

PC News...

Reporting from the Parish Council meeting

Having been warned by the police that it would not be possible for them to attend every parish council meeting, it was good to see PCSO Karen Dakin at the meeting. Even better, she reported that there had been no crime of note in the village over the last month. Rural crime remains the priority for our neighbourhood policing team. answer to a question about a possible incident on the canal path, about which she was unaware, it was impressive that in two minutes she was able to go out to her car and get a full report by radio and come back to talk to the (As an aside, the council about it. police have put a lot of work into neighbourhood policing, they expect and get – a lot from the PCSOs who are now, for most of us, the only contact we have with the police, so it's good to see them in the village and get a chance to know the Sedbergh-based team as well as we knew the old Milnthorpe team.)

Two items at the meeting took up most of the councillors' time and effort. The first was the planning application for three 34 metre high wind turbines at Green Dragon Farm close to the motorway. After a long discussion the council agreed to oppose the



They believe that at the application. proposed site the development would adversely affect the character and appearance of the rolling farmland that surrounds the village. The turbines would be a particular concern to the housing land allocation site which is near to the proposed turbine site. The council also expressed concern that the applications for wind turbines in the M6 corridor appear to be being made without any overall plan consideration of the total effect that they will have.

The second item was the county council's report on traffic speed through the village. Road safety through the village is a constant concern. So earlier in the year the council asked the county council for advice on how we might improve safety. One of the concerns was the speed of traffic through the village, the county agreed to monitor speed at three known problem areas. The measurements were to be taken during a school term so that the larger volumes of school traffic would be Unfortunately recorded. measurements were taken during the February half-term and two of the measurement sites were not ideally placed. Nevertheless the results were quite alarming, for example 24% of southbound traffic at Boon Walks was exceeding the speed limit. The county council Highways Department makes a

few recommendations, one of which is that they are referring the report to the police for speeding enforcement action. The parish council agreed to ask that the measuring exercise be repeated during term time so that a comparison could be made. The councillors recognised that speeding wasn't the problem. The danger to whole pedestrians and cyclists of being sideswiped is very real, and the morning and afternoon school run, with vehicles parked illegally and thoughtlessly is a continuing problem. The council will discuss road safety generally in the village at the September meeting. If residents have any suggestions do please contact one of the councillors or the clerk.

As always there were a lot of odds and ends at the meeting: the streets had been swept, Slape Lane and Boon Town Lane had been cut and cleared, and the white-lining had been done at Burton Park and Hutton Close. The lengthsman had sprayed the weeds along kerbs and bridges and will clear the ivy and weeds from the seats at the bottom of Dalton Lane and Clawthorpe Lane. And, great news, a volunteer had come forward to look after the triangle of land at the junction of Station Lane and Tanpits Lane.

The council is keeping an open mind on neighbourhood planning. For residents who are interested in helping to lead a

Finally, the Clawthorpe bus shelter is being cleaned and preserved and the Dalton Milestone restoration is complete. If you notice that the two plaques on the milestone look different, one is the original cast iron, the other is an aluminium replica that was made a few years ago to replace the missing cast iron one. The Milestone Society were keen that we kept the aluminium one because they want to see how it survives over the years.

On the hour - to save the tower

Open Garden at 7 Hutton Close, Burton Saturday 10 & Sunday 11 August

I moved into the village in May 2012, to a house and garden which were going to be home for many years (I hope!) Not daring to look at the garden until the house was done – I know what I'm like – it was 5 months later, in the last week of October, that work on the garden began. Little did I know that the weather was to take the turn that it did and there would be wind, rain and snow until February.

After moving the plants that I wished to keep to the vegetable beds, to join the ones which I had brought with me, the contractor arrived, and after 1½ days and the removal of 100 tonnes of old fence, paving, plants and conifers I was left with the bare earth shaped to the plan drawn up on my whiteboard. The topsoil arrived on 6 November along with the rain that was to last till February.

As I sat in the conservatory contemplating the mud wallow, which any family of hippos would be proud to call home, I decided that moving the front door to face the said wallow would be a good idea. So, in the week before

Christmas, accompanied by a howling gale, this was done. Every morning that week I was relieved to find the roof still in place whilst the sides were rebuilt and replaced underneath it.

January came and went, and it was only on 16 February that I noted "End of wet spell at last. Cold and bright." On the 17th we started to build the bones of the garden, still working to the original design. After moving the soil to the shape and height required to cope with the slope, the larch sleepers were put into place. The next 6 weeks were a flurry of activity, during which I decided that both a pergola and an arbour should be added! The thought of adding them at a later date - Plan A was just too much, so up they both went, still using larch to avoid the use of either preservative or stain in the years to come. All this construction went on around me, whilst I laid paths and a patio, moving about 6 of the 7.83 tonnes of gravel that had earlier been deposited at my gate in the process.

