Joyce Storer

It was with great sadness that we heard of the death of Joyce Storer, our exneighbour, on 16 August. She was, quite simply, an amazing woman, who we are privileged to have known.

Despite suffering from Parkinson's Disease, she had worked full time, brought up a family of three, been a keen walker and cyclist, and even after John, her husband, suffered a stroke soon after retiring, she cared for him until she was forced, very reluctantly, to have him admitted to a care home. She fought hard to stay in her own home for as long as possible, and never was able to accept the need for the restriction to her personal freedom which the homes were obliged to impose for her own safety.

Joyce had an overwhelmingly positive attitude. She had a great sense of fun; she never criticised others, never stopped doing the things she loved doing. Last year her sister bought her a new pair of walking boots; a few years earlier she had a new bike.

We moved into the house next to Joyce 30 years ago, and have many lasting memories. On several occasions when we were working outside the house, Joyce would come up the drive carrying a tray full of teas, lurching wildly from side to side, due to the Parkinson's, and

Reporting from the Parish Council meeting

As might be expected in August several councillors were unavailable for the parish council meeting. The agenda is also usually a bit thin in August. planning However. this year, applications are coming in thick and fast. Let's hope that this does indeed reflect a return to better economic times. It was the planning application to build two new dwellings at the top of Thornleigh Drive which brought seven members of the public to the meeting. So there was a lengthy Public Forum, during which some of the neighbours told of their concerns about the effect the construction would have on the road surface and drainage, and the increase in traffic using Thornleigh Drive. The architect, also a resident, described how the properties had been designed to have the least possible impact on the neighbours. It was a long and interesting discussion which I think councillors found helpful in their later consideration of the application.

Planning was a bit of a theme for the evening. SLDC have offered to hold planning workshops for parish councils and the public at selected village halls. The parish council will volunteer to host an event in Burton-in-Kendal. certainly a subject which should be of

interest to everyone in the village since the new Local Plan aims for over a hundred new homes in the village. Parish councils, of course, do not make planning decisions. Decisions are **SLDC** made by the **Planning** Committee who delegate uncontroversial matters to the planning officers. The parish council gives its views for consideration by the Planning Committee which takes into account the views of all those who have commented on an application. If residents wish to comment on a planning application they are strongly advised to send their comments directly to SLDC and copy them to the parish council.

In discussing the planning applications, the council did not object to two but object extensions. did to Thornleigh Drive development on the grounds that the planned properties would lie outside the development boundary of the village. The council were also concerned that insufficient consultation had taken place with the residents of Thornleigh Drive who are responsible for the upkeep of the road.

Also on the planning theme, modifications to the Local Plan Land Allocations have been issued. plans for the village have been changed to propose widening of Church Bank Gardens to improve access to the proposed estate on the adjacent field. The proposed modification appears to

make no sense; the problem is believed to be the gradient rather than the width and the council will express a formal objection to the modification as part of its continuing objection to this development.

Away from planning, the council had received letters from the chairman of the school governors and from some residents on the subject of traffic and parking during school-run times. This matter will be discussed fully at the September or October meeting. Any residents with suggestions on how to improve the situation are invited to send them to one of the councillors or the clerk.

For those of you who feel worried by unannounced callers at your home, the county council are promoting a new scheme in which you would direct callers to contact a nominated neighbour if they wish to see you or access your property. If you would find this reassuring pleas contact the clerk for more details. The Age UK village agent will also have details of the scheme.

Finally, I think I must have been out when you called to apply for the job of parish clerk – so please call again! The council agreed to extend the cut off date for applications for the job and, if necessary, to consider advertising the post in the Westmorland Gazette and

The problem with doing this is that applications will come in from all over South Lakeland and the council are keen to get someone from the village if possible. The Vicar is coming...

Work is now well under way on organising the service where our new vicar will be officially licensed by the bishop, and then installed by the archdeacon. The service will be held at St James's on Tuesday 24 September at 7.30pm, and will mark the start of Graham's new ministry here at Burton and Holme. It is with great anticipation that we look forward to his arrival something we have been working towards for almost a year now.

