# PC Observations...

Reporting from the Parish Council meeting

#### A casual vacancy?

The April 17<sup>th</sup> meeting brought several apologies absence. for and resignation as Ian Hunt resigned to set up the intriguing prospect of a "casual vacancy." Thoughts of J.K. Rowling's recent book with that title came to mind but although a member of the public said that an election could be held if 10 members of the community requested it, councillors looked on with disbelief that there might be 10 people interested enough to go this far. If you are interested in filling this casual vacancy, more information can be found on the Parish Council Notice Board [at the Memorial Hall] and at the local shop, but act fast as you only have until the end of the first week in May to put forward your candidacy.

#### **Announcements from the Chairman**

Chairman Mike Taylor ran through the police report (two minor road accidents, a speed check and an unwelcome door to door salesman) and drew attention to the forthcoming (May 22<sup>nd</sup>) MEP election in Burton. He also thanked Charis Twist for her valiant efforts to tidy up the small garden at the Tanpits Lane/Neddy Hill junction. Charis was

present and thanked villagers who have volunteered to help her throughout the year with weeding and maintenance. Mike also said that we should look out for new road signs around the village but lamented the lack of clear road markings around the Moss Lane junction near Storth Machinery - "an accident is bound to happen" warned. Mike also drew attention to the new one-way flow system for cars at Memorial Hall which the George Isherwood has been leading for the Council. It will take some time to settle down and No Entry signs might be needed to remind visitors that the north end of the car park is now no entry.

#### Dog fouling

Dog fouling is a continual problem. Some villagers are not content with leaving their dog's business on the pavement; they are apparently lobbing bits of dog poo into peoples' gardens! £75 spot fines can now be issued to offenders which apply to fouling of "land in the open air which the public are entitled or permitted to have access." John Barwell is Neighbourhood Enforcement Officer at South Lakeland District Council and his "enforcement team" will be coming to Burton over the coming weeks to take appropriate action. You have been warned. Burton Councillor Moira Rowley offered to work with John and members of the local community to weed out offenders

# **Burton W.I. NEWS**



# The Talking Newspaper for Visually Impaired People

Having a relative who is partially sighted I know only too well the frustration of not being able to see well enough to read, so when I discovered that the local weekly Westmorland Gazette comes in a talking newspaper version it became a welcome addition to our weekly lives.

The arrival of the bright yellow envelope each Saturday has become one of the highlights of the week for Mum, and she enjoys being able to catch up with all the news and happenings in the area courtesy of this great free service. John Barker, Chair of the South Lakes Talking Newspaper, has written a short piece for Burton News about his team and their work... this is what he said:

The South Lakes Talking Newspaper has been in existence since 1974 and its aim is to bring local news to those suffering from visual impairment who find it impossible or difficult to read a newspaper. What the Talking Newspaper does is to take extracts from the Westmorland Gazette which are recorded and sent out on memory sticks on a weekly basis to its listeners.

For many years cassette tapes were in use, but in 2008 the change was made to digital and the recording is now made

onto USB memory sticks. These are sent out through the GPO's Articles for the Blind Freepost service. When clients have finished listening, they return the memory stick in the special wallet provided.

Each issue contains a News section and a Magazine section, both about 45 minutes long. The Magazine section has mainly items of general interest and may include items on food and drink, gardening, nostalgia pieces and so on, so there is plenty of variety.

The service is entirely free, including the supply of the player. The player is very easy to use and one of the volunteers will take one to the new listener's home to explain how it works. The Talking Newspaper has over 60 unpaid volunteers who work on a rota basis, producing the Westmorland Gazette in this form throughout the year.

The Talking Newspaper is highly valued by its regular listeners who come from all over South Lakeland.

# Vícar's Letter...

## Come In or Keep Out?

"Can I come to church?" someone once asked me. "What do you mean?" I replied. "Is it alright for anyone to just turn up?" I was surprised. I had not guessed that anyone would think they needed permission to come to their local church. But I suppose we might wonder if it is alright to "just turn up" at the tennis club, the auction centre or to a council meeting, and perhaps the church seems similar — a club with uncertain entry conditions.

First let me assure you. If you came to any service in the village church someone would greet you, make sure that you had somewhere to sit and answer any questions you had. Our services are straightforward and we expect that there will always be some present who are "just looking." If you brought children they would be welcome too, there are areas in the church that you could use if your child became restless, and at some services there would be a group for them to join.

"But," you may ask, "Would I be welcome at a deeper level? Would I feel awkward because I don't believe the things that you all believe? Would I not fit in because my marriage was a disaster or because I've not bothered with church for years?"

How would Jesus have received you? He was well-known as a friend to all kinds of people. Jesus had meals with the rich and powerful, but he also associated freely with disreputables. He was ready to welcome anyone, but he never left people in any doubt that they had to come on his terms. The well-off were told to stop depending on their wealth. Swindlers realised they had to

pay back what they had taken. Adulterers had to change. Strong men were afraid in his presence.

