Further evidence of Burton's history

An ancient artefact has recently been unearthed inside the boundaries of our village which may add further evidence of habitation earlier than villagers had previously thought.

Following some intensive research the item has been proved to be a drinking horn terminal. It is decorated with a zoomorphic design in the form of a hare's head, and originally would have had three arms travelling up the original ox horn to which it was pinned, two of these are missing, probably damaged by the plough.

The terminal is made of silver and weighs 28g and, according to professional archeological opinion, is Saxon - although influenced by the art of the Vikings. The age of manufacture is thought to be 9th century. In our parish church there is evidence of Saxon habitation, in that a fragment of a Saxon stone cross exists within the walls, although it is not part of the architecture.

The silver horn terminal was found using a metal detector and has been declared to the appropriate authorities for examination and recording purposes.

Outdoors

What a mess the incessant rains of 2012 have made of our footpaths. Boon Walks path, uphill from the north-east corner of the Square, was channelled out by the deluge of September 24-26 (77 mm in 48 hours, soon after 66 mm on September 16 - 20). Slape Lane, north-east from halfway up Vicarage Lane, is impassable without wellies in its two worst stretches.

The canal towpath is now so muddy - apart from the half-mile north from Tarn Lane - that the ground tries to suck your footgear off. We live in the midst of a delightful maze of walkways, by fields and copses, woods and watercourses. Now we're struggling, after a year which was browbeaten and soaked by 1544 mm of rain - the worst I've recorded in a quarter-century (1998 tallied 1367 mm on my garden gauge).

Boon Walks path (once "the Post Office path") has been gouged out by a groove nine inches across and six inches deep for most of its length, from near the old orchard at the top to the drain at the foot. Here somebody had the sense to build a wee dam of turf, stones, and gravel. Enough floodwater had got through to loosen cobbles and pour down grit, so that the entry to the lane is now like a wild shingle-beach. From now on heavy run-off is doomed to scour the channel even deeper and the sward to either side is a brown pulp. "It's just the natural elements," said a man I met up there with his yellow Labrador. Not altogether. Such a path is a holloway, beaten into the ground by centuries of

people and animals. Now it holds the water - or, this year, fails to hold it and starts to undo itself.

As for Slape Lane... it's a well-named track (or bridleway) always slippery and this year almost out of hand. The stretches of black soil where it starts to slope have turned into linear mires. The mud forces you almost into the hedge-bank. Where the lane levels out, the two stony stretches where hardcore has been tipped, in an effort to firm up the mire, are now 90% standing water. When I was there last, on January 15, the puddles and footprints were beautiful, layered with ice like mother-of-pearl tooled into curvaceous patterns (with a few as straight as a glazier's cut). At the first of the mires Klipper the lurcher actually, for once, balked. Her feet were splintering painfully through the ice or slithering ankle-deep into mud.

There seems little point in trying to mend either path. Global warming is going to generate downpours for centuries to come. Rubble-and-gravel patching is sluiced away sooner or later. The alternatives (tarmac, concrete) would be a travesty of what a path is: a co-operation between human beings and nature, a joy to take part in and rather trying when the sky delivers too much of Earth's most precious element.

The Friends of the Lancaster Maritime Museum invite you to join them on their coach trip planned for Saturday 25 May to Llangollen.



An Opinion...

Commenting on the goings-on at the Parish Council meetings

EMPTY VESSELS – IS IT TRUE THEY MAKE THE MOST NOISE?

Or on the other hand, is the dull thud of very full vessels even worse?

But whichever is the least satisfactory, the last Parish Council meeting managed to cover all options, and An Opinion, never the most patient of reporters (if such a noun can be used here), was thrown into a fuzz of frustration, as words buzzed over her head, or seeped gingerly between the cracks of door frames, and so on. In other words, the loudest voice carried the day, and this happened to be the voice of one of our very own district councillors, who never shied away from interrupting. This usually happened as A.O. applied herself to her notebook in readiness to record something worthy of note that some unassuming PCllr was trying to bring to the notice of the room. So it has to be admitted that this column is relying as much on an early copy of the as-yet unofficial minutes, as on her own imagination. It was tempting to introduce her old friend, Roper here, as an imagined PCllr (co-opted, of course) would hardly go amiss in these paragraphs. But readers don't seem to appreciate Roper, so I'll give him a miss, and do the best that can be done, though readers would be advised to consult the REAL minutes.

