White, white, white - every colour moment a month ago seemed to be white. Snowdrop buds and flowers. Snowflakes, some small as sparrowdown, some big as a butterfly's wing, drifting about on the wind from across the Pennines. On clear days, cottony clouds on the blue like the painted ones at the start of The Simpsons. White of sheep's fleeces and the snowy flare of a swan's wings flying high above the canal and sheering off westward near Holme. Above and beyond them all, like phantoms of the last Ice Age, swathes of snowfield shine out on the high fells Rainsborrow to the north up Kentmere. Fairfield beyond Windermere, Pavey Ark in Langdale. Sometimes they shimmer mirage-like through wintry haze, sometimes they stand out as clear and abrupt as Alps in Switzerland.

Still more whites are waiting to gleam out - once the sugary glaze of rime has gone from the little green hearts of wintercelandine leaves and the Magnolia wizened bramble foliage. look imminent always buds surprisingly early for so decorative and exotic a shrub. Blackthorn leaf-buds are opening on the Boon Walks path (first

seen on February 25.) Soon their flowers will be out, like snow-showers caught amongst twigs and leafage. They are all sparks of cold fire from a sun which is recovering its power after that gloomy time between the two equinoxes. Now less-icy whites can begin to shine out - the waxy candles of magnolia flowers, the may blossom which looks as though the hawthorn hedges have been sprayed with cream. White remains a northern look and a cold one (all right, Antarctica is fairly white too.) Vivid colours belong to the tigers mandrills. tropics. to and peacocks and birds-of-paradise. In our snow latitudes animals can even turn white for camouflage. On the high sub-Arctic moors of the Cairngorms I've seen ptarmigan so blanched in their winter plumage that they're almost invisible; then they startle off into the fog like outsize snowballs. The hares. too, turn white to blend in with the snowfields and when they sprint off over brown heather in, say, late April, they look too noticeable for their own good. The only polar bear I ever saw had the same problem - with no predator big enough to endanger it. It was squatting miserably on a coastal reef one August, on the west shore of Hudson Bay. These bears go hungry when the sea ice melts because seals are no longer forced to surface at breathing-holes where the bears can lie in wait for them. I was staying in Churchill. A woman of

half-Cree half-Scottish descent told me that a bear had come barrelling down the street one day. It went into the Legion bar and threw chairs about, and so frightened one drinker that he gave up alcohol forthwith. The town has built a pound out of steel and breezeblock which can hold twenty bears (tranquillised with darts) until they take them away by helicopter, three hundred a year, to a remote place where they can't pester humans (or vice versa.)

Commenting on the goings-on at the Parish Council meetings

#### Annual General Meeting - it's here again Guest speaker – Ms Lorrainne Smyth Subject: Voluntary Action with Communities in Cumbria

Long titles for speeches are an ominous sign. It occurred to An Opinion that an apter version of Ms Smyth's speech might have been "Cumbersome Action with Communities." The talk by Ms Smyth centred round the newlyestablished Neighbourhood Planning process, which will impact on planned development in the village.

Communities will bear the brunt of this dream-child, still in its infancy and so far untested. It seemed to A.O. that this was a new sort of Monopoly devised for maximum irritation. The county or district councils make up the rules, and they go something like this: "We give you lots of houses (or hotels, if you behave yourselves), and you might be allowed to put them where you want on the board. But there are lots of rules before you can even begin to play, and whatever you do, you can't win. If you behave and all the players agree, we might let you have a station or two. The Community Chest will be in our hands, and we aren't going to tell you when



we're dealing out the odd card. There isn't exactly a Go To Jail card yet. But if you don't stick to the rules we might think about that. If things get out of hand, we may have to do a re-think and introduce a few more rules. No, you certainly cannot make up a few vourselves. We're in charge." As if an elder brother has reluctantly been left to baby sit his annoying little cousins who have no idea whatsoever about Monopoly. and have never played before, but have to do as he says because he's older than they are.

Ms Smyth was enthusiastic about the plan, and had most of its details at her fingertips. Readers of this column will not have gained much enlightenment from A.O.'s comparison, but it is recommended that, as ever, it's better to read the Clerk's synopsis where more accurate, and probably fairer, detail is available. In any case it's likely that Burton PCIIrs will have to accept the plan which clearly involves them in a lot more administration etc. and which includes the necessity of a village Referendum to achieve any aims they might put forward. And it incidentally may be the cause of them taking the flak if any of their suggestions, when carried out, go pear-shaped. Our PCIIrs are remarkable in that most of them already undertake heavy voluntary responsibilities, both within and outside their PC duties. This scheme, if it is implemented will be another burden,



and it can only be hoped that Ms Smyth's enthusiasm is well-founded. At the end of her talk, the PCIIrs asked more questions than usual, which mostly were well-parried by the speaker, though she admitted that since the scheme was only in its infancy, some answers were at the moment unknowable. The talk lasted quite a long time, and the Chairman thanked her for her clear explanations.

