Outdoors

A beautiful thing about footpaths is that they always lead somewhere. After all, the people who first trod them out, and then used them generation after generation, were not going to some random point in the middle of 'nowhere' and then just stopping. A path must lead to a stile or a well, a farm or a bridge, or a pass or a summit.

We were going out with Klipper the lurcher for her usual afternoon stroll, and we didn't feel like going yet again along one of the familiar ways through woods or along the canal. On the east side of the Milnthorpe road just south of Whasset one of the standard 'Public Footpath' signs pointed out and away through ordinary-looking fields. Why not? we thought. Something interesting always comes to light... So off we went down a track well made with hard-core, between hedges of hawthorn, ash, hazel, and holly, with lengths of old wooden rail across the gaps. Tractors had been here recently, and cattle. This afternoon nobody was about and the gently rising and falling green fields on every side were vacant enough to give the illusion that in the countryside nothing ever changes. The grizzled length of Farleton Fell bulked up ahead, rising northward to its top like the backbone of a bull sloping up to massive shoulders.

A streamlined apparition in scarlet and silver-grey streaked across our vision - a Virgin Express with nine coaches, on its way from Glasgow to Euston. Of course we knew the railway line was there - we sort of knew, that is. In its suddenness and mechanical splendour it was a 21st-century shock in the midst of a scene that could have been three centuries ago - apart from the size of the fields and the strands of barbed wire here and there.

We passed under the railway by a large and handsome archway, vaulted in brick, faced and coped with limestone that had been roughened in that Romantic mid-Victorian way. A keystone stood proud at the apex of the arch. The designer had embellished this bridge across the most ordinary farm track with a dado of shaped limestone, as though the steam-train bosses in 1850, with their frock coats and stovepipe hats, were going to demand the very best style when they came inspecting the far corners of their domain.

At this point deep muddy puddles across the track almost stopped us. We ploutered on, drawn by footpath lure. Ahead, a gate across the way looked like a natural terminus for our walk. An oak stood alone in a field. like a woodcut by Bewick, the great Newcastle engraver of country byways. A flock of big white sheep - Suffolks? Cheviots? - panicked off at the mere sight of our lean black killer-dog - who was, as always, on the expanding lead. We reached the gate. Beyond it, a bridge. Beneath, the River Bela, flowing black and smooth between low green banks. The silent pace of the water glided straight through my brain, filling it with peace. Nothing could be more fluent - a stream as dark as Guinness, with a few flecks of foam stirred up by the shingly rapids under the bridge. Upstream, two swans were pottering about, unaware of their snow-white beauty.

Commenting on the goings-on at the Parish Council meetings

But it is sadly true to say that without a massive effort of concentration the entire meeting threatened to wash over her, as the muttering and mumbling seemed to reach new heights. At the beginning of most meetings, the Chairman announces events that relevant PCIIrs can attend. Here's a new suggestion from A.O.: A COURSE IN PUBLIC SPEAKING! Police Report

CPSO Bullock was present and gave her report. This is often the highlight of the evening, and the report of an attempt to hold up the proprietor of Moss Lane Filling Station at knifepoint didn't fail us, even if we knew about it already. It's different when it's told by those at the coal-face. The would-be thief fled, after being bravely outfaced by a refusal to open the till. A dramatic police chase had followed, with an old lady being knocked down by a flying police car (but no harm done), and the offenders, who had also committed similar crimes in Morecambe, finally being caught and arrested.

The Police presence earlier in the week in Main Street was part of a campaign to stop and search vehicles in an operation against metal thefts. We all forgot to ask if anyone had been brought to book.

CPSO Bullock warned of scam phone calls purporting to be from the Police, asking for credit card details. Off went PCSO Bullock to pursue her duties.

And so down to business:

Income and expenditure accounts, cheques signed, accounts approved. It's all in the PC Minutes. And the Audit (which had no quibbles whatsoever) was approved, as of course it would be in such circumstances.

bathtub and blew leisurely bubbles at one another, while the Clerk made noble efforts to explain, which was a bit like emptying a jug of cold water on us all as we came up for air.

