### PC Observations...

# Reporting from the Parish Council meeting

I looked up August 2014's observations to see the similarities with the August 20th 2015 meeting and noticed how slowly things move in the PC World. footpath to Clawthorpe from The 'downtown' Burton was discussed in August 2014 but still has no resolution example. Not for even an acknowledgement from County Council that they are considering it despite £7000 being spent on a feasibility aren't our Councillors study. Why jumping up and down about this? Jane Hopwood called it disgraceful but there is a sense of powerlessness about the Council's ability to influence the Department Highways and Roger Bingham can only prod and probe to try and get action. Presumably a letter will be sent.

Amongst this month's planning applications, a plan to build a single large wind turbine on land to the west of Green Dragon Farm near the M6 was objected to on grounds of visual impact for villagers and also the potential impact on other types of land use in that area. The objection was by a majority, not unanimous.

Another plan generated an interesting debate. Councillors were not sure



whether they agreed or disagreed with plans to build a two-story building in the garden of Ashgrove at Clawthorpe. An impassioned intervention bv Mike Taylor was crucial. 'We cannot just object to everything', he argued. 'That area of Clawthorpe is a commercial area now - why should we object?' eventually Councillors agreed ʻin principle' but wanted issues of road safety and the type of construction to be carefully considered. especially because the corner of the access road from Clawthorpe onto the A6070 is a concern.

On a similar point, Brian Duckett in the Open forum open to the public had earlier introduced an outline plan to change the entrance at the Clawthorpe Business Park to improve safety. This unanimously supported was bv Councillors. The recent road re-Clawthorpe surfacing near on the A6070 questioned but Brian was explained that the reason was that the previous surface had been 'lethal' in wet weather with many accidents.

Other discussions included:

1. Vandals had caused damage to two swings on the playground, requiring £175 of Council money to put right. Other police activity had included minor accidents, an arrest of a person for a drugs offence and a motor cyclist who had collided with a sheep.



 A proposal for a solar farm in Cinderbarrow Lane, Priest Hutton was noted but since it could not be seen from Burton, no comment was required.
 A Budget Working Party for 2015/16 planning was set up

4. Councillor reports included updates from Roger Bingham on District and deliberations Countv includina the continuing of special measures for the Children's Department. Peter Smith was concerned (as were all Councillors) about a planned solar installation at Hutton Roof because of HGV traffic causing disruption on Dalton Lane when other access routes to the site were available. Paul Rogers noted that Slape Lane had finally been cleared. Mike Taylor suggested that the Burton Emergency Plan be regularly updated to check on contact numbers and resources. Moira Rowley reported a fire in a vehicle on Boon Town and the difficulty that fire tenders had in reaching it because of parked cars. This could happen in other drives around Burton as well. Whatever happened to the Church Bank Gardens planning application? No news yet of it even coming up for discussion at SLDC. And dog poo? How is the campaign going? Wait and see next month! Next meeting Thursday 17 September at 7.30pm in the Memorial Hall.

# Vícar's Letter...

### Who does he think he is?

So what does your surname mean? Perhaps it indicates what an ancestor of yours did for a living (Smith or Farmer) or where he lived (Wood or Lancaster) or who his father was (Johnson or McDonald). But Christ is not a surname like those; it is a royal title, like Elizabeth 'Regina' (or 'Reg' as it is inscribed on the coins in your pocket) which means, of course, 'Queen'.

The arrival of 'The Christ' was eagerly anticipated, an honest and noble King sent from God who would replace the selfish, unjust and destructive rule of their average human leader. At first it did not seem that Jesus of Galilee deserved such a title: he was born in morally suspect circumstances to an ordinary family, he had no political or military training and by the age of 30 he was still an unknown. But Mark begins his account of Jesus boldly: "The beginning of the gospel about Jesus Christ, the Son of God" and very quickly he is showing us how this 'travelling preacher' is behaving like a King with authority.

Jesus commands people to down tools and join him and they obey him. He confronts the demon-possessed and

the demons obey him. He goes to those who are sick and dying and the diseases obey him. He proves that he has God's authority to forgive sin and, when he and his friends are about to be drowned at sea, he commands the wind and waves and they obey him too. And all the time people are asking "Who is this? Who is this who has such authority?" Peter is the first to dare to speak what others have only wondered, "You are the Christ".

When was the last time you read the early pages of one of the Gospels and asked yourself the question, "Who is this? How do I account for this man?" You must have a Bible on a shelf somewhere that you can dust off, or perhaps you would like to read with some others in a small group where questions can be discussed. If that's you, let me know and I'll tell you about a group that you can join.

### Historical Footnote...

... by Roger Bingham

#### Burton just after the First World War

In 1921 publication was resumed of Kelly's Annual Directorv for Westmorland. which had been suspended during the First World War. As with pre-war directories it indicated that Burton was still a busy, work-a-day place. Even so the recorded population figures showed that the population of 521 was stagnant compared with the figures for 1901 of 578, 517 for 1911 and for 1931 of 528 which, indeed, were very much less than the 1871 census return of 800 people. The figures for Dalton were 101 in 1901, 108 for 1911 and 103 in 1931.