And Jesus still welcomes people into His church in exactly the same way. His welcome is genuinely and freely extended to all. You are not disqualified by anything you have thought or done because he can deal with that, but Jesus still insists you must come on his terms. He must have the right to decide what you will or won't do from now on.

## Historical Footnote...

... by Roger Bingham

### **BURTON'S D-DAY SUMMER**

70 years ago, during the Summer of 1944, the world at war waited for, and then watched the progress of the D-Day invasion of Normandy. judging by the lack of local reports, Britain's supreme Second World War passed Burton by. September the village's only D-Day campaign casualty was Sergeant Lewis Robinson, an old Heversham Grammar School boy, who was "gravely ill after his skull was broken while serving in the Tank Corps in Northern France." Meanwhile, another Burton serviceman, Corporal F A Ellis married in Dundee a Women's Auxiliary Air Force member, Gladys C Scott, who, unusually for wartime, had a white wedding "featuring a figured satin gown and veil."

The assault on the London area, just after D-Day, by German flying bombs and rockets led to 1,000 south country evacuees coming to south Westmorland. Their arrival imposed extra pressure on food supplies. 5,000 meals were immediately prepared at emergency feeding centres in Kendal. At the "Burton and Holme Food Office in Holme Parish Room" long queues formed during the annual distribution of

new ration books, while officers dealt with newcomers who had lost their identity cards which they had to show before they could get a ration book. To eke out scanty supplies the Women's Institute staged а green salad competition won by Mrs Hayton, and publicised frugal recipes for vegetable pot roast, and potato, carrot and dripping burgers. The WI ladies also unravelled old garments to provide white wool for a collection "for vests for children in occupied Europe" organised by the Honourable Mrs Hornvold-Strickland of Sizergh Castle. But, no information was given as to how the children would get their underwear! Supervised by Mrs Kendal the WI also turned hundredweights of local soft fruit into jam. For refreshment they might have benefitted by a special offer of "Brooke Bond tea at 1/7 a lb, enough for 4 (weekly) rations."

A good harvest, especially of barley, was safeguarded when local land girls killed 199 rats in "Rat Week." During August an outbreak of Foot and Mouth Disease at Bolton le Sands led to restrictions in stock movements. were no local winners Hawkshead and Cartmel Shows, which went ahead, although Burton Show had been suspended "for the duration." Sadly the farming community lost a leading member when Mr Haygarth, who had lived all his life at

At Hutton Roof, farmer Ernest John Read was fined £15 for missing a Home Guard parade although he had pleaded that he was working a 90 hour week, had a sick wife and had not received notice about the change of time for the parade.

Weekly war effort fund-raising events included a Young Farmers' Red Cross Dance, a Brains Trust, Rural Pennies Collections, a Salute the Soldiers entertainment, and Whist Drives galore, while Morewood School's children raised £5:10s for Lancaster Royal Infirmary.

At both Whitsuntide and August Bank Holidays local hotels were booked up. Although petrol restrictions made "the roads strangely empty of cars", buses were packed out taking trippers to Morecambe where they could see George Roby in "Sailor George" and listen to "Henry Hall and his Orchestra." Regrettably five children aged between 8-13 were caught stealing ground sheets and sheaf knives from holiday makers' tents pitched on Farleton Knott. Other youngsters enjoyed "thrilling tussles" at the August sports in Dalton Park, while adults went to "a well-attended dance organised by the War Memorial Hall executive."

As summer ended it was announced that street lighting would be switched on as soon as "wartime mischief damage" had been repaired. Moreover, the Home Guard would be "stood down" in December. Brighter times were on the way.





From the September 2014 issue we changed to a new printing service, which has resulted in a much better standard of image reproduction overall, in addition to being slightly less expensive than the previous printer for more pages per copy!

We have once more retained the services of our Auditor, Nigel Taylor, whose guidance and support for the Treasurer and the Committee has been invaluable, and for this we thank him.

All issues were 32 pages except Feb (24 pages) and March & April (28 pages), which makes for a good balance of copy and adverts, with the December issue including January events.

We are fortunate to have retained our regular columns by Roger Bingham (Roger Reports. and Historical Footnote) and a monthly Letter from the Vicar Graham Burrows, Edward Ellis took excellent photos some accompany Outdoors, and we have had photos from George Robinson, the late Frank Walton, Mark Ellis, Alex Driver, David Mills, Charlie Dobson, Charis Twist and others to accompany various articles.