Daffodils

It was never intended to plant hybrid, brash bulbs. A PCIIr has found a valid source of native flowers, and gave details of price, method of planting and so on. It was agreed that £240 should be set aside to cover the cost of 100m of linear planting, and planting around trees.

Slape Lane

It was agreed that the flooding at the lowest point of Slape Lane was a sump, and inevitable. Infilling, which had been undertaken on other occasions, was at best temporary. Decking, where the path is raised above the level of the flooding, might have been an option, but the lane is a bridleway and therefore this would be impracticable for horse-riding. Exceptional wet weather has compounded the problem. Wellies appear to be the best answer.

Coming and going

The PC rep on the BMH Cttee reported that the PC suggestion to make entry/exit directions for the BMH car-park had been turned down by the Cttee on the grounds that the Library van would be unable to exit at the south end of the car-park. One PCIIr remarked that he had taken wagons of a similar size through that egress, and in any case it would be a minor matter to remove a few stones from the wall to make it easier, All were at a loss to understand the rebuff of their helpful suggestion to provide signs, but it seems the BMH ctte

is adamant. When funds are available they intend to revamp the entire car-park. "When will that be?" someone asked. The rep was uncertain, but thought it might be a few years yet. Meantime the arrangements stay as they are. Are there plans to replace the recycling skips? No, not at present, was the reply.

Weeds

Himalayan balsam, an invasive weed, has been reported at Clawthorpe and Dalton. It will be dealt with locally. Weeds in Main Street and The Square will be sprayed by the lengthsman.

Playground equipment

Most PCIIrs seemed to agree that the old roundabout is one of the most-loved items on the playground. Is this just nostalgia? It's falling to bits, and replacements aren't as good, seemed to be the consensus. Can the old one be given a facelift and new life? This is a possibility, and enquiries will be made. There is no doubt that A.O could do with a bit of a facelift herself, so it's off to the blacksmith to make further enquiries too.

Historical Footnote by Roger Bingham

THE 'VICTORY MONTH' - SEPTEMBER 1945

It was the first month of peace for six years, as the Second World War had ended on VE Day (Victory in Europe) in May and VJ Day (Victory over Japan) in August. Therefore, in September 1945, despite 'shortages', Burton celebrated with sports, a fancy dress parade and a tea party for over 60 children, when every child was given an ice cream and also an orange 'which many had never seen before.' They had to wait a little longer before bananas appeared. In the evening at the Fire Brigade dance, in the National School, Mrs. Mouncy won first prize for her "Won't you buy my pretty flowers" outfit. The proceeds, together with £100 from a sale, brought the Memorial Hall Fund (started in 1941) up to £727:93:4d. But the committee chairman, Mr Cummings, said that a suitable site had not yet been found.

As night fell on Victory Day villagers viewed the victory bonfires; Kendal's could be seen from as far way as Morecambe. The next week it was announced that, as Fire Stations would no longer be 'manned overnight', the Air Raid Alarm siren would be use to summon fire fighters, as hardly any of them had 'the telephone installed.' A week later firemen from Burton and Holme were called to a blaze which destroyed a barn at Raw Head Farm, Endmoor - where the buildings, damage to the farm house, and loss of the entire hay crop and much equipment were valued at £300. But they

successfully saved all the household furniture.

Other local successes included Bill Crayston, from the King's Arms, and John Atkinson, from Crow-trees, Dalton 'who 'passed their scholarships' for Heversham Grammar School, while Ethel Smart, from Church Bank, was awarded a BSc from London University.

The Harvest Festival collection of £12 was donated to Kendal Hospital and Lancaster Royal Infirmary. A current casualty was Miss Burtholme of Clawthorpe, organist at Holme Church for the past forty years, who broke her wrist when she was knocked off her bike on the A6070.

Another happy landmark of the 'Victory Month' was that Burton Show was held as 'South Westmorland's First Big Post-War Event.' Huge crowds flocked to Dalton Park 'where the quality of the stock was so splendid that it was evident that this was one national asset that had not suffered during the six dark years of War!'

The annual Burton Onion Show is part of our village folklore. The first one I attended was 18 yrs ago and, for me, the first Sunday in October has been kept free ever since. Most Onion Show attendants will have a story to tell, whether it be the best leeks they have ever grown only getting second place, or the plastic pot plant getting third one year. Someone also told me a story about Roger (the Kings' landlord at the time) who tried to cut up a chocolate cake only to discover it was made of plaster, much to the amusement of many onlookers! I wonder who would do such a thing.

