PC Observations...

Reporting from the Parish Council meeting

It was almost a 'full-house' of Councillors for the monthly meeting on July 17th and Chairman Mike Taylor warmly welcomed the new recruit – Peter Smith – who was co-opted at the June meeting.

Burton is hardly a hotbed of crime but the Police Report called attention to a slim grey haired man seen in the village, acting suspiciously. Since most of Burton's men are grey haired, it was fortunate that the rider 'slim' was added to reduce the number of locals that might fit the description.

A feasibility study for a public footpath from the village to Clawthorpe is underway. It has been done before so it is not clear what this £7,000 study is going to achieve. Councillors wait expectantly. Speeding through Burton was discussed following a 6-day county council investigation in March. It turns 25.000 vehicles passed out that through Burton during these six days, averaging between 23 mph around the village centre to 32 mph around Church Bank Gardens. Councillors know that averages can mask the extremes of speed and agreed to write to the Police to request monitoring with a speed gun at Church Bank Gardens, where over

60% of vehicles are exceeding the speed limit. They also asked Roger Bingham to investigate the possibility of a 20mph limit through the village.

County council communications about street lighting down Neddy Hill and Station Lane continues to baffle Councillors. The council are saying that street lights on telegraph poles will be removed 'within 4 weeks' but Roger Bingham said that this policy has been changed. Left hand not knowing what right hand is doing by the sound of it. Roger Bingham will investigate at the Highways Department of the council.

A safety inspection at the playground showed no great problems, but Alan Wren said that the wibbly wobbly apparatus and the slide need replacing, and Moira Rowley asked again for the woodchip to be replaced. Action is promised.

Other developments:

- 1. A Budget Working Party for 2015/16 was set up.
- 2. It was decided not to adopt National Association of Local Council's revised model for standing orders because there was little new in them.
- 3. Outstanding actions were reviewed and remain outstanding.
- 4. Villagers are asked to be good neighbours if lighting bonfires. Complaints have been received where

unneighbourly fires have been lit.

- 5. Signs on Station Lane need renewal/replacement Roger Bingham to try and get action, but did not sound very hopeful.
- 6. Observed that potholes still exist even after Moss Lane resurfacing has been done. Good news from Paul Rogers that swings have been repainted, Slape Lane has been pruned and road sweeping has been carried out down Main Street.
- 7. Next meeting 21st August at 7.30pm in the Memorial Hall.

This year, the society travelled to Liverpool to the Walker Gallery and the Tate. We set off from Burton, travelling to Barton Grange for refreshment which everyone enjoyed.

Travelling onwards, we arrived at the Walker Gallery by coach and were given an introductory tour. We had time after this to look in more detail at the exhibits. Of particular interest, was the Grayson Perry "The vanity of Small differences" exhibition. This was "mindblowina" with the intricate portrayed in the series of huge, detailed tapestries and his use of colour and composition giving a sideways look at class mobility and social identity. We were then able to enjoy lunch at the Walker before proceeding on to the Tate at Albert Dock.

Arriving at the Tate we were giving free entry to the Mondrian and Nasreen Mohamedi exhibitions. Some of the show general works on "challenging," Mondrian's however. works were most interesting in the field of abstraction with his use of geometric blocks of shapes and colour. particularly red, yellow and blue which went on to influence designers, in particular, Mary Quant.



Nasreen Mohamedi's work was very intricate, exploring lines, perspectives and diagonals, they really have to be seen to really appreciate her wonderful work.

We had time after this to take in the delights of the Albert Dock area and take refreshment before returning to Burton following a most enjoyable day.

Holme & District Local History Society trip 2014

This year's trip was to Townley Hall and Queen Street Mill, both in Burnley. The weather was again kind for us as we set off, breaking our journey for refreshment at the Coniston Hotel, Coniston Cold. We enjoyed our break in the Hotel's Huntsman's Lodge with its terrace overlooking the lake, wonderful views and excellent service.

Break over, we travelled on to Townley Hall where we were met by the hall coordinator who introduced us to the excellent guides for our private tour; and very good and informative they were too!

The hall was home to the Townley family for over 500 years until sold to

the Burnley Corporation in 1901. The hall was not built all at once, therefore, the tour is like travelling through time. It contains a large furniture collection, some from the 17th century and many other interesting artefacts. It boasts a large art collection including Pre-Raphaelite painters Waterhouse There Povnter. is also fine Farguharson and an excellent Cox painting of the Lancaster Sands. The chapel was built in the 1st quarter of the 16th century and has fine panelling and a Gothic font cover. The grounds are extensive and include a golf course, all of which are enjoyed by locals and visitors alike.

Following our tour, we took lunch in their cafe or picnicked in the sun in the grounds before departing for the second visit of the day to Queen Street Mill. On arrival at the mill, we were once again met by our guides to give us a personal tour which took in aspects of cotton weaving and all the processes needed to produce the finished cloth. To see 300 Lancashire looms and watching cloth being woven as it was when the mill was first opened made a spectacular, if somewhat "noisy", sight!

