PC Observations...

Reporting from the Parish Council meeting

At the Annual Parish Council Meeting on 15 May, Mike Taylor and Alan Wren were re-elected as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively for 2014/15. Representatives of the PC were also appointed to various village organisations - Burton Recreational Trust, Burton Education Foundation, Local Area Partnership, Memorial Hall Committee, Quarry Liaison Committee, School Governors and the Fireworks Working Group. Further responsibilities were assigned for Boon Town Playing Ground. Lengthsman Administrator, Plain Quarry, Highways and the Voluntary Car Scheme. It's an arduous job being a councillor!

A member of the public – Eric Fisher – was very concerned about speeding on the A6070 around Church Bank. Although recent speed monitoring by the police has reported average speed through Burton as 27mph, Mr Fisher reported instances of much higher speeds leading up to the corner near the church. 'Someone is going to get killed!' he said. Councillors were not supporting Mr Fisher's keen on suggestion that he be trained to use a hand-held speed camera but they did offer to report the situation to the Police

and see what other traffic calming measures might be possible on this stretch of road.

Councillors wanted an acknowledgement of Ian Hunt's service to the council to appear in the Burton lan resigned in April and this News. acknowledgement dulv appears. Thanks Ian! The casual vacancy left by lan's departure will be filled by cooption. Members of the public are invited to call Parish Clerk Jane Johnson, telephone 784836 (or any councillor they know) to discuss the vacancy by 17 June latest as the cooption itself will take place at the next PC meetina on 19 June. The application involves writing a covering letter describing what the prospective councillor will bring to the council and why they want to serve.

Other matters included:

• Dog poo being left in plastic bags around the village; very unpleasant. Councillor Moira Rowley (784874) is collecting reports.

• Roger Bingham is celebrating 30 years' service to local parish councils this year. He reported warnings of future county council cuts to some services in the coming year.

• Francis Mason-Hornby reported that the Dalton Crag cuckoo has returned.

• The Burton Jubilee Walks leaflets are to be reprinted, thanks to sponsorship



from Neil and Ann at the Kings Arms and Thwaites Brewery.

• Reports of nuisance from children playing football in the street at Boon Town have been received despite the playing fields being available.

• Parking in St. James' Drive is causing a safety hazard and will be reported to the Police.

• The Westmorland sign at the county boundary will go ahead.

• The Annual Governance Statement was signed, accounts approved, payments authorised, and lengthsman's logs read as usual. The list of outstanding actions is steadily diminishing which is a healthy sign.

The Daffodil Show at the Kings Arms

Daffodil Show members and helpers gathered early in the day to set up for this year's Show. With the later date than last year, almost by a month, we didn't experience the sub-zero temperatures of 2013 and most were in shirt sleeves as we busied ourselves getting ready for entries.

Despite the later date a healthy crop of daffodils were entered with Brownie, Carrie Shaw, winning the single and 9 daffodil classes and Mike Earl the 3 daffs section. The later date and mild spring has encouraged strong growth amongst the rhubarb, with the best selection of exhibits for a number of years. Roy Bainbridge collected 1st with his 6 matching stalks of rhubarb.

Steve and Rachel Mealor's entries continue to impress the judges, with them collecting 4 firsts in the classes they entered. This year the committee took the decision to try a new class, of a jar of home-made jam. This saw 6 entries, with Charis Twist collecting 1st and 2nd for her jam making skills.

The children's classes didn't see a great number of entries but those that did were rewarded for their efforts with a Easter egg. Erin Still, 2013 Rose Queen, judged the children's entries, with Amy and Jessica Graham collecting 5 eggs between them for their items made of wood, a topical crown of thorns and a crucifix, Easter pictures and decorated eggs. Carrie Shaw, Freya and Thomas Morphet collected a similar number of chocolate eggs for their creative works.

In the Guides, Brownies and Rainbows classes Emily Pope, Tegan Richardson and Freya Morphet collected 1st prizes

for their decorated chocolate egg, papier-mâché egg and decorated felt egg respectively.

