MOBILE BANK ABANDONS BURTON

Are you aware that the NatWest mobile bank has stopped coming to Burton with effect from 16 January?

The village is no longer on the timetable that NatWest produce for local villages, but they didn't actually bother to tell anyone here in Burton, so folks have been waiting in vain for the bank each Friday.

Here at BN we have had calls complaining about its non-appearance, so we had a discussion with Gill at the Post Office about how their services can fill the gap left by NatWest, which brought some info.

This is what Gill told us, "don't despair, customers of most banks (including NatWest) are able to do much of their day to day banking at the Post Office. You can withdraw cash, pay in cash and pay in cheques. The arrangements are slightly different depending on which bank you are with, but if you call in at the Village Store we will be able to advise you on the facilities available to you."

PC Observations...

Reporting from the Parish Council meeting

There was an outbreak of tetchiness at the February 19 meeting led off by Chairman Mike Taylor seemingly getting cross with other Councillors for - as he saw it - re-opening up the discussion about the council's position regarding the proposed housing development at Church Gardens. His view is (and he thought this was the agreed position) that because there are no detailed plans, the council should wait before engaging with the developer. Jane Hopwood disagreed saying that now was the time to engage and even get involved with a Housing Needs Survey for the village. This would help to get the best outcome for the whole village including road improvements, ensuring 35% of homes built are 'affordable' and making best use of funds from a Community Infrastructure Levy which would be available. The Levy could amount to £14k for Burton which could pay for the much needed safe path from the village to Clawthorpe. The council know that the land is allotted for development and that it is going to happen anyway. They are not against it but they don't agree on when or how to engage with the developer. There is going to be **PUBLIC** however а MEETING, chaired by Mike Taylor and with the Parish Clerk taking notes on

March 5 in the Memorial Hall at 7pm to discuss the development. Don't miss it!

Mike got cross again when councillors told him that the recently planted Royal Oak sapling was in the wrong place in a corner of the School Field. It was hard not to laugh because this sapling has been hanging around for years and is frequently been the subject of council meetings. At least Mike had done something about it. Alan Wren offered to replant it.

The tetchiness was catching. Rogers got cross because councillors seemed to think he had not really asked the right questions as he and Moira Rowley escorted the hard-to-get Highways Engineer round potential safety hazards in the village. outcome of the conversation seemed to be that renewing or creating markings/signage around Boon Town-Main Street exit, school Morewood Drive entry onto Clawthorpe Hall iunction was principle possible but that the timing depended in part on the county council getting 'devolved powers' to do the work and/or parish council part funding. Don't hold your breath in other words. No action was possible at Burtlands Junction and the adoption of the access road to Church Bank Gardens was not aoina happen if to even development went ahead because the gradient of the road needed changing.



Councillor Rogers then called for a general change of attitude amongst councillors to stop passing the buck. 'If you have an idea, run with it — don't pass it on!'

Isherwood George caught tetchiness bug when he said that the map case issue on Main Street was resolved. Quizzical looks from other councillors but they crossed it off the outstanding actions list. Roger Bingham told council that he had had a hard day at county council budget review. He had fought and seemingly got release of funds for Burton to get the already authorised lengthsman's grant (£1000) for another year The Labour/Liberal Democrat coalition have agreed a 2% increase in Council Tax - the first rise in 5 years - and this he reported should mean that existing services to parishes will be maintained (but no guarantees).

Other discussion items:

- 1. Police Report reported very little suspicious vehicle, cold calling nuisance, theft of 'half a tank' of fuel and a bit of anti-social behaviour
- 2. Motorbikes again at Plain Quarry signs recommended to warn them off
- 3. A rocking horse or a see-saw at the Children's playground? Moira Rowley to re-investigate costs and lottery funding options
- 4. Nat West bank van no longer stopping at village? No warning and

council to express disappointment in a letter

5. A Remembrance Poppy has been donated – what to do with it? Look out for this to appear again in Outstanding Actions!

Historical Footnote...

... by Roger Bingham

STRANGE HAPPENINGS AT BURTON CHURCH IN THE MIDDLE AGES

'Something strange must have happened' was the conclusion made by C.M.L. Bouch in his book (of 1948) Prelates and People of the Lakes County about problems at Burton Church in 1437. But, already, 150 years earlier, Burton Church might have been touched by scandal when it was visited in 1281 by the Archbishop of York William de Wickwane. He specifically concerned in stamping out the keeping concubines of by supposedly celibate clergy who may have included Burton's parson William de Rutherfeld.

