

PC Observations...

Reporting from the
Parish Council meeting

16 October, 2014

After observing the machinations of the parish council for over a year, seeing the same headings appear on the Agenda month after month – planning applications to review, payments to approve, playground maintenance to organise, street parking and occasional miscellaneous public concerns to discuss, this observer began to yearn for some bigger items to crop up to excite the spirit. Lo and behold, Councillor Peter Smith voiced one at the October meeting. A member of the public voiced concerns about the speed at which cars entering the village from the south were posing a safety hazard, and a letter from a parishioner had been received about near misses regarding traffic. Councillor Moira Rowley then voiced her concern about the dangerous turn out of Boon Town because of haphazard street parking on Main Street. The discussion first called for more data but then Councillor Smith suggested that it was about time that the council thought about a vision for the village in 20 years' time. He said that the probability of a significant number of new houses in Burton

increased the need and urgency for short term traffic safety fixes – though important – to be made within the context of an overall strategy for pedestrian traffic movement in the village. Such good sense! He thought that the county council were 'dilatory' in their approach to their responsibilities in this regard, implying that it was something that the parish council should be proactively pursuing.

Roger Bingham objected to the word dilatory and councillors were rather uncertain about what to do, but Councillor Smith followed through with a proposal which stated that 'Short term traffic calming measures should be developed based on ideas proposed by Cumbria County Council', which was accepted. This implies that a formal letter will be sent regarding measures already discussed with county council Highways Department, such as 20 mph zones, chicanes, specific parking (and no parking) areas, double yellow lines etc. It would act as an extra kick-up-the-backside from the parish council, and represent increasing public concern about safety and the character of the village. After all, we don't want to become a village like Warton do we? A vision of Burton in 20 years' time would be an interesting new agenda item every month – it could lead to discussions about better internet access, better medical provision, better

housing planning, better community facilities, better care of the elderly etc.

But anyway, back to the Agenda. The biggest issues were:

1. Security at Plains Quarry connected to 'Raves' which are held there from time to time. The last one had left a big mess to clear up. Thanks to David Haigh for his work in doing this. Was a lockable security bar the answer? Councillors thought not but promised to keep the situation under review.

2. Burton's 'Emergency Plan' is to be updated with new names, email addresses and phone numbers for those village organisations and individuals that have resources to help cope in an emergency.

3. The South Lakeland District Council Community Infrastructure Levy (potentially worth £68,000) to Burton would be contacted with ideas for projects such as the footpath to Clawthorpe and traffic management as priorities for funding. It is not at all certain whether this will result in any action on the part of SLDC but councillors wanted to be proactive.

4. Councillors will also comment on the National Grid North West Coast Connections consultation to represent the interests of the village, should this

connection pose an environmental threat.

5. The council will buy a ceramic poppy from the display at the Tower of London, possibly located in the Memorial Hall as a symbol of the village's desire to remember the fallen.

6. A warm invitation to support the World War 1 Weekend, funded by a Heritage Lottery Grant, on the 25/26 October in the Memorial Hall was made by Kathryn Smith. The stories and connections of over 280 soldiers with connections to Burton, Holme and Beetham will be on display.

7. The Police Report included criminal damage at the tennis courts, alongside suspicious vehicles and strange noises in Tanpits Lane.

8. Finally, Peter Smith proposed that the Canal Plaque, needing renewal, be replaced in time for the 200 year anniversary of the building of the canal in 2019.

On a fresh Sunday morning the regular members of the Burton Children's Sports Committee and other willing volunteers assembled to prepare for this annual village fundraiser. Pre-show reports were that the warm, dry summer had resulted in earlier ripening of produce which may impact on the quality and number of entries. From what was entered it was clear that the reports did not come to fruition and did not impact on the show. The number of entries was good across the classes with strong support for new categories: 3 gourd, home-made chutney and jam. After frantic, last-minute preparations the tent doors were closed and this year's judges, only a few hours back in

the village from their holiday, Brendon and Lynne Brolly set about the very difficult task of judging the entries.

After nearly 2 hours of considered judging the winners were announced. The most points in the show were shared between show regulars Carl Jackson and Todd Brook. Carl won the heaviest onion, that weighed in at close to 8lb, with Todd winning the 3 dressed onions. They both excelled in several other classes.

Jim nervously climbed the ducking contraption and, with best friend Carl Jackson conducting the countdown from 5, he dunked an unsuspecting Jim on 2! To

some dismay, Jim emerged and a supportive Carl handed him a bar towel to dry himself off.

The ducking stool alone raised over £200 and along with the money taken in the raffle and auction, the show totalled in excess of £4500! Another brilliant show! The generosity of all involved is a credit to the village.

Vicar's Letter...

We will remember them

At the going down of the sun and in the morning we will remember them. We will remember them because they gave their own lives for the sake of others. We will teach our children to remember them because generations are inextricably linked; even though our children were not alive in either World War they can truly say these people died for me.

When we say 'we will remember them' we intend that they will be remembered long after we have gone; we place an obligation on our grandchildren and great grandchildren, even on those yet to be born, not to forget.

We remember too God's kindness to us as a nation. We make no claim for our own innocence when we say that God brought down some nations and raised up others. We take nothing away from the bravery and sacrifice of our fathers and mothers when we say that it was the Father of the Lord Jesus who gave us victory and peace and prosperity.