Police Report

This had been sent in by Jess Bullock, and Jayne

Park. Not much to report in Burton itself, except a smashed window. But a PCllr reported that a trailer had been stolen from work near Tewitfield. This is Jess's last report before she goes to Newcastle to train as a full Police Officer. The PCllrs thanked her for her service to us all, and wished her well in her new career. And so does A.O.

Planning

A.O. missed the last PC meeting. But objections were raised by residents about the plans for a development in the grounds of the Tannery, which they feared would spoil the historic quality of the building.

Morewood School

A well-thought-out discussion arose. PCllrs were aware that planning permission had to be given before a fast-approaching cut-off date, so they were unwilling to hinder the application. Nevertheless they pointed out that this was a central building in the village and had a certain character which they thought would be destroyed if the plans as they stood go ahead. A high zinc roof is proposed. This, they thought would be intrusive and out of character. Far better – and probably cheaper – to have a slate pitched roof. They resolved not to oppose the plans, but to add this suggestion.

Community-led Plans vs Neighbourhood Plans

There is no doubting the importance of this topic to the PC but it fills A.O. with cynical apprehension. What will it achieve, apart from a lot of hard work falling on a few shoulders? Readers will know of A.O.'s attitude to the much-vaunted Quality Status that the PC achieved. It was to their credit that they

did so, but what has come of it? Apart from kudos, absolutely nothing, as far as A.O. can see (though she is prepared to be corrected on this matter. In fact it can only be to the good if she is mistaken). The issue is, whether the PC wants to initiate a Community-led Plan, or a Neighbourhood Plan. Both plans involve public participation. But the Neighbourhood Plan needs a referendum, and if more than 50% of those voting approve, then the plan is formally adopted, and the local authority will take account of policies within the plan as well as the district Local Plan. OK so far, but the "as well as..." bit seems to give a big let-out to the local authority. Money is involved. Parishes who adopt the Neighbourhood Plan will receive 25% of the community infrastructure budget to spend as they please. Anyway the PC decided to seek further info, and rightly so.

Speaker at the PC Annual Meeting

After discussion, it was agreed that Lorraine Smythe, the Neighbourhood planning project officer should be invited to speak on the above topic. Which disappointed A.O. who had rather been hoping that the new Police Commissioner, Richard Rhodes, would get the vote. A.O. would simply like to see what he's like! Our committee-bagging Dist Cllr pointed out that he himself had been elected onto the Commission Committee, though for sure A.O. hasn't given it the right name.

The Westmorland Sign

An endearing idea is to have a "Westmorland" sign at the south entry to the county on the A6070. A copy of the county crest was shown to the meeting, and the plan is on-going. "Make it vandal-proof" was the advice of one canny PCllr.

The Parish Precept

On the recommendation of the Parish clerk, the PC agreed to the previously-agreed precept of £11,783.

NHS Plan to Remove Vascular Dept from RLI to Preston et al...

A thoughtful discussion arose, too lengthy to record here. But the Clerk's letter to the relevant authority included the following recommendation, "The Parish Council strongly recommends that Lancaster hospital be selected as one of the specialist hospitals to provide vascular services to the communities of South Cumbria and North Lancashire."

This is by no means all that took place at the meeting. I hope I haven't missed out anything really important. The idea is that things I have omitted will arise at the next meeting. And the next. And the next....

FRANK WALTON 1935-2012

Frank Walton, Burton News' Treasurer, who died in December, was an energetic and versatile man, good company, full of ideas and reminiscences, a loving husband of Pauline, whom he married in 1959, and father of four daughters and a son.

He was born in Baildon, in West Yorkshire, and schooled in Preston and at the Harris Tech. He became an apprentice at British Telecom when he was 17 and worked for them until his retirement. His National Service took him to Egypt and Cyprus. A natural athlete, he ran for the Royal Signals and belonged to Preston Harriers.

