



Dear Burton News,

Church Tower Update

It was back in August 2012 that I wrote my first letter to Burton News setting out the problems that had arisen with the church tower. Since then we have had, amongst other things, a teddy bear parachute jump, an open garden, and a quiz, all to raise the money for the repairs.

As a result of a lot of hard work and generosity from within the village. together with grants from various external bodies notably English Heritage, we now have sufficient funds to cover the full cost of the tower repairs. We have also received the required permissions from the various authorities. including planning permission from South Lakeland District Council, and a contractor has now been appointed for the repairs.

The overall work involves, amongst other things, taking down and rebuilding the parapets; masonry repairs; stitching cracks; repointing; repairs to the roof; timber repairs; new liahtnina conductor: renderina limewashing the tower exterior.



The planned start date is the 7 April, i.e. just before Easter, and the overall programme is expected to take 28 weeks. Obviously the finish date may vary a bit depending on the weather etc.

As far as the church building itself is concerned, it is planned to have it open as usual for services, weddings and funerals etc. In addition the churchyard itself will normally be open for people to visit and tend graves. Unfortunately, due to the need to provide secure locations for the builders and their materials, together with parking for their cars and space for deliveries etc, the church car park will have to be closed to non-building traffic. Obviously for occasions such as funerals or weddings etc, special arrangements will be made to cope with any additional traffic. In addition, for a few days at the start of the project, whilst scaffolding is being delivered and erected it may necessary to limit access to churchyard for safety reasons, due to the large amount of vehicle movements that will be required. Also, until such time as a secure area can be erected for the building materials, it may be necessary to lock the church gates at night-time for security reasons.

If any of these restrictions should cause a particular problem please contact the Rev Burrows or any of the wardens, and I'm sure a compromise can be

PC Observations...

Reporting from the Parish Council meeting

The 20 March meeting was a two-parter with the Annual Parish Meeting kicking off at 6.45 pm and the normal monthly Parish Council at 7.30 pm. Invited speaker Emma Nichols supported by Alistair McNeill, Deputy Planning Manager, both from South Lakeland District Council (SLDC) started us off with a short talk about Engagement and Neighbourhood Planning.

Neighbourhood Planning is a new thing stemming from the Government's Localism Act 2011, so very few plans have yet been produced. The idea is that local communities will feel that they can influence where to build new homes, how to protect green spaces and what new buildings will look like. The limitation is that Neighbourhood

Plans cannot conflict with the broader district Local Plans or be used to prevent development included in the Local Plan, such as allocating swathes of land for house building as is the case in Burton.

Producing a Neighbourhood Plan (NP) arduous business. Emma reckoned on a timescale of 12 to 18 months to develop a neighbourhood generate options, vision. submission, consult and refine the draft, organise independent checking and carry out a referendum of the community to check support. SLDC will assist and advise but it is down to the neighbourhood mobilise to community work. and do the Councillors quickly smelled a rat – is it worth it they asked. Even if the community could be mobilised, planners at district level, really pay any attention to a NP? Getting any kind of response from district planners is hard enough - why would local planners change the habits of a lifetime and pay any attention to a NP? Emma did her best to give a positive slant on the process – a new opportunity for neighbourhoods to exercise control at a local level, a chance to be innovative about car parking, sustaining green areas etc. Councillors were sceptical and not only because the NP might just disappear into the Local Planning ether, but also because they know how hard it

is to engage the community to commit to such a planning exercise.

Councillors asked for this column to canvas support for the idea of a NP within Burton. Do you feel strongly enough to get involved in some way about a vision for Burton over the next 5, 10, 20 years? Ring John Mackness on 781285 if you do and he will take the message about your interest to the next council meeting.

PC Chairman Mike Taylor then gave a short Annual Statement quoting Spike Milligan – nothing happened for a long time and then nothing happened again. Yet the council has had some good successes in the year, such as sorting drainage problems, introducing monitoring Clawthorpe, speed at sensitively with dealing an everincreasing number planning of daffodil applications, planting getting involved in the very initial stages Neighbourhood Planning. frustrations have been connected with affairs beyond PC control, such as the Royal Hotel development saga, the Local Plan house building allocation around Church Bank Gardens. and school car-parking. Thanks were given to the now retired ex-Clerk Peter Smith and renewed welcome given to new Clerk Jane Johnson.

The normal PC meeting began on time at 7.30pm as usual, with a full turn out of councillors. A member of the public asked about the need to plant a Royal Oak Sapling which, initially intended as commemoration for the Queen's Jubilee, was still in a pot in her greenhouse. No-one knows what to do with it. Planning applications – Church renovation, outline planning for a house in the garden of The Old Vicarage approved. Bank balances considered, invoices paid, grass and fallen tree quotes discussed. cost cuttina system for one-way signage at Memorial Hall car park approved.