Queen Street Mill is the world's last 19th century steam-powered weaving mill. It started production in 1894, commercial production ceasing in 1982.





Small scale production continues. making items which can be purchased in the museum shop. Following the tour we took advantage of their cafe's before departing after facilities excellent day out to journey back to Burton.

Long-Distance Relationship?

Dear Xxxxx

Thank you for contacting us about Christening/Baptism for your son. understand how much the strong links that you have with Burton and with St James' Church must mean to you even though you don't live in the area anymore. Since moving here I have met many people who feel that Burton will always be 'home'. However, baptism is belonging to а congregation (as well as a declaration of your trust in the Lord Jesus Christ). When a child is baptised the local church family is publicly welcoming a child who has begun to worship with them each week, and as parents you promise that you will, by your example, draw them into the church family, walk with them in following Christ, and help them to take their place in the life and worship of Christ's Church. This makes no sense if you live too far away to be able to come to church here each week.

I hope that there is a church near you where you could worship each week (if you need help finding one then let me know where you are living and I will do my best to help) and I am sure the minister there would be willing to talk to you about Christening/Baptism for your son. In fact, if you are not already involved in a local church, then I would remind you that your parents promised you to Jesus Christ at your own baptism here in Burton and congregation all said: "Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life." As you care for your son and think about his future, don't miss the opportunity to

think about who you belong to and what was promised on your behalf.

Historical Footnote...

... by Roger Bingham

75 YEARS AGO - BURTON GOES QUIETLY INTO WAR - 1939

In contrast to the outbreak of the 1914 - 18 war, the start of the 1939 - 45 conflict was neither unexpected nor was it greeted with displays of fervent patriotism. Indeed, Burton took the beginning of what is still invariably called THE war very peaceably. Miss Lees organised a Women's Institute 'Motor Bus Mystery Tour' and also a W.I. outing to Harrogate and York. Mrs Hoggarth collected £1 13s for 'Waifs and Strays' which destitute children were then called.

Humiliatingly, PC Moore of Burton failed to secure a conviction for 'serving after hours' at the Sportsman's Inn, Hutton Roof, because the magistrates accepted a plea that 'the Landlord was entitled to entertain his friends at any time'.

Burton athletes did well at Holme Sports, and there were 21 canine contestants for a Hound Trail from Curwen Woods over Clawthorpe and Burton Fell. Regrettably, it was reported that Holme Rugby Club had lost matches because of repeated failures to play 'complete teams'.

In mid August Holme Mills closed down for a week's holiday but, despite excellent weather, the number of trippers in the district was 'only average'.

Burton Show, held, for the tenth year in succession, in the 'natural arena at Dalton Hall Park' attracted the 'highest entries on record'. Oblivious to the imminence of war-time mechanisation of agriculture, the parade of 119 Shire Horses (for ploughing) was the largest number for years. Then the weather broke and lightning killed a cow and a calf belonging to Mr John Atkinson of Ellers Farm, Farleton.

Sadly several there were village deaths, including 84 year-old Mrs Titterington, formerly of the King's Arms, Burton, and of Mr Edward Robertson, a native of the village who had worked on the railway before retiring ten years earlier. The biggest funeral was that of 74 year-old Mr S. B. Mason of Ley Pitts Farm, who had six daughters, six sons, twenty-seven grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Happy occasions included two marriages. At her wedding to Walter James Howson of Cartmel, Margaret Rucastle 'wore a two piece dress of blue silk marocain with hat and shoes to tone'; the next week Sarah Gibson,

For everyday wear, offers at the Summer Sales included 'Ladies Dresses from 20/-, Aquascutum suits at 49/6; Men's Sports coats to clear from 19/6 and raincoats at 30/-.'

Stealthily, however, war was approaching Westmorland. The county was preparing to receive 4,500 evacuees. A local Women's Territorial Army battalion had been formed, and there was a run on tinned goods in the shops, which were told that they would have to close at 5.30pm when (not 'if') war broke out.

On the 1st of September, two days before war was declared officially, black-out regulation came into force. Lights had to be obscured by 7.22 pm - although in northern places like Burton it was still daylight.

Sensationally a local conflict had already occurred when Mrs Mossop of Moss Yard, Burton, brought a 'charge of common assault' against Mrs Parsons of Hutton Cottage. But both ladies were 'bound over to keep the peace for 12 months' - at least. It was a pity for Burton and the wider world beyond that Hitler could not have been induced to do the same.

A Soldier Writes Home

Richard Atkinson was born at Dalton on 28 March 1896, the son of John (Jack) Atkinson, Gamekeeper, and Jane Thompson. Richard had four sisters: Ruth, Edith, Gertrude and Ida May and was married to Isabel Blackshaw, servant at Dalton Hall. In December 1914 Richard enlisted in the Kings Own Royal Lancaster Regiment as a Private. Shortly afterwards, he was posted to Blackpool, from where he wrote to his mother...

