sign in the Memorial Hall

The AA sign in the new heritage area of the Memorial Hall used to be attached to the stone wall next to Green Dragon Farm, Burton. When the Millenium Exhibition organised by the Holme & District Local History Society was held in the Hall, the AA plaque was donated by a resident of the village, and eventually mounted and put on the wall in the Memorial Hall. To guote from a subsequent letter by an expert, "From about 1906 until the early 1930s the AA erected about 30,000 signs on public houses, garages etc. They were paid 5/- per year." In 1940 they were taken down, along with finger posts and milestones, so that any invaders would not know where they were!

There were several variations of the signs - ours suggests it was erected in the 1920s. Most were made by Franco Signs NW (the same firm who made the black and white Burton in Kendal village signs.) Fewer than fifty are still on view outside in England. The nearest one is in Hutton Roof, and there are nine others in Cumbria.