The judges for the remaining classes were Sue and Alan Humphreys, and after their deliberations, place tickets were allotted and the show results announced the auction of promises and raffle commenced.

Healthy bidding, encouraged by the ever-enthusiastic and natural auctioneer Neil Shaw. saw those present raise an impressive total of just over £1600. This money will subsidise the various activities the local Guides, Brownies and Rainbows get involved in, and we would like to thank all those who contributed and participated in this vear's show.

We would especially like to thank the judges, Sue and Alan Humphreys and Erin Still, for their considerate and impartial judging and all those, new and regulars, who continue to dig deep in order to make the show a success.

I chose the Coniston marathon as Coniston holds a special place in my family's heart. We regularly visit the area and at least once a year go camping for a week and meet up with a number of our closest friends.

Heart-breaking for everyone who knew him, one of our best, closest friends, Ged died suddenly two years ago at 36 years old. He was supposed to meet us that week to camp at Coniston, but didn't turn up. We were told he had died in his sleep. We were devastated. We found out it was due to his heart.

As a cardiac (heart) nurse I thought that if I was going to do such a tough challenge, first it had to be in Coniston to remember Ged, and I had to do it to help raise money for patients who have heart problems.

As I work in the Morecambe Bay cardiac centre in Westmorland General Hospital dealing with patients with these such problems. I thought why not



raise money for the heart centre that I know helps many patients in Cumbria. Without the centre being in Kendal, many patients would have to travel long costly distances for their diagnosis. Vícar's Letter...

Can they deliver?

Many people would say that they don't pray. But you do! You might not pray to God but "pray" doesn't necessarily mean asking God for something.

It sounds archaic now, but *"I pray thee*" was once a common way of saying "I beg you" or "please." To pray was to make an earnest request of someone, *"I pray thee, gentle mortal, sing again.*" (Titania to Bottom.)

You and I have things that we long for – health, contentment, success in life, the appreciation of other people, certainty about the future, and to be loved by someone who matters to us.

And, unless we are in the depths of despair, we all think that we know who or what is likely to give us these things - wife, husband, parent, child, the government, a house improvement, an exam pass or a new club joined. These are some of the people or things we "pray" to. We might not speak any word or prayer to them but we have an expectation that they will provide, we pin our hopes on them, we devote ourselves to them and we will be disappointed if they let us down. Or, if we think we are self-made, we will be angry at ourselves when we can't answer our own prayers.

Who you pray to, or look to, reveals what you believe about ultimate reality. When a man prays to God in the name of Jesus, he is denying that any of the things he longs for come ultimately from the government, another person, a comfortable house or anything else in this world. He is denying that he himself can provide what he most wants. To pray like this is to reveal your conviction that the Father of our Lord Jesus is the creator and source of every good thing and ultimately the only one who can answer the prayer, and provide what you long for at the deepest level.

The presence of the church of Jesus Christ in the village raises a question – not "do you pray?" but "who or what are you praying to, and can they deliver what you are hoping for?"

Historical Footnote...

... by Roger Bingham

BURTON MOREWOOD SCHOOL 100 YEARS AGO

The records kept by the head teacher of Morewood School between 1914-19 barely hint at the Great War. Just as the first shots were being fired at Sarajevo in 1914 the school was damned with faint praise in an inspector's report. "This little school is well-staffed and as the children are naturally bright there should be little difficulty in the work reaching distinctly high level. а However. rather more thought in planning and preparing of the work beforehand will be necessary. It would be advisable to keep records of the ground covered. The children read fluently and with intelligence; their handwriting is good, though Standard II might reasonably be expected to express themselves more freely and show more imagination. Arithmetic is the weakest subject though most childrren know and understand their tables and perform simple mental calculations with fair success. of the girls' Extending the scope needlework and the handwork is desired."