The day itself consists of a show of home-grown and home-made produce. Judging starts at mid-day, with all entries auctioned alongside a list of promises kindly donated by generous local people and businesses. We also have an entertainer to keep the children happy while Mum and Dad can relax and enjoy a drink or two while enjoying the proceedings.

There is always an amazing standard from local greenfingered gardeners, but if you are not an expert gardener you may do better than you think. Vegetables are known to have been borrowed or acquired for the Show. Even if you cannot grow carrots or are not sure about your onions don't worry, you could bake a cake or a loaf of bread. Get the kids involved by having them to paint a picture. There is even a class for eggs, something for every one of all ages to enter. The show will be in its 36th year this October and was started all those years ago by Brian Martin and the late Tom Burton, Cloggy and Burto as they were more affectionately known. They were followed by John Long and Mike Earl, all helped along the way by many volunteers and members of the Children's Sports Committee past and present. This year however, they have taken a back seat and handed the reins to a new committee, consisting of Callum Graham, Carl Jackson and myself, Neil Shaw.

For many years Mitchells of Lancaster have sponsored the show by providing trophies for many of the classes for which we would like to thank them, but this year you could be making history by winning one of our new trophies kindly sponsored by Daniel Thwaites Ltd.

Over the years the show has raised thousands of pounds for various charities and the Burton Children's Sports Committee. The BCSC uses its donation to benefit all the children of the village by helping to pay for the village sports day, the Christmas parties for 0 – 11yrs, the big kids' day out for the older ones and subsidising the amazing fireworks display on bonfire night to be enjoyed by kids of all ages!

This year the proceeds of the Onion Show will be split, in the main, between BCSC and Burton First Responders: two great village causes. Other local causes will receive a donation.

It's been a busy year so far for the Memorial Hall, but we can see results for all the effort that's been put in.

At the AGM at end of May, Bert Nelson stood down as Chairman of the Management Committee, and was replaced by Nicola Little. The Committee expressed their deep appreciation of all of the effort and enthusiasm which Bert has expended during his time in the Chair, and were pleased that he remains a Committee member

In early July we were delighted to send two representatives on behalf of the Hall, Helen Dawson and Anne Nichols, to the Royal Garden Party at Holyrood House in Edinburgh. The invitation was because the Hall was one of the 60 Jubilee People's Millions winners in 2011, with a project completion date in this Jubilee year, 2012. Helen and Anne were selected to go because of the amount of work they had put into the Jubilee project, both had a fabulous time and described it as an experience of a lifetime. Our smart blue and silver oval plaque from the National Lottery has also arrived and will be put up near the new Jubiloos inside the main Hall, as a reminder of the Lottery's part in making the project happen for us.

At our recent Management Committee meeting we considered a suggestion which had been received, for making a one-way system through the hall's car park, with an entrance at the south end and an exit at the north end. The Committee felt that this could cause difficulties for large vehicles, such as the weekly Mobile

Library and Mobile Banking vehicles, which use the north end for access, and as we do not want to deter such vehicles, it was decided to defer making a decision until more consideration had been given to the matter, and the whole issue of the car park will be looked at in detail as part of the further planned improvements of the Hall.

The Committee are also in ongoing discussions with the district council as to what recycling facilities could be accommodated, whilst retaining the maximum use of the car park for hall users' vehicle parking, and how such facilities might impact on any changes being considered for the car park itself. We will keep the village updated as and when decisions are made on these important matters.

By the time you read this the main Hall should have had acoustic panels fitted to improve the sound quality and reduce the dreadful echo that it has suffered for too long. This will improve music and drama events, and make for a better environment for those groups whose activities generate sound.

During the last weeks of August both the Club Room and the Reception Room have been repainted by an enthusiastic team of paintbrush and roller-wielding volunteers, and we hope you agree that they both look much tidier for it!

We are also fund-raising to revamp the stage area and fit stage lighting and a sound system in the main Hall, and hope to achieve this by the end of the year. We have been successful in applying for a grant from SLDC towards the stage lighting and sound system, and our

sincere thanks go to them for their support. We also have a number of events planned as fund-raisers to help pay for the further improvement works, and hope that everyone will come along and support, and enjoy, them.