The slightly trimmed list of Outstanding Action items threw up the delay in getting a historic Westmorland County sign put up. Cumbria County Council (CCC) want £345 to put up a pole on which the sign (already costing £398) will be fixed. Councillors are very keen on getting good value, so guotations for these kind of things have to be realistic. CCC estimates often seem hugely inflated so there was a good deal of angst voiced at this estimate – it was deferred Councillor again. Hopwood reported that the Quarry was going to ask for a 20-year extension in a forthcoming planning review exercise, which could open up issues about lorries coming through Burton, dust pollution etc. Something to look out for as was the lack of any sign of money

from a £7 million levy on Cumbria Quarries, 20% of which is due to be distributed to local communities. SHAPING THE STONES

What could be more exhilarating than to stand for six hours two days running, in an old farmyard on the eastern slope of the Usk valley, and carve a chunk of limestone into any shape you choose, while buzzards mew high above? Many things could, perhaps. The fact is that I'd always wanted to work in stone. An old friend, Dick Renshaw, has been a professional sculptor in south Wales for many years. The autumn he was running a two-day course in stone carving, so I seized the chance.

The eight of us stand at sturdy wooden tables and begin to use our tools: chisels (various breadths). rasps (various), claws (various), a point, and of course a hammer - with a round head because it makes a clean strike easier. What to make? what is possible with these chunks of white limestone as big as cushions, from Lincolnshire and Cotswolds? What will your imagination throw up? One class member is putting finishing touches to a piece she started in July: a snake writhing round itself and through a 4inch hole. It's well carved, a striking image, and its maker (a retired biologist from Brazil) is surprised when I enthuse about it.

We all roam about during breathers,

sizing up each others' work. Another member is rounding out the dumpy back of a hedgehog, Dick advises her hollow out the forehead more between bristles and snout. By the end of the day she's gone off hedgehogs, although they fascinate her and she looks often at a little wooden one which she keeps in her pocket. Another member (an engineer) is carving an idol face, broad nose, bulging eyes, fleshy lips. It's like Inca figures I've seen in cave temples in Peru. He got the idea 'from some things I saw in Africa'. His wife is also doing a face. Her limestone has a very hard vein of calcite running through it. It resists her chisel and this gives rise to a supercilious eyebrow and a Cubist slanting mouth. She carves one eye closed and calls the work 'Wink' .

Just one member is making something practical: a brick-shaped chunk with a leaf on top and an oblong aperture in the back. This will take a key and the 'brick' will sit on her doorstep, neatly hiding the key. Carving the opening exactly rectangular isn't easy, nor is fitting in the piece for the sill, which is fixed on with stone-glue.

Only one of us creates an abstract pattern. On the Saturday, a day for trying things out, I incise (or 'scribe') a three-clawed shape I saw two years ago on a rockface in Patterdale, presumably scraped out by a glacier.

On the Sunday - feeling (a little) less at sea with the whole thing - I carve a swift, in shallow relief, and grind away for an hour or two with the narrowest rasp (borrowed from the hedgehog woman) to get as near as I can to the slim blades of its wings.

People finish up simmering with ideas of more things they'd like to make. 'A mermaid!' says the engineer. Really? with all those scales, and the hair, and the fishy tail?! For me, I come away with refreshed respect for the sheer hard resistance of the stone - how do they work with granite? renewed recognition (familiar from working in my own medium, words) of the tantalising gap between what is clear and vivid in your head and what can actually create on unspoiled page (or slab, or canvas) which is waiting for you.

Roger Reports... from the District & County Councils

The budget process for 2014-15 in Cumbria County and South Lakeland District Councils, and The Police and Crime Commission have now been completed without any of the feared Council Tax. Some increased in increase have been made in Parish Councils' precepts so that there are slight variations in charges to tax payers around the district. The annual rates for Burton are: Bands:- A £1,044.88; B £1,219.03; C £1,393.17; £1,567.32; E £1,915.61 £2,612.20; H £3,134.64. Comparative figures for Band D in neighbouring villages are: Beetham £ £1,568.84; £1,573.92: Heversham Holme £1.580.91; Hutton Roof £1,552.41; Milnthorpe £1,575.75; Kirkby Lonsdale £1,594.53.