For BT he worked on the maintenance of exchanges and transmission stations and the building of new ones. He was steadily promoted, and became an Assistant Technical Engineer, rising to Level 4. He developed his skills in materials management at Cranfield Tech., and in the end had a staff of 350. All BT's outlets had their own store and one of Frank's main jobs was to streamline all this so that there was no needless, expensive overlap between one depot and another.

Pauline had been working for the A.A. When they retired, they were looking for "a detached bungalow with a west facing view and a garden", somewhere north of Preston, (Pauline's father came from Barrow). They found what they wanted at the top of Morewood Drive, and from 1999 they were active and valuable members of our community.

Frank had been chairman of Mellor Tennis Club and he played enthusiastically on Burton's new

court until he was 70. He was a regular member of Burton's bowling team in the Rural League, where he will be warmly remembered and much missed.

He also worked hard for the Holme & District Photographic Society, and he particularly liked to photograph buildings. I will always treasure a print he gave me of an extraordinary Aboriginal dream-painting he had photographed on a shop wall in Western Australia.

Photography combined Frank's relish for the physical world and his cleverness with gear. He was an adept handyman, who could put in a kitchen or a bathroom. He was a lively talker, ready to say what he thought about the politics of the day and to quote from his inexhaustible store of jokes from the comic classics (especially Hancock and Fawltly Towers).

The night before I wrote this, I dreamed that some of us were walking up the car park beside the Royal and found Frank asleep in the passenger seat of his car. As he woke up, he realised he was surrounded by friends looking in and he smiled sheepishly: a moment of fantasy that expresses how unforgettable Frank was. If only he was still alive to laugh about it and cap it with something of his own....

Roger Reports...

from the district & county councils

The Council Budgets will be set at the end of February when we will find out if the Council Taxes will go up, or what 'savings' will be required to achieve a three-year record of nil tax increases. But the Police rate could go up. But we do pay up, as in 2012 98.2% of the projected revenue was collected, which was amongst the nation's best returns. Meanwhile, SLDC is proposing removing the 10% reduction in Council Tax (CT) on second homes and abolishing the 50% CT discount on homes vacant for more than six months. The 100% discount on unoccupied homes will be limited to six months. Some of us thought that second homes should pay more than 100%, but that a six months' moratorium might be too short for older people who have gone into residential care and who cannot sell their homes quickly. Please, what do you think?

Older people are a growing social factor. Demographic statistics show that 3.4% of South Lakeland people are aged 85+; other figures are 0-14 -14.1%; 15-29-14.2%; 30-44 17.1%; 45-59 21.9%; 60-74 21.2% and 75-84 8.1%. Recommendations from the Safeguarding Adults Task and Finish Group on which I serve included that, a) Dignity be included in care packages; b)

there should be an independent chair of the Safeguarding Executive; c) Members should 'make regular visits to public and private care homes and day facilities'; d) self-harm and self neglect should be included as safe-guarding issues. The percentages of alleged abuses were physical 51%; financial 17%; sexual 11%; neglect 10%; psychological 9%. Referral sources were: institutional 1%; health staff 17.5%; social care staff 51%; police 6%; self-referrals 2%. The contact number for Adult Care is 01228 227110.

The Police and Crime Commission, on which I serve, consists of 4 Labour members, 3 Conservatives, 2 Liberal Democrats, 1 independent and 2 non-councillor co-opted members. The unanimous objective is to reduce expenditure without cutting 'front-line' policing. Other concerns are a) alcohol related issues which affect 80% of violent crimes and 80% of A&E Admissions on Friday and Saturday nights; b) repeat offenders, e.g. 90% of inmates at Lancaster Farms Young Offenders institution are re-convicted within a year of release; c) Domestic Violence cases; and d) a particular concern of the Commissioner Richard Rhodes, service veterans who constitute 10% of prisoners.

On SLDC the parking debate continues about why/how the new parking meters cost £340,000, along with the unresolved attempts to replace Kendal's free New Road car park with a grass park. But a report in The Times that SLDC resident's Parking Permits at £93.05 pa are in the top twenty dearest in the country was wrong, as the permits are free and are administered by the county and not by the district council. As winter set in the county announced that, with 22,000 tonnes

of grit and salt, we are better prepared than ever before to deal with icy roads - we'll see! Meanwhile I have checked extra grit heaps on Clawthorpe Lane and elsewhere, and asked for another heap at the Station which I hadn't known about before.