At the end of September is the second annual CraftMarket, where we welcome a whole range of crafters to the Hall for a two day sale of their products. We will have an exciting range of crafts on sale again, and this year we will also have the added attraction of a Pop Up Tearoom, 1950s style. So do come along and enjoy traditional English fare, scrumptious homemade cakes and more, all served in a 1950s atmosphere by the lovely ladies of the Vintage Village Hall.

In October we are holding the Autumn Coffee Morning with a number of stalls: plants, cards, cakes, bric-a-brac, etc and a raffle. In November we will be hosting a Pampered Chef night, when Diana Brown will be demonstrating how to make easy but impressive Canapes for Christmas. It promises to be a fun night, with a Ready Steady Cook-Off competition between two volunteers, a wine bar, quiz and raffle, the range of Pampered Chef products on sale, and much more besides!

Our annual Christmas Bingo will take place at the end of November - if anyone would like to come along and help on the night, or at any of our other events we'd be delighted to see you. We are now having bi-monthly meetings just for planning events and fund-raising, and the next one will be at 7.30pm on the last Tuesday of October in the Hall.

Roger Reports...

from the district & county councils

August used to be the 'off duty' month for councillors. But nowadays we seem to have as many meetings as in the rest of the year - not least on the Yorkshire Dales National Park (on which I represent the county council) where a nasty little row has broken out over (in my view) an over-bureaucratic, and therefore costly, demand that before claiming petrol expenses members should produce their licence, car tax, insurance policies and MOT certificate. Councillors are as prone to make mistakes as anyone else but I cannot recall any member getting into trouble in this way.

Negotiations over the possibility of extending the National Park's boundaries into our Lower Kentdale division seem to have stalled. But I am anxious that, as Burton would remain outside the Parks, we would have more development pressure put on the parish.

The final Public Inquiry on South Lakeland's Local Development Framework is about to take place, but only people who have already applied to take part can submit evidence. We should hear the result in six months but, as each development site will still require

planning permission, local controversy might not be abated.

As a member of the county's Safeguarding Adults group I have been particularly concerned with dignity and privacy issues regarding both home and in-care situations. If you have good or bad examples I would be grateful if you could let me know.

As Cumbria's Older Persons Champion I am investigating complaints about cold-calling. Local areas like Storth have banned cold calling, but Blackpool Council has imposed a ban throughout its area. Their enforcements costs have been met by reducing shop inspections. A ban would not stop election canvassers, charity flag sellers or the Poppy Day collectors, but it might stop people on probation trying to sell us packets of dusters at £10 a time. On the other hand we all want to 'rehabilitate' offenders and give work to the unemployed. Please what do you think?

On law and order I am the county's representative on the Police and Crime Commission which will scrutinise the Commissioner when she or he is elected on November 15. Because of this election our electoral roll registration has been brought forward from October. Please remember to register, and if you have any problems call the Returning Officer Claire Marsh at SLDC 01539 7333333.

The Costs of Care

Are you faced with (or aware of a family faced with) the appalling costs of residential care for an elderly person? Are you faced with having to sell a person's property (or already have sold one) to pay for their care in a home? If the main reason for that person going into care is ill-health, then it is the NHS that is responsible in law for paying and not you or the family. Monies already expended can be recouped even if the person is already in residential care, provided that you can prove that they were admitted on grounds of illhealth.

Anyone in this situation should be applying to the Primary Care Trust (PCT) for "Continuing Healthcare." This is a funding stream that is not widely known or publicised. However, you have only till 30 September next to apply, so you should be doing so promptly. Write to Clare Burdon, Cumbria NHS, Continuing Healthcare Department, Tenterfield, Brigsteer Road, Kendal LA9 5EA. Give a simple outline of the situation with the name and date of birth of the person concerned.

The process is not easy. You will be asked to complete quite a lot of forms and will need to read them most carefully. AgeUK has an excellent website (www.ageuk.org.uk/home&care) where you can read and listen to others' experiences. If you want help to get going, give me a call: Jon Taylor on 782932.