The school's premises received the biggest criticism, "The small classroom has been painted out but is badly ventilated. Two more inlets should be fixed and more windows need to open. The stove in the main room is worn out. A skylight has been inserted in the porch which is almost too small for the reduced number of 29 children now attending."

Curricluar refrences include the receipt of county council "lending books" like Highroads History, to Chambers Effective Readers. The Far East: China and Japan, and a gift from Dr Paget-Tomlinson to each child in Standards I and II of a copy of Kindness to all Created Things. Except in the week before the annual trip to Morecambe, attendance was often poor and in September 1918 seventeen pupils were "absent on account of heavy rain." There was a severe whooping cough outbreak in 1916 and 1917. Marjorie Dobson was "suffering from cholera." The only specific references to the war were the closure of the school for three separate days to save fuel, a "babies' daffodil ramble" to collect flowers for wounded soldiers' the hospital in Kendal, and the start of a school warsvings branch just six weeks before the conflict ended. Greater attention was paid to the 1918 influenza epidemic which caused as many casualities as had the war. Two victims were buried in





the week of the Armistice, and when Miss Jones, the infants' mistress, and eleven pupils went down with it the school was closed on the 26 November until the New Year.


05/05 Highway disruption. It was reported to us that a vehicle had hit a 30mph speed limit sign. No vehicle at scene. No further damage.





Roger Reports... from the District & County Councils

When, just over 30 years ago, I was elected as your district councillor my first pledge was to support the use of plain English in council documents. Unfortunately, my constant guibbles have failed, judging by the following communication: "The new landscape for the service is a more locally based and socially interactive service working closely with neighbourhood community groups, in this way it would become a function. sustainable communitv allowing greater flexibility and be more responsive to local needs."

The "interactive service" is Community Meals - generally known as "Meals on Wheels" which has declined from its hey-day in the 1970s, partly because of the availability of a choice of ready and home care schemes. Thus in 2010, 96,000 meals were delivered in the county. This has now declined to 30,000, with less than 200 people receiving a meal from the county's inhouse service. Many delivered meals now come from schools, including 60 per day provided by the excellent catering service at Queen Elizabeth School, which offers a choice of menu (so it's not always "fish on Fridays") including during the school holidays. The basic cost is about £3.60.



In order to meet public needs (if not their language skills) SLDC has done a SWAT Analysis. Our strengths include diverse and resilient economy, several significant internationally employers, good qualification profile (especially in Lakeland) and "significant South environmental assets" like the National Parks. Opportunities include improving economic conditions with a rise in household spending, growing hiah value manufacturing, IT services and tourism and, nearer home for us: exploiting the M6 corridor and higher speed broadband roll out. Our weaknesses involve pockets of high "business unemployment, vouth deaths" exceeding "births", patchy broadband coverage, and affordability of housing. The biggest threats are squeezing household further in decline in working spending, ade population, struggling exports to the euro-zone, and increased vacant premises in town centres.

Regarding housing the impact of second homes in Cumbria has been assessed. In the central lakes 20% of houses are second homes and the house price averages £317,458. With an average income of £31,207 the income to house price ratio is 10.17 compared to a county ratio of 5.44. Burton's ratio is probably higher than the county average owing to the generally high quality of property and travel opportunities for aood



Call Gary on 01524 782857 &/or visit www.geccleaningservices.com communities. I don't have the up-todate figures but I would judge that less than 10% of Burton's houses are second homes.

Meanwhile, the bulldozers are moving in on Phase 1 sites made available after SLDC's Local Development Framework was approved. The key areas are Kendal Parks with 200 dwellings: Underbarrow Rd, Kendal -153; Stainbank, Kendal - 189; South and East Milnthorpe - 155; Croftlands Ulverston - 747; Swarthmoor - 161; and Kendal Rd, Kirkby Lonsdale - 80. But, detailed planning as at Burton, consents must still be obtained. A gleam of good news is that the county council might be having a rethink about its controversial budget proposal to introduce on-street parking charges. We'll see!