53 George Street Blackpool Dec 10th 1914

Dear Mother

We are having a good time here and I have got a good lodge. It is very cold here but I am standing it all right. We never went out on Monday when we landed so I had a look round. I have got a Waistcoat a Shirt and a pair of Shoes and I think the uniforms will be given out before long. On Tuesday we went on the race course and had an hour at drill in the morning and in the afternoon we went down to South Shore for a route march. On Wednesday we did not do much so we were finished by four. When we landed at Lancaster a chap

told us we would get coats when we landed here but I have never seen one I left mine at Davises to come back to Carnforth with Hartleys cart and I left my gloves in the pockets so when you go to Carnforth call for it and send the gloves on. We have a nice chap drilling us and we have a good time but the Sergeant Major gave us Sweedish drill and he puts us through it with a bit of foul language. Blackpool is a busy place it is swarmed with soldiers. Some of Burton lads went to Seven Oaks last night. I don't think I will be home for Christmas week but I think there will be five days furlough before or after. We have a free concert room to go to at night and we wright our letters there with free writing paper. I will let you no before next weekend about a pair of socks because we might get a pair here. Tell Bob he wants to listing and getting down here for we are having a fine time I think I will draw to a close because the concert is about to start.

I remain Yours R.A.

Roger Reports... from the District & County Councils

Recently there have been fewer full council meetinas. Even so. routine work has gone on, as meetings are no longer reduced during the holiday period. School holidays are currently being debated: children should go away during the term, and about staggering school holidays to reduce peak times when prices in popular resorts are hiked. As a former teacher I believe it is reasonable for families involved, for instance, in catering to go away outside the normal holiday period but this provision should not be extended to enable others simply to get a cheaper deal in a quieter period. I am against staggering holiday times, which I experienced when I taught in Lancashire in the 1970s. One teacher I knew only had Bank Holiday Monday in common with his family as his children and wife (another teacher) were at schools whose towns had different 'wakes weeks' holidays. As we live on the boundary of Cumbria it could mean confusion for local schools' teachers Lancashire and **Burton** living in students attending Lancashire institutions with different holidays. But, as always, what do you think, please?

On the county's scrutiny board as an

'opposition member' l have been examining our performance. Our successes include increase in an bicycle use by workers from 2,808 to 3,638 - (but I've asked how much it cost to count them!): a reduction household waste from 93,114 to 77,587 tonnes, though there has been no overall saving in waste disposal - partly because of the cost of transport to the main plant which is in Lancashire.

Although the county has not quite reached its target in reducing accidents, I am pleased that the autumn inspection and free replacement of electric blankets and home safety fire inspections with provision of free smoke alarms will continue. For further general information please ring 0800 141 2561 and, for alarms, 07500 950846.

Thanks to sensitive arrangements more victims of domestic violence are coming forward to be helped, but I was aghast that the nearest DV referral centre is in Preston.

The Enterprise Social team has business setups assisted in most districts except it seems in South Lakeland. Although Cumbria is behind in its integrating transport programme, I am still pressing for the improvement of Carnforth Station and of bus links to it. Startlingly a transport survey showed that 80% of local respondents were

'less than satisfied' with British Rail.

I have been busy on SLDC's Human Resources Board. Happily our sickness absences rate has reduced from a peak of 10.6 days lost in 2008/9 to 6.5 days in 2012/13. The 2013 figures for the county council are 13.8, for Barrow 10.4. 43% of absences were caused by colds, flu etc, 20% through non workrelated stress and, worryingly, 9.5% by muscle-skeletal problems which might have been caused by work. I was annoyed by a change in Special Leave Entitlement which now stipulates that routine medical screening - for e.g. post cancer referrals should come out of an employee's leave time.

Finally, a 'health and safety' proposal to remove street lamps from wooden utility poles has been mitigated so that they will only go when the pole has to be replaced. Fortunately dark nights are still a long way off so I hope everyone has enjoyed our bright high summer.



THE LANCASTER CANAL Wildlife Corridor and Heritage Asset

WORKING BOATS

Lancaster canal iron barges were 72 feet long, and 14 feet wide, with a carrying capacity of 55 tons.

Main cargoes were coal and limestone, other cargoes were hay, straw, manure, fleeces, tar, tobacco and snuff, timber, building materials, machinery, and of course, gunpowder.

First cargoes started late 1790s, diminishing in the 1930s, and ending in the early 1950s.

Pulled by a horse and with a crew of two, a round trip, Preston to Kendal,

took a week, crew sleeping aboard in the wooden cabin at the stern before returning to their canalside cottages.

There were no narrow boats working the Lancaster Canal.

The Lancaster Canal Trust is a voluntary organisation dedicated to caring for and restoring the Lancaster Canal, which is owned by Canal & River Trust, successors to British Waterways.