Throughout the year BN has offered extensive support and coverage of two major fund-raising campaigns within the village: the Wheels for Alex Campaign

We have carried regular news & events listings from the Memorial Hall, Pre-School, Boys' Brigade, the Historical Society, the Photographic Society, the First Responders, Outdoor Bowls, & BADS. Helena Nixon has sent in a report from the W.I. each month, and we have had info from Morewood School, Cumbria Police, the NSPCC. Cumbria Wildlife Trust, Holme Park Quarry Local Nature Reserve, and AgeUK. Charis Twist provided a Village People article on Sue Woodburn and a Village Places article on Burton Morewood School. We have covered the regular big village events such as the Daffodil and Onion Children's Sports Day, the 10K and Fun Run, and the two art and craft events. Standalone articles included Paul Rossi (Rossi on the Radio): (Cinderbarrow Railway); Kath Hayhurst (Village Signs); and Reg Hesketh (The Swifts of Burton).

The Diary and Events listing are still receiving notices for inclusion well in advance of events, which we are sure is helpful for forward planning by many villagers. We continue to include some local societies who meet outside of Burton but who have village members, and we have also continued to include



some events at nearby venues such as the Heron Theatre at Beetham. Several societies and groups have made a donation to BN as a thank you for including their regular events in the listings, and those donations have been much appreciated. Meanwhile, public donations received in 2013 were slightly down on those in 2012 but, encouragingly, the number of donors rose from 156 in 2012 to 194 in 2013.

At the year end we had 42 advertisers, and have an advertising waiting list of 10. Adverts remain a standard 1/8 page with one remaining 1/4 page exception and one 1/6 of a page.

Finally, we'd like to thank all our columnists. our auditor. the members of the Committee who give help and advice to us as Editors, and for all the work they do in writing articles, keeping minutes, managing the advertisers and the money, and in getting the magazine distributed. A big thank you to our team of distributors who turn out come rain or shine to deliver the News. To our advertisers. and to those who support our annual appeal for donations, we owe a huge thank you: individuals, groups, events, and local businesses who financially support the ongoing provision of Burton News. And lastly but not least, to Gill and Akis in the newsagents who have carried on with being our collection point for copy for each issue. They also pass on copies to more remote villagers for us, sell BN in the shop, and hold the donation box for our annual appeal. Thank you to you all!

# Roger Reports... from the District & County Councils

Three months after the budgets both the county and district councils are still engulfed in trying to stretch reduced to provide most of our incomes services. On the county council the Conservative/Labour coalition 2012 and the Labour/Liberal Democrat administration since made savings of £88m. By 2018 an equivalent reduction of £196.9m will have to be made starting with a saving for £34.7m for 2015-16. This is not an easy task as all councillors have their own strong personal concerns which in my case are libraries - and the library van, home safety and rural buses.

All of us would be against any cuts in highways - although despite what everyone says - pot hole repairs are now much quicker and we've had antiflooding measures at Neddy Hill and elsewhere completed. Also I've had the SLDC officer out to fix the site for the Station Lane sign which has been missing for two years - or more. I am currently much involved with getting the Crooklands canal bridge repaired, as if it is closed traffic problems could spread all over - even to Burton. I am told that the roundabout at the Auction Mart entrance on the A6070 (which most of us wanted at the planning stage, and then weren't sure whether

we needed it when it was not put in immediately) will now be provided, as the Auction Mart's business is "leaping ahead." Thanks partly to savings on major road gritting, due to the milder winter, the South Area budget has a surplus of £300,000 which will carried forward. I have pressed for white lining, and for more postponed work on Moss Lane to be considered, in addition to major works on the A6070 by the quarry and at Deerslet.

I am also glad that a further £8,000 has been allocated to young persons' transport to cover the shortfall funding for the A2BNow card which had 165 users from our area, more than any We moreover. are. subsidising the Sandgate Hydrotherapy Pool in Kendal for £33,000 pa. A change is being made in the county's grants for Special Educational Needs (SEN) which will only be made where there are SEN pupils. Previously all schools got a small SEN grant even if they had no SEN pupils. Now all statemented pupils will get a flat rate of £3,000 per pupil with extra sums for further requirements. remain. however, concerned about reported inadequate provision by the child and adolescent mental health service and for adults and children with sensory disablement especially the deaf blind.

One of the district council's savings is

contributing to an improvement, as SLDC is proposing to save £77,000 by cutting out green bin collections from January to April (so I will have to take my Christmas tree to the tip) and to use the money to extend recycling to include plastic and small electrical goods like lap-tops but not freezers. Eventually this could save £250,000 in land fill charges: we'll see!

SLDC has postponed the introduction of on-street parking charges in Kendal and the big towns following protests from traders, rural commuters and shoppers.

Personally I have been very busy on two task and finish groups. One for the district council is on litter problems. Generally we have found that our villages and main market town streets are quite good but the problem areas are some housing estates and, as we all may have noticed when the verges and hedges are bare in March, along main roads and in lay-bys. Because the roads lack pavements we cannot use persons serving community punishment orders - who are often put to work on coned-off sections of the M6 - so its likely to remain a problem until ALL motorists learn the meaning of 'Take Your Litter Home' notices.

The county T&F group concerns the care of elderly people, which ties in with my role as Older Persons' Champion to