As we draw near to the end of our planning we must remember that God has planned every detail from creation to the return of Jesus. Before Jesus was born in Bethlehem over 2,000 years ago many prophets in the Old Testament foretold his arrival. Likewise, all of the Gospels speak of "a man sent from God whose name was John. Historical Footnote by Roger Bingham

Changing Times - Burton in the 17th Century

The 17th century was both perilous and prosperous for Burton. During the Civil Wars of the 1640s both the forces of Rovalists (Cavaliers) Parliamentarians (Roundheads) crisscrossed the parish. In 1644 Cavaliers, fleeing from being routed at the Battle of Marston Moor, clashed at Dalton with the pursuing Roundheads. Traditionally, they incurred 19 casualties later marked by the 19 trees. In 1651 Charles II, who had been crowned King of Scots following his father's execution in 1649, invaded the district in an attempt to regain his English throne, which was thwarted by his defeat at the Battle of Worcester.

Locally, most upsets occurred in church affairs. Henry Johnson, vicar since 1622, an Anglican and a Royalist, was reported by his new Puritan and Roundhead masters as "having formelie Complyed with ye enemie but have the (Presbyterian) since taken covenant." This did not save his living, for in 1653 he was replaced, in sequence, by parliament men Richard John Thexton and Croft. Browne.

Burton's first Parish Registers date from this period and accordingly the baptism of Elizabeth "ye daughter and Gerard ye sonne of Mr Brown minister of Burton" were recorded, as was the death of his wife Elizabeth Brown in 1662. Along with Anglicans, Roman Catholics were being persecuted and, in 1646, "£50 were sequestered from Sir John Preston papist for the increase of the maintenance of the minister of the parish of Burton." More positively, Burton Grammar School was founded in c.1657 when John Hutton, after bequeathing 40 shillings per annum to the poor, left the residue of his estate to provide a salary for the school master of £5 10s pa.

In 1661, a year after his restoration, Charles II granted the Lord of the Manor, Sir George Middleton of Leighton Hall, the right to hold a market every Tuesday and two fairs at St George's day and on St Bartholomew's day. Another fair was later instituted on Whitsun Monday which was "soon said to be the largest corn market in the County."

An architectural reminder of better times are the 17th century overhanging houses, Chester Terrace and part of the Square House, the Old Grammar School on Church Bank and Dalton Old Hall which are, after the church, Burton's oldest surviving buildings.

Homeshare

Homeshare piloted in Carlisle and Eden in 2010 and was so successful it has funded by Cumbria been County Council for the next two years.

Homeshare is about two people sharing a home. If you have a spare room and want some company, someone to share your day with, help around the home, to make your money go further, or to use your spare room so you don't have to move away from your community; Homeshare could be the answer.

Homeshare involves matching а homeowner or tenant with someone who has a housing need and can little provide а support companionship. Householders are often older people who have developed some support needs or have become isolated about anxious living Homesharers are often younger people, students, or key public service workers

who cannot afford housing where they work.

The homesharer agrees to provide a level of help and support to the householder whilst living in their home for an established period of time. Homeshare is not a regulated service and cannot include the provision of personal care. Homesharers will pay no rent, but usually decide to contribute to household bills, and it may be agreed that other costs such as food will be shared

Roger Reports...

from the District & County Councils

Councils take stock of their affairs in summertime when there are fewer meetings. Demography - meaning who lives where - is the basis on which local government works. Thus a recent survey shows that Burton's electorate is 1205 and is projected to rise to 1270 by 2017. The figures for neighbouring parishes are: Arnside 2072 to 2160; Holme 1212 to 1268; Hutton Roof 183 to 186: Kendal 22653 to 24301: Kirkby Lonsdale 1520 to 1745; and Milnthorpe 1715 to 1772. A proposal to divide Kendal into separate parishes was rejected. The figures for some parishes including Burton will change when the Development Framework (consideration of which has now taken longer than the Second World War) is implemented.