The 1437 problem arose when the King, Henry VI, replaced Thomas de Horneby (who had been Burton's Parish Priest since 1432) by William Trokell. But, Thomas acted 'expeditiously' so despite very the communications of the period, he obtained within eight days a license from the Archbishop of York to keep the living (vicar's job). So, William was forced to resign. The Archbishop was John Kemp, who held the See of York from 1423 until 1452 when he became Archbishop of Canterbury, but only for two years as he died in 1454.

He was Chancellor (roughly equivalent to Prime Minister) during the 1430's and was involved in fighting the French in the era of Joan of Arc.

Even so, unlike his successor Cardinal Wolsey a century later, he regularly visited his northern province. Most unusually he made two visitations to Burton, respectively, on 8 September 1428 and 19 September 1442. As a Prince of the Church his entourage would have consisted of scores of retainers.

Consequently, one wonders how the Parish catered for their august quest as no inventories for such medieval viands as venison and wild boar - required by a medieval bun fight - have survived. Though, in 1442, he may have been eaten out of house and home Thomas Horneby certainly had staying power as he was recorded as being 'parson of the Church' in 1460. In that year his 'vicar's portion' was set out as being £20 per annum consisting also of a 'house and garden and a close called Kirk Butts with all small tithes, and mortuaries' (burial fees). But he had to pay £10 3s 4d to St Mary's Abbey at York which in return had to keep the Chancel in repair and pay all connected 'burthens ordinary and extraordinary'.

Vícar's Letter...

Better than a dusty old book

How many Bibles do you have in your house? Most houses have acquired some: the Bible presented at school, an old family Bible, a baptism or wedding present. And, of course, Bibles are available free on-line. So why aren't more people convinced that Jesus is all-important?

Surely (some would say) if God really wants us to believe in his Son he'll have to do better than give us a dusty old book! Could he arrange for some writing in the sky, personally addressed to me? Or answer my prayers in a miraculous way? If his Son was willing to put in an appearance in the 1st century could he perhaps show up again in the 21st century, here in England? Or could God send someone back from the dead to give us some clarity about the life to come?

Jesus once told a story about a man who, having failed to prepare to meet his maker, ends up in hell (Luke 16). When he realizes there is no way out for him, he starts to worry about his five brothers who, he suspects, are going to end up in the same place. Could someone be sent back from the dead to warn them? When he is told that his

brothers can easily read their Bibles he makes a final plea: "No! But if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent."

How many people today feel the same? Miracles done in front of other people or in a past age don't count; I demand evidence individually presented to me before I will believe.

The punchline in Jesus' story is striking: If the five brothers "do not listen to Moses and the Prophets (ie the part of the Bible that they already have) they will not be convinced even if someone rises from the dead." The irony is that Jesus knows that he himself will rise from the dead and be seen by hundreds of eyewitnesses, yet many will still refuse to trust in him.

Because the Bible can be a difficult book to understand we regularly offer opportunities to join a small group where its message is clearly explained and questions can be asked. If you ring or e-mail me I will happily tell you when the next group is getting together.

Roger Reports... from the District & County Councils

Unfortunately, the county and South Lakeland councils' budgets for 2015-16 will only be decided after the BN deadline - so I will have to comment next month. At the end of January, I, as a District Councillor, took part in the multi-faith service commemorating the Holocaust on the 70th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz. Afterwards I met a survivor who had stayed at the Calgarth refugee hostel where my mother was a volunteer helper in 1945. At the county council, following the withdrawal of British forces from the region, we remembered the six Cumbrian fatalities, none of whom came from South Lakeland.

On South Lakeland disagreements about the proposed £500,000 purchase of a building in Kendal and the controversy about the now withdrawn attempt to introduce on-street car parking charges continues. Fortunately we were informed that none of the required parking meters had been bought. The county's plans to build a new £10m HQ in Carlisle have, despite many grumbles, now been passed. Equally controversial are the huge housing developments at Ulverston and Grange and for an employment area at on the A6 Scroggs Wood south entrance to Kendal. In addition to objections about landscaping and access I am worried that building development might harm local archaeology as the Roman Road from the Watercrook Fort ran across the site.