The people of Israel were commanded to keep alive, down through the generations, the memory of all that God had done for them. "I will utter hidden things, things from of old – what we

have heard and known, what our fathers have told us. We will not hide them from their children; we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, his power, and the wonders he has done" (Psalm 78:2-4). They placed an obligation on their children to teach those yet to be born about the Lord. They feared the rise of "a stubborn and rebellious generation, whose hearts were not loyal to God, whose spirits were not faithful to him" (Psalm 78:8).



Historical Footnote...

... by Roger Bingham

EARLY COMINGS AND GOINGS AROUND BURTON

We don't know for certain who were first people around Burton. There are few ancient archaeological remains in the parish apart from the 'Dalton Stones', which have been variously ascribed as being New Stone Age 'monuments' of c. 4,000 BC, to the remains of medieval or later farmsteads. Our earliest datable artefact is the famous 'Christ Sculpture' in St James' Church which, because it shows Anglo-Saxon and Viking motifs, could have been carved between 900-1000 AD. Documentary evidence is equally sparse.

Place names recorded in c.1090 as 'Berton', along with 'Clerc-thorp' for Clawthorpe, respectively have Anglo-Saxon and Danish Viking derivations. Early commentators were highly speculative. The most famous pre-historic local people the Brigantes of c.300 BC were described in c.1700 as having been 'as wild and uncultivated as their native hills, subsisting principally by hunting the spontaneous fruits of the earth wearing for their clothing the skins of animals and dwelling in habitations formed by the pillars of the forest'. Of their remote predecessors modern research has

found little local evidence of Old Stone Age people of c. 10,000 BC . But a range of flint axes scattered throughout South Lakeland indicates that from about 8,000 BC New Stone Age 'hunters and gatherers' picked their way through the thick vegetation which had replaced the tundra around the Ice Age's retreating glaciers. Somewhat later stone axes made in the Langdales were exported via Morecambe Bay to the continent. Conversely, from the Bay came the first verifiable settlers known, from the distinctive nature of their pottery, as the Beaker People.

A thousand years later at the dawn of the Bronze Age the region received an immigration of Celts who may - or may not - have originated in Spain. Their settlements have been discovered at Hutton Roof and Milnthorpe. From the succeeding Iron Age between 500 BC and 100 AD earth works can be seen on Warton Crag, The Helm, and Ingleborough. The Historian Tacitus who accompanied the Roman invasion of South Cumbria in c.70 AD called the local tribe the 'Carvetii', after their name for deer which, like our human forebears, criss-crossed the Burton area thousands of years ago.


NB I have stuck to the familiar BC and AD instead of the 'politically correct' code of BCE - 'before common era', and CE - 'common era'.



Roger Reports...

from the District & County Councils

Potentially by far the most worrying concerns to come before the county council's South Area Committee have been plans produced by the North West Coast Connections Project to link Moorside Nuclear Power Station near Sellafield with the hub of the National Grid. The popular proposal is to build a tunnel under Morecambe Bay from near Aldingham to Heysham. This would have a lesser environmental impact and has led to speculation that a road link between Furness to Lancashire could also be created. But the cost would put the HS2 project in the shade. If an overland scheme was implemented the power lines would be strung on pylons estimated to be 150 feet high, about the same as wind turbines. They might be taken round the north of the Lake District to link with the North East grid but the most likely route would be around the Bay skirting the National Park south of Witherslack with a junction near Old Hutton. But, alarmingly one possible route is directly through our area. It would follow a line west of Holme between the railway and the M6 virtually touching the outskirts of Burton. This would be the cheapest alternative and, illogically in view of our identically beautiful landscape, the route would have fewer planning

constraints because we are not in the National Park, and the SSI and AONB are beyond Burton village boundary. The Consultation period ends on the 28 November. For further information the contacts are Freepost NG NWCC, Freephone 0800 876 6990 and www.northwestcoastconnections.com.

Otherwise business on both the county and district councils seems mundane. The on-street parking decision of the county council loomed large in the by-election in Windermere, held following the tragic death of CCC's leader Jo Stephenson who, I am told, had the third highest Lib Dem majority in the land. The Lib Dems held the seat but their majority was slashed by two thirds. The turn out was 44%, high by national scales, but low by Burton's performance. More than ever I was struck by some voters lack of awareness of the voting procedure. Several people were cross that they couldn't vote because they were 'not on a list'; other thought that giving their number to the tellers was the same as voting, one lady wanted to vote for her husband who was 'minding the dog outside' and someone else wondered 'what it was all about as the vote was a fortnight ago': apparently she had confused the Cumbria by-election with the Referendum.

Ulverston a £1.20 all-day parking fee on four Saturdays in September and there will be free Sunday parking in Kendal in December. Sadly, but to some of us not surprisingly, the K Village Project is coming an end with, it is said, a £30m deficit and unpaid reimbursement costs to the district council of £100,000 spent on widening the pavements in Kirkland. My suggestion of turning the site back into shoe factory having been rejected no one knows what will happen to the shopping complex and the apartments, all of which are empty.

Housing remains our biggest social concern. 30% of all dwellings in the National Park are second homes. Years ago I advocated that second homes owners should pay the full Council Tax; now there are proposals that they should pay 50% plus. There are still 3127 'social housing units' (former council houses) which are run by South Lakes Housing, of which 913 are for locals only. Time alone will tell if SLDC will succeed in its commitment 'to support the building of 1,000 affordable homes to rent and to deliver 1000 high quality jobs, attracting skilled people and generating wealth.' But for those who can afford to live here South Lakeland is becoming safer. All crime is down by 12% with 113 less crimes, but sexual offences have increased by 120% with 12 more crimes.

Finally I am involved in planning a commemoration of the 1715 Jacobite invasion of Cumbria.