#### Chairman's Anual Report

The Chairman of the Parish Council, PCIIr Mike Taylor, read his report documenting the activities and accomplishments of the PC over the year. (This may be read in full on the PC website.) In conclusion he thanked PCIIrs for the work they had done in the past year. He gave particular thanks to Parish Clerk Peter Smith for his help and support. The Parish Council, he said, was well-financed and ran like a well-oiled machine.

#### Police Report – A New Face

The PCIIrs welcomed PCSO Karen Dakin, one of the two new PCSOs in the area. She gave her report re incidents occurring in Burton in the last month:

1. Diesel had been syphoned from a works vehicle in Boon Town.

2. A vehicle window was smashed on St James' Drive and 2 chainsaws stolen.

3. A sat-nav and charger were taken from an insecure vehicle on Hollowrayne.

4. Vehicles had been reported speeding through the village.

Commenting, PCSO Dakin told us that it was the intention to bring the speed radar to the village. She also said that with the agreement of Gill and Akis, arrangements were under way to establish a monthly drop-in point at the shop where villagers can meet with her and PCSO Colman and discuss their concerns. Cold phone calls were also discussed. PCIIrs pointed out that often the Telephone Preference system was ignored. We were assured that recently a firm had been heavily fined for flouting it.

The Open Forum closed and PCIIrs got down to business:

#### Tilting at Windmills, Again

As far as A.O. can remember, the PC has always voted down proposals for wind turbines in the area. Till now. But the request for Planning Permission for 75m high turbines at Kelker Well and Whin Yeats got a more reasoned and sympathetic hearing. A PCIIr reported that he had ascertained how intrusive they would be in the area. and concluded that they would not impinge on outlooks from Burton, and possibly not from Clawthorpe either. Some of our PCIIrs oppose turbines as a matter almost of principle, and still seemed dubious. But one PCIIr defended them, on the ground that, apart from providing

renewable energy, they were shortlived on the landscape and easily dismantled and do no lasting damage to the environment. Unexpectedly another PCIIr spoke up to support him. A vote was taken, and "No objection" was recorded to planning permission. N.B. The chairman announced that National Grid are intending to work on the main North and South power lines that run close to the eastern boundary of the parish. Work will last over the next few weeks.

#### New Homes Bonus

This grant, for Locally Important Projects, was put forward by a PCIIr, with the suggestion that Burton should apply for help with the cost of establishing a footpath north from Burton to Clawthorpe. There might also be the possibility that financial help could also be available for the Rec. Trust.

#### Renewal of Burton "Quality" Status

The time has come for the renewal subscription for this hard-won accolade. It was generally agreed that it had been a disappointing enterprise. Very little, if any, advantage had been achieved after a lot of hard work. This is a great pity, with SLDC apparently unwilling to delegate any privileges to councils who achieved it. After a pretty disillusioned discussion, it was decided to renew it, though A.O. isn't quite sure what reasons finally triumphed.

## Roger Reports... from the district & county councils

The consequences of the councils' Budgets passed at the end of February are being considered. Generally the debates at the county and district councils were not contentious. On the county council the members of the two main parties (with the smaller group abstaining) voted for a nil increase of and Council Tax. almost the all did SLDC. The members SO on on centred where the arguments inevitable cuts aka 'efficiency savings' should come. The county council's total Budget of £780m (including the school's budget of £254.374m) from which £22m in savings were achieved. Generally, services safeguarded major were though reduced coalition government funding led to cuts even though the county's contribution was stable.

Extra 'pressures' i.e. spending requiring additional funds included £0.062m for the Coroner's Service, £1m for waste £0.050m disposal, and for concessionary fares. One of my special concerns. libraries also received an extra £200,000. This enabled me to interrupt a speech by Melvin Bragg at the Theatre by The Lake at Keswick, in which he alleged that there was a nationwide closure of libraries. bv stating that "No Libraries have been closed in Cumbria." An additional £2m has been allocated for Looked After Children - whose numbers have increased to 600+ with some individual care plans costing £100,000 pa.

On the other hand there has been a reduction of £1m for the careers service which, in response to an enquiry, I was "reflects the additional told responsibility schools will have for the provision of careers advice." Local committee funding has also been reduced by £0.3m so there could be less parish for schemes like playgrounds next year. Happily the annual £1,000 grant I provide for the Burton's lengthsman has been safeguarded for this year at least. Also, despite £0.08m cuts in Highways, some of our lanes will be dressed, but the biggest expenditure in our Lower Kentdale Division will be £184,000 to resurface the A6070 from the Village Shop to Morewood Drive. There will, inevitably, be general repairs in Main Street, plus the flood abatement works on Tanpits Lane and elsewhere. The sunny weather three weeks ago enabled some white-lining to be done; the Boon Town Playground sign and 20 MPH flashing warning in Main Street should now be installed. I have again been told that the remedial work to Hutton Close and Burton Park will be done

Compared to the county, SLDC's budget of about £20m, of which £7.7m is raised through the Council Tax, is tiny. The combined county and district Council Tax amounts to £1,572.43 for a Band D property. The Police Commissioner's Tax has however gone up by £3.87 per Band D to help meet the Police Budget of £120m.