Nearer home, a meeting about application for crematorium а at Junction attracted 36 large а attendance, mainly of objectors who were worried about the impact on the landscape at what is a gateway to the Lake District. Other concerns included flooding, car parking and access from the A6070, the A65 and the M6. Although many local people would find a Crooklands crematorium convenient it might be strategically more sensible to Lake District crematorium further north as we are ten miles from Lancaster and Morecambe Crematorium compared to the 22 miles iourney from Kendal and 30 from the Langdales and Sedbergh. If you have views please contact SLDC at South Lakeland House, Kendal, LA9 4UQ, or telephone tel. 01539 793361.

Good and bad news includes that Cumbrians are getting healthier but not wealthier. Life expectancy in Cumbria is 82.4 for females and 78.8 for males. In South Lakeland, Kendal Highgate has the lowest age of death at 73.8 and Levens the highest at 86.4. Sadly there are 14,485 cases of child poverty, with

a peak rate of 47.5% in Barrow, ten times greater than the rate for Burton and adjacent parishes. 14% of South Lakeland residents have an income below £10,000 compared to 7.4% in 2009. The current below £10,000 parate in Barrow is 17.3%. Educationally South Lakeland has the best statistics as 63.5% of young people obtain 5 A-C grades at GCSE. The Cumbria average of 55.8% almost equals that of England of 55.9% but worryingly for North Cumbrians the Carlisle rate is 46.6%. Lets hope that the reported economic upturn will soon benefit everyone.

Swift welcome in Burton

For us It is the countdown to the arrival of our village Swifts expected in approx 65 days or somewhere around the 4th of May!

The first delight of awareness that they are back is hearing their screaming which they do whilst they perform their aerial chasing above Main Street whilst dodging in and out of the many overhead wires. And has time goes on you may even see them in small squadrons like miniature Red Arrows or Black Arrows in this case. One thing for sure is that they will always be in perfect formation.

We are so lucky to have Swifts on our very doorstep, and fortunately ours seem to be maintaining reasonable numbers, considering the downward plight in breeding birds being recorded throughout the country as a whole.

Unless you actually stand and watch the Swifts close up, I guess you may never know they breed in our village, they are so fast in their approach to their nest site combined with their general secretive nature. If you are standing in close proximity to their nest site you may even experience the feeling of a draught of wind to the earhole has they come so close to you to give warning you are close enough!

Our local Swift Bird Study Group in Burton monitors the birds breeding habits and more important just whereabouts they are breeding within the village, making and comparing notes to previous years to see if there have been any changes in their numbers, whilst also doing sketches of their actual nest sites.

So far the local group have managed to establish that the Swifts do like to keep to the same nesting sites which they have used previously, with the additional prospect of new young birds trying to find new sites if this is possible!

During 2014 we did record a maximum of 41 birds above the village, which were counted on the evening of Friday July 25th, just before the main party left us a few days later to return to Africa on the 29th although four or five birds did linger on until the last sighting on 8th August.





News from the Lancaster Canal

The Westmorland Gazette, 22 January, carried a story about a sunken barge on the Lancaster canal at Field End Bridge (no. 169) winding hole, (turning area), now full of horsetail weed.

There was a Diphtheria epidemic in 1920, and it is thought that it was a hospital ship transporting victims from outlying areas to Lancaster. Certainly, in the 1914-18 war, wounded soldiers were transported by canals, as this was a safe and smooth way, rather than by rickety carriages, or farm carts over rough roads.

This story has created considerable response from older people in the community and a story emerges that a little girl may have died on board and the barge was sunk by the owners as there was no means of fumigating against the deadly Diphtheria in those days.

This story is on going and divers are preparing to investigate, but perhaps other canal communities have similar stories and it would be interesting to hear them.

Meanwhile, Bob Pointing has been appointed to head the Canal & River Trust North West Partnership and will be directing the future of the Lancaster Canal. Bob was head of the Barrow Regeneration and West Lakes Renaissance.

The North West Partnership was formed to give local people a voice in the development and management of local waterways. Chantelle Seaborn, NW Manager of Canal & River Trust (CRT) says "We are delighted to have Bob join us, and know he will make a great contribution to the future of the Lancaster and Leeds and Liverpool Canals."


Lancaster Canal is to host the IWA National Trailboat Festival with "Westmorland on Water" on their Northern Reaches section on 30, 31 May and 1 June alongside Countryfest, the Westmorland Agricultural Society's event that attracts around 30,000 people.