Having made the decision to retire at the end of March, I was delighted to be given the month off as "gardening leave" – just being called in to resolve any queries raised by the new staff. So there was much buying of trees and shrubs of varying heights and differing qualities, trying to provide interest for all times of the year and cater for the abundant wild life. Once they were

I have tried to place them so as to allow space for them to mature without further interruption or effort from me.

Despite the trauma many of the plants have been subjected to, I am both amazed and delighted to have lost hardly any, and certainly no significant specimens. Also the flowers that Mrs had garden Procter in the alstromeria. Japanese anemone. asters, a pretty lilac-flowered perennial and forget-me-nots have all appeared to claim their place in the new scheme of things.

Being one for keeping lists, I have recorded everything I brought, kept, and bought, and noted where they are planted. So far this shows that the garden contains at least 298 plants but by the time you read this, who knows! (Reflecting on the cost involved, maybe I should have worked a little longer?)

Working in my garden I am oblivious to time, but on the hour the church clock strikes and I pause to count, enjoy the moment and survey my progress. So, please, come, enjoy the garden; and on the hour, pause, count the strikes, and reflect on your contribution to the preservation of the church tower.



Historical Footnote by Roger Bingham

WHERE THERE'S A WILL

"Where there's a Will there's a relation" is a traditional jibe about a deceased person's ultimate wishes. A more seemly stance is "to consider the poor and needy." These two testamentary aspects were followed in his Will, dated 25 January 1795, by John Parkinson of Burton in Kendal, surgeon, who died on 29 September 1797 aged 71. According to his memorial in the parish church, "through his great professional skill and success an extensive neighbourhood was highly benefitted for 40 years and which he was rewarded with due reputation and the final acquirement of an ample fortune."

The principal beneficiary of this fortune was his sister Elizabeth Parkinson to whom he left "all real estate in Old Hutton, Killington and Burton, and in Priest Hutton, also all ready money, household furniture, bills, bonds, mortgages and other personal estate, for life."

By a codicil Elizabeth was bequeathed £1,000 and "all plate, books, apparel, household furniture absolutely and not merely for life." After her death the lifetime bequest was to go to "Elizabeth,"

daughter of John Towers of Slackhead." John Towers, himself "received annuity of £15 charged upon messuage called Bendrigg, Hutton." John's sons: John, Thomas, Laurence and James each got £230. The same sum went to James Towers. son of kinsman James Towers Lancashire, Tailor, deceased and to Elizabeth, Thomas, Ann John. children of James Townson of Holme Park by kinswoman Mary, daughter of John North. Another kinsman, Robert North of Claughton also got £1,000.

Regarding the poor and needy Mr Parkinson left £20 p.a to the Master of Burton Grammar School for educating 20 poor boys: 10 from Burton, 6 from Holme and 4 from Dalton to instruct them in English, Latin and Greek; also £7 to be paid yearly for a school to instruct 14 poor girls in reading, sewing and knitting.

Further particulars of Mr Parkinson's estate are contained in a marriage settlement when Miss Parkinson gave her niece, the wife of the Rev Henry Sill, "a new dwelling house with outbuildings, orchard and garden, two closes called Hoadleys and a close called Little Croft, late customary estate of John Parkinson surgeon of Burton."

The happy couple were also endowed with a pew in the front row of the gallery in Burton Church from "the estate of



Roger Reports...

from the District & County Councils

Firstly the bad news! The OFSTED inspectors have found that Cumbria's Child Protection Service is inadequate. along with 13 other authorities out of a total of 38 inspected. The inspectors found that Cumbria's social workers must get better at listening to children. that response time could be too slow in right care, and that providing the oversight of teams needs to improved. Reported positive features included highly committed leadership, success in recruiting more workers. no cuts in finance. support of parents through children's centres and schools. The latter was a problem when I was a senior teacher in tough schools, where support agencies like the probation service did not transfer data to the schools.

During my enquiries into homelessness I found that although there are almost no rough sleepers in the district that there are a large number of sofa surfers. They are mainly young people aged 16-22 who are bedding down in haphazard accommodation. Out of 66 people in insecure accommodation the largest groups are 24 young men, 13 lone parents and 10 women. The number presentina of people homeless themselves as in South Lakeland rose from 162 in 2010 to 356

in 2012, which has led to an increased government grant to SLDC of £67,000. A recent report The hidden truth - dying for a home? found that homeless people are more likely to suffer health problems and are 35 times more liable to attempt suicide.