The district council, in an attractive leaflet. has outlined its aims and successes. A new homes bonus will alleviate for a few families the effect of a median house price rise across the district from £74,000 in 2000 to £208.709 2012. But in much development will be delayed until the Local Development protracted Framework is published which, I'm told, might still be another year or so.

SLDC aims to boost waste recycling and composting from 44% to 50% by 2015. I was pleased that South Lakeland is encouraging "our culture and wellbeing." Tourism is a bedrock to our economy and income from e.g. carparking reduces the Council Tax by £2m. Nowadays, cultural events like Brewery Arts, festivals and exhibitions are no longer seen as nice extras, but essential for prosperity.

Finally, I was pleased that council grants to the Sandgate Hydrotherapy Pool in Kendal have been maintained.



The newly refurbished facilities, which I saw on a recent open day, are amongst the best in the North of England. 500 people, generally in hourly sessions for 16 participants, use the centre each week.

All the best and let's enjoy the Spring when and/or if it comes.

The process to recruit a new priest-incharge for the churches of St James Burton and Holy Trinity Holme is underway and the purpose of this short article is to provide an update with further information to follow as the recruitment process progresses and an appointment is made (God willing.)

The timeline for the appointment of a new minister within the Carlisle Diocese is that there is a 12 month interregnum (gap between ministers.) During the early to mid part of this period a number of tasks need completing by the Parochial Church Council (PCC) to inform and enable the recruitment process.

As I write this in mid-March much of the preparatory work has been completed. The two PCCs (Burton and Holme each have their own PCC) are nearing completion of a joint Parish Profile document that provides potential applicants with information in respect of the churches. their finances. congregation numbers and a flavour of the activities undertaken in both villages by the whole community. Alongside this document sits one detailing the job specification purpose and person which candidates will against be assessed at interview.

It is anticipated that the position will be advertised in April / May time, with interviews scheduled to occur at the start of June. Each PCC has elected 2 representatives to sit on the interview panel alongside Bishop Robert and a Simeon Trustee representative.

It is expected that the new priest-incharge will take up his post in September 2013.

## Historical Footnote by Roger Bingham

#### The "eyebrows of history" 20<sup>th</sup> Century Burton

Relatively recent commentators have added to a sense of Burton's place in history. Thus in the early 1900s it was said that Burton, having shrunk since its heyday in Georgian coaching days, was currently "sleeping to death." Just before the Second World War the popular author Arthur Mee in his Lakes Counties more or less dismissed Burton as "an old fashioned place on the Lancashire border." He did however note that "it has a spacious square, charming cottages, 18<sup>th</sup> century houses, (Burton House) one with finne fireplaces and ceilings by Robert Adam." Moreover, he cited a popular fable "a local hawthorn is said to mark Cromwell's of the grave of one the village burying him horsemen, where they found him." In 1949 Norman Nicholson in his County Book paints a brighter picture, that his except illustrations show arev unа whitewashed architectural scene. Even so, Burton to him resembled scenery. "It is one street. It does not seem to have grown, but to have been planned by an artist. Even the square with a market-

cross is intimate and formal, a halfsized set which might be transported to the London stage for an opera. There is a box of a cobbler's shop at the corner so small that it would all go back and front into a fair-sized room. The eyebrows of history hang over the village like the upper rooms of the old house held up by pillars on the pavement." Despite stressing Burton's Olde Worlde charm the persistent modern stress was on the effect of motor transport. Norman conceded that, unlike Milnthorpe, Burton "takes much less traffic, though the amount increases each year; it was from the start, a road-based village it is therefore the better able to stand up to intrusion." (NB I wonder if anyone agreed with him even By the time Alfred then!) Wainwright published his Westmorland Heritage in 1975 the road problems had been alleviated "the weight of modern traffic along the old turnpike road has posed a succession of problems that first the railway, then the A6 and latterly the motorway have greatly relieved, yet the village remains active and busy with local affairs." Norman alone referred to the inhabitants for, historic as the village appeared, he warned "if you try to diddle Burton people you'll soon find thev are living whether in the seventeenth century or the present day." Whatever could he have meant?

We are very lucky in this area to have such beautiful countryside and especially fortunate to have so many Nature Reserves on the doorstep. One of these is Holme Park Quarry Local Nature Reserve which is run by a local committee and may be accessed from Clawthorpe Lane. 