The county's budget will save £24.4m in 2014-15 and CCC will need to save another £88m by 2017, on top of savings of £88m achieved since 2010. Although 95% of the county's budget was agreed by all parties the debate lasting from 11am to 5.30pm was one of the longest ever. The contentious parts in the Labour/Liberal Democrat administration's proposals centred on the removal of travel subsidies which could lead to cuts in many rural buses. Also opposed was a change in

students' travel grants, which means that VI formers and others will have to pay £1,400 pa before they get a grant and not after paying £350 as now. It argued that this was was discrimination against rural bus users. including senior citizens who have vouchers, and 16-19 year olds who use the A2BNow Card. Country people like commuters and shoppers might also be hit by the introduction of on-street parking charge in towns like Kendal. The Conservative opposition's budget suggestion of cutting uniform grants to needy school pupils on the grounds, it was contended, that the relief of poverty including clothing was covered by the social benefits was rejected as being heartless; while a 5% increase in other charges in order to 'save the buses' was considered to be unfair to the population as a whole and might harm the economy. Some feared savings did not occur - so threatened services like the second fire engines at Kendal and elsewhere, and the Home Accident Reduction Team (HART) visits to vulnerable householders and the testing of electric blankets (which I campaigned for) will continue.

Also, there are no major cuts in library opening hours or, at this stage anyway, to our library van. Kendal Archives office, however, will close on Mondays. Some relief of up to £1,000 is being given to businesses with a rateable value of less than £50,000. These will

include most shops including charity shops, petrol stations, garden centres, takeaways and hairdressing and beauty services - but I don't know if Milnthorpe's Tattoo Parlour will be eligible!

Despite all the rain our highways workers have been very busy and the village street pavement has been partly resurfaced, the A6070 flood abatement work and surfacing near the quarry and at Deerslet will be going ahead, and a huge drainage pipe (which I saw unloaded) has been installed at Neddy Hill which hopefully should end flooding there. I am monitoring other flood risk points like at The Creamery and at Clawthorpe.

Plans to repair the verges on Moss Lane have been postponed. Pot holes remain a major problem and on going my rounds in early March I even received complaints about the state of the A6 road in Carnforth but that's "Nowt to do with me." Happily, casualties Cumbria's overall road dropped from 2,029 in 2009 to 1,629 in 2013 but fatalities were 23 in 2009, 30 in 2010, 2011 2012 and 28 in 2013.

Finally, no one took up my request for a Plain English course for "officers" so that the county's council staff magazine, (whose cost I am questioning), includes that "last year our changing our culture behaviours have engaged employees to build and embed these behaviours across the whole organisation bringing them to life." We'll see!

Historical Footnote...

... by Roger Bingham

SPRINGTIME IN BURTON - 65 YEARS AGO...

"Here in early spring there is a time when the hazel catkins are hanging and yellow, but still not flicking their pollen about. The sky is often grey, and the grass still dark and the bracken brown, so the catkins glow with a pale light of their own. Later, it is the wild cherry, which is the handsome tree, blue-white, the colour of skimmed milk, above the still-brown bracken." So wrote, the Cumbrian poet Norman Nicholson about our area in his "Cumberland and Westmorland" (of 1949). He was "fond of Burton which was from the start, a road based village and is therefore, able to stand up to modern traffic intrusion. The little stage-set of a village square is, in fact laid out, plumb and obvious to catch the eye of the roaduser. There are gardens sheltered by fat walls, often piled high with limestone water worn sculptures, miniature Henry Moores and Barbara Hepworths matted with flowering white and purple rock."

Norman was both down to earth and romantic while musing about, what before the building of the M6, was Burton's main man made feature - the

the Lancaster-Kendal canal. passes through the limestone country by Carnforth and Burton into the Bela valley in a sort of terrace at the foot of the Hutton Roof hills, which are bare as teeth above it, but the fields round about are green and gentle. The water is clear, not muddy; the sides are bare but for reeds and water dropwort and ragwort. Very frequently there are limestone bridges, humped and tubby, like a fat boy with legs apart for leapfrog. Sometimes one can see half a dozen other bridges while planted besides the water are rows of firs and larches dark green against the grey of the bridges. Across the valley are low furry hills around Beetham and Milnthorpe and the sky is wider here and the clouds are the colour of the stone. The canal is not much used now. and might have been demolished had it not been of value to farmers for draining. I think that most people would be sorry to lose it, except, perhaps for the mothers of young children."

Norman also noticed that amongst the verdant scenery were industries like minerals, milk, wood and wool which you would expect, but some are surprising; delectable Beetham makes paper and Burton and Holme make carpets. This is not poetic licence for the Holme Mills Carpet works straggled the parish boundary between Burton and Holme.