Further flood prevention work on Tanpits Lane will involve a new drain, as also may be the case with drains near The Square. These were efficiently unblocked by the neighbours during the December flooding, for which many thanks. I am still pressing for the new Station Road sign, and have been told that subject to Highways approval re precise location etc it will be OK for the parish council to erect a Westmorland sign near the original county boundary at Heronsyke.

Church News...

At the Lunch Time Special in December we were privileged to have as our guest speaker the Rt. Revd. Robert Freeman Bishop of Penrith who gave us an insight into his life and Christian Faith.

From humble beginnings in Cambridge and becoming a typical wayward teenager, it was his father, with no interest in church but passionate about honesty and social justice, who influenced his thinking about others, even though he felt people neither thought nor cared about him.

At the age of 14 years he made a wonderful discovery when he met a group of Christians in a church. They welcomed him for who he was and showed a caring interest in him. He soon realised this was God's love being demonstrated in Christian lives, a love which was for everyone, therefore God loved HIM. He had thought church was for good people who try hard to be better and live moral upright lives, but he was wrong, the Christian life is accepting God's grace and loving God and your neighbour as yourself. His Christian journey had now begun.


Recently someone had said to the Bishop "Jesus is interesting" but his answer to this was "Jesus is

more than interesting." Jesus was radical when we consider his life and teaching, and radical in the response he requires of us, which is total commitment to Him. But Jesus does promise his followers to be absurdly happy, completely fearless and constantly in trouble.

The Bishop ended his talk by saying, because God is everyone, everywhere, regardless of status, there is a need for diversity in styles of worship and approach. He illustrated this by mentioning three different parishes where he had served: in Blackpool, Chigwell and Cosmopolitan Leicester.

*Historical Footnote

The Dog Days of Winter

February and March - "the Dog Days of Winter" were, for our agricultural forebears, the toughest time of the Year. December was cheered by Christmas. Apart from keeping the home fires burning, the work load in January was light as the land was too sodden to be cultivated, and there were only a few breeding cattle to be fed and mucked out as most of the meat stock had gone to the Martinmass fares in November.

Lambing time, even in temperate south Westmorland, was mainly in April, but in March sheep still required attention, as flocks which had been wintered around Burton had to be sorted out prior to being returned to the upland fells. Lowland farmers were paid a shilling a head for every sheep, but only after they had been returned - the death rate being about ten per cent.

Ploughing began in earnest on Candlemass Day, 2 February. Andrew Pringle, in 1794, reported that in the enclosed fields between Burton in Kendal and Kirkby Lonsdale "the land is ploughed as soon after Candlemass as the weather will permit and a hundred cart loads of stable yard dung are laid upon the acre." If there was not enough home-produced dung then manure could be bought and carted from Milnthorpe market at one shilling a load. Altogether it would take four working days to muck spread an acre - a task which, today, a shower from a slurry tanker could achieve in ten minutes.



Lent only added to the grimness of the season, but before the forty fast days started on Ash Wednesday there were lighter moments - literally so at Candlemass when fires were lit in farmyards to purify the air - a process which was repeated by the "Need Fires" in May. According to J. Sullivan in 1857, "the Monday preceding Lent is celebrated with the dinner adjunct of bacon collops and eggs, Tuesday with pancakes, Ash Wednesday with a hash." Unfortunately he did not provide a recipe for the hash nor for the ingredients required for "Bloody Thursday, Hang Up on Friday, and Cut Down on Saturday." Then on "the second Sunday before Easter came Carling Sunday when grey peas having been steeped in water, then fried in fat are presented to all visitors; whilst in Cumbria wherever it is observed the raw carlings are carried in the pocket and thrown at friends and acquaintances - there is no appearance of a Christian origin."

The book follows on from two previous volumes and contains a fascinating insight into the lives of the people who lived here then.


As well as births, marriages and deaths, there is news about the schools, churches and chapels.