The Electoral Roll arrangements have been changed to a system called Individual Electoral Registration. Under the old procedure householders had to fill in a form, generally in October, of all residents eligible to vote. From 2014 the Department of Work and Pensions will inform SLDC's Electoral Services Manager of all residents who, if there are no changes, will be registered automatically. SLDC will then contact residents who are not registered, while the DWP will deduct names of voters

who have died or moved away. The system is designed to reduce electoral fraud, whereby some householders entered names of non - or even fictitious - residents. In future the possession of a National Insurance number will be the main confirmation of identity.

SLDC has also registered its assets valued at £46.9m, which include 47 car parks, 137 parks and open spaces, 9 cemeteries, 6 depots and 3 sports centres. This portfolio is much reduced from when we had 6,000 council houses, half of which were sold under the Right to Buy, while the rest were transferred (with the tenants' almost unanimous consent) to the private Lakes Housing Company. Though this happened many years ago residents of council-built properties in a neighbouring parish still seem to think that the council should do something about repairs to an access roads which now the joint responsibility individual owners or South Lakes Housing.

We also remain involved with SLDC's longest issue, the former Grange Baths (known officially as The Lido) which was on the agenda at my first council meeting 30 years ago! The latest idea is to transform the listed structure into an open recreation area. Meanwhile the Berners Close pool which took a non-

council trust over ten years to build, but which closed after only five years, has been demolished to make way for residential development.

Thanks to a campaign in which I took part, second homes now pay the full council tax, which brings in an extra £750,000 of which £250,000 can go towards building affordable homes. A recent decision that Barnet council's parking charges were illegal, because the income exceeded the cost of the service, might affect SLDC's share of the Council Tax whose parking income of £2m goes toward the council's £13m expenditure. So if parking charges are forced to go down the Council Tax will go up. Yet, SLDC says it will not increase its tiny share of the Council Tax which is 11% of what householders pay. The new administration of the county council has not promised not to increase its share, which is 74%. The police rate is 13% and the parish precept about 2%. So it seems we will be paying more next year.

Cumbria Police News

There have been no reported crimes in Burton for the past month.

Our Operation for rural areas is Operation Stroke. Operation Stroke is part of the police strategy that Inspector Richard Quinn was appointed to lead on behalf of Cumbria Constabulary. The Swifts of Burton



The swifts have departed for another year, the last ones leaving a little later than the usual date of 5 August. Lucky for them to be flying off to South Africa for the winter!

The number leaving is impossible to say. The highest count was at least 38 on 18 July. This probably included some fledglings. The total number could be higher as they move so quickly and are not all above the village at any one time

A more-accurate estimate can be made from counting nesting sites. Swifts have been seen entering 18 sites in the village this summer. If all of these were nesting sites, that is a total of 36 adults. There are probably more nesting sites out of public view. The adults deliver food to the young at long intervals and swoop in with such speed that they are easily missed.

This year they arrived later, first seen over Burton on 16 May instead of 5 May, but have enjoyed better weather for collecting midges and other small insects to feed their young. After finding their mates and suitable nest sites they gather feathers whilst in flight to make very basic nests on walls beneath the

eaves or in cracks part way up gable walls. This is the only time in their lives that they land, as they sleep, eat and mate on the wing. This year's young will remain airborne for two or three years until they too return to nest, if there is room in the village.

Only five Burton properties are known to hold swifts. These are Manor House, The Royal Hotel, two in Cocking Yard and a cottage in the Post Office block. Their presence depends on the goodwill of the owners, without which there would be no swifts in Burton.

It is possible to create new sites. Leaving access beneath the eaves is the easiest way. As swifts are very loyal to their nesting places, they may not use new sites in the first year or two.

These observations are part of the "Swifts in The Community" project covering South Cumbria and North Lancashire, initiated this year by Peter Moreton and supported by the RSPB. Peter has produced a leaflet which can be obtained from local contacts Jane Phillips, Bryan Yorke or myself.