Also on health, a "Call for smoke-free homes and cars in Cumbria" campaign has been launched against passive inhaling by non-smokers. It claims over 80% of cigarette smoke is invisible. Are further limitations to smoking in private places a step too far?

The county has, however, won praise by receiving National Awards for Innovations in Communications and in the Community Investors category for dealing with the 2009-10 flood damage, but I am still pressing for our flooding problems in Neddy Hill and elsewhere to be dealt with! I am also pestering the district to replace the street sign at the corner of Station Lane and Neddy Hill.

On other local matters, following a report entitled "The award of a framework for the procurement of bituminous coated materials" I raised in full council the appalling road surface laid down by the county on Hutton Close and in Burton Park. I was assured that micro-asphalt would not be used in the "wrong sort of weather" as happened here last Autumn. I asked,

that as Burton has a milder climate and lower rainfall than most of Cumbria, could they specify the more appropriate areas? I am still awaiting an answer. But I was assured that the dollops of asphalt scattered down Tan Pits Lane would be removed!

I also objected to threats to reduce opening hours at Household Waste Recycling Centres, which would be contrary to promises made by both ruling parties in their election manifestos.

other Along with councillors, fulminated against decree that а councillors must submit their expenses claims on line. Although I use IT, I argued that an assumption of IT skills implies an educational qualification for councillors, which is contrary to the Representation of the People which. instance, requires an for interpretation service for councillors who do not speak English.

Finally the post of Chief Executive has been advertised at £145,000 pa. This is a drop from the previous CEO's salary of £175,000. Is this good news and will the savings go to improving services especially to those in real need? I'm sure you'll let me know!

Your Neighbours Need You!

Trading Standards are recruiting volunteers for the 'Nominated Neighbour Scheme' which helps householders to feel safe when dealing with unwanted or unexpected callers at home.

Many people already keep an eye out for older or more vulnerable neighbours but this scheme provides a formal mechanism to protect against rogue traders and Trading Standards are calling for more volunteers. The nominated neighbour will often be someone who is already looking out for the householder or a relative and makes the most of our extremely strong community relationships.

Sometimes a bogus trader or doorstep criminal will target the elderly or vulnerable. The Police and Trading Standards work hard to tackle this crime but this scheme helps residents get involved in deterring these criminals.

The scheme works by the vulnerable person being given a card that they hold up to a window or door which advises any unidentified or unexpected caller to go to the address of a 'Nominated Neighbour'. The neighbour will check the caller's identity and if they are genuine return with them and supervise the visit to make sure that nothing untoward takes place and will remain there until the caller has left. In many cases the presence of the scheme's door cards acts as a visible deterrent, and rogue traders may not even bother to call.

If you are uncertain or have doubts about the identity of the caller, or if you wish to report a doorstep crime please contact Cumbria Trading Standards via the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline on 08454 040506 or Cumbria Police on their non-urgent number 101.



and secondly to encourage rural communities to join the fight against crime.

Sergeant John Stephens the of Neighbourhood Policina Team Kendal said, "Rural crime, particularly in the Kirkby Lonsdale and Sedbergh areas, is on the increase. Although the actual figures remain relatively low, the impact and fear of crime are often magnified by the feeling of isolation and helplessness. Operation Stroke ensure police activity is intelligence-led, targeting the road network. criminals and their vehicles known to be active in rural crime."

Cumbria Police statistics show that it is acquisitive crime that is on the increase in rural areas. This includes burglary of farm buildings and theft of farm machinery and vehicles, theft of metal and fuel, and in some cases livestock. Sergeant Stephens added, "Geography and a sparse population work against us in the fight against rural crime. We need to fill this gap by ensuring everyone plays their part. We all have responsibility to look after and secure our own property and simple measures such as removing keys from vehicles when unattended and reporting suspicious activity, at the time, can Kendal Police are currently training Police Volunteers to administer Cumbria Community Messaging and Farm Watch. Hutton Roof Crags Nature Reserve

Orchids. ferns. grasses and both grassland and woodland flowers were enjoyed by a group of local walkers at the nature reserve last month. Cumbria Wildlife Trust's Reserves Andrew Walter, and volunteers Ann and Charles Dale pointed out the many unusual plants and flowers that can be spotted, and we hope the group will head back soon to see what's started flowering in the warmer weather.

The flowers continue to be absolutely lovely on the nature reserve with eyebright, bird's foot trefoil, rockrose, thyme, ladies bedstraw, hawkweeds and dropwort being particularly pretty at the moment. We are seeing more butterflies with this settled spell of weather, great to see more common blues - a real sign of summer - plus large fritillaries are out in force rushing around. Ringlet numbers are building up, a species which has only reached us in the last few years, but now the dark butterfly you see fluttering over the grass is more likely to be a ringlet than a meadow brown.