In the Directory's commercial section, agriculture was well to the fore although only three farmers, William Woof at Clawthorpe Hall, James Dixon at Dalton Old Hall, and Anthony Dixon at Russell Farm, Dalton had more than 150 acres hand. Smaller famers included in Clarkson Atkinson at New Mills (Ewan Mill), William Burtholme who was also assistant overseer of the poor and rate collector, William Clark and Son at Clawthorpe, Dickinson Brothers at Sandv John Dickinson Gap. at Oakwood, John Thomas Fell at Moss House, Leonard Hoggarth at Ley Pits,

John Metcalf at Deerslet, Thomas Ridding Cragg House. at Dalton. Thomas Wildman at Bell House, Dalton and William Wilkinson & Sons Henridding. Specialist producers included Thomas Rider - market gardener, two poultry 'breeders' William Barran and Richard Makinson, while Robert Wilkinson was registered as 'farm bailiff to E. G. S. Hornby, esa.'

Trades people included Thomas Atkinson & Son and William Cravston boot makers, George Bainbridge and Adam Bell stone masons, and George Braithwaite, joiner, while, harking back to earlier times, George Dobson was a wheelwriaht. Several ladv shopkeepers included Margaret Murray, The Misses Sarah and Mary Bell, Elizabeth Watson, grocer, and Sarah Rider, corn and flour dealer. Other suppliers were John Hartley, and grocer, George Pennell, butcher.

Burton had three inns: Robert Robinson, a farmer, was the Green Dragon's landlord, but The Royal and the King's Arms both had landladies, respectively Mesdames Robinson and Titterington. Yet, because her works figure in family and local history displays, Burton's most memorable business lady of 1921 was Mrs Beatrice Corless - a photographer.

### Roger Reports... from the District & County Councils

What was technically 'summer', brought road works including the surface dressing of parts of the A6070. With the activity came the usual complaints about road closures, demands for immediate white lining and pleas for other work.

I am continuing to press for footpath repairs on Mowbray Drive and elsewhere and for further 'gully cleansing' and surface water drainage down Neddy Hill, near Bell House Barn, Dalton and on the A6070 near Holme Park.

If rather slowly, the planned roundabout at the Auction Mart is being completed although early worries that congestion on sales days would create problems for Burton commuters have not been as bad as anticipated.

With my colleague, Brian Cooper, we are stressing the need for major highway and footpath work on and around the Church Bank Gardens development site.

Elsewhere the detailed planning permission required for development sites adopted (in the face of much controversy) by SLDC's Local

Development Framework is running into difficulties, with a major application in Kendal being turned down. So, even if a site has received outline development approval the community can still have its say on what goes there.

As а member of the county's **Development Control Committee I have** received objections concerning an application for a wind turbine near Green Dragon. I gather that, although in its election manifesto the government stated that it would oppose on-shore wind farms, individual turbines for isolated rural areas might still be allowed. Please let me know your views.

Meanwhile solar panel 'farms' are being proposed and I have forwarded the concerns of Hutton Roof residents about an application for a Whittington site. I have also been on a site visit for a proposed solar scheme near Penrith, which, as it is well-screened, might be passed.

So far, I have not heard of any local fracking proposals following a rejection of an application for near Blackpool.

On SLDC the most contentious debate on a proposal to have 'all out' district elections once in four years was rejected by the majority party. Thus, we will continue to have elections in thirds,



with the county elections in the fourth year, plus the General, European and Police Commissioner elections spread through the cycle. Also the council will stay at 51 members and an idea that there should be three member wards with annual elections in each ward for one member was rejected.

Much passion was roused by criticism of the Government's plan to extend the Right to Buy (introduced by Edward Heath in 1972) to other social housing schemes. I made the point that capital receipts from sales should be used for new build schemes as happened under the John Major government, but which was cancelled by Tony Blair, although the right to buy was retained.

There was also a proposal that the right to buy should be extended to private lets. What do you think-please?





August has been poor with the Broad Leaved Helleborine orchids, in fact so poor that the majority of them have "given up the ghost" as they say and are going over with closed buds before they have had chance to flower, it's been a strange year in some respects for these rare orchids especially up on Hutton Roof. I suppose you've got to have poor to have great! (in follow up years). After saying all that the Dark Red Helleborines, which flowered much earlier, were an absolute delight to the eye this year with some lovely variant colours. Even some with red sepals whilst contrasting with yellow/lemony petals. So stunning and very unusual. So summing up overall, I suppose you could say it's been very hit and miss..

The flora diary is quickly coming to its close, but I do have another great pleasure left and that is to go up on Hutton Roof about this time to check out the Autumn Gentian. A beautiful flower, usually of a purple colour, but sometimes up here we also have the rarer "white" flowered ones as well.



They can be seen growing on both the Hutton Roof side and the Farleton side.

I had my last Dark Green Fritillary butterfly on the 19 August and this specimen was well worn and I wondered if it would last the next hour! Other butterflies still around on that date was the Large Skipper, Speckled Woods, Meadow Browns and Common Blues. Seen very few of the Grayling this year.

It's been a great pleasure this year to watch our Swifts who have all now departed. The majority left us on the 29 Julv. then another batch of approximately 15 left us on 8 August and the final pair with their young departed on Sunday 16 August. Only a rough estimate but we think Burton Swifts may well have raised at least 30 chicks this year which is really good news especially when you look at the poor results being recorded throughout the country as a whole.

It's been a pleasure having several of the villagers with us over the past twelve weeks observing the Swifts and I am sure they have enjoyed it. We have managed to make plenty of notes and sketches and we have also now created our own "Burton Swift Bird Study Group page" which is on the internet at: www.burtonswiftbirdstudygroup.blogspot.co.uk

So from the Swifts point, it will be



another year of waiting now and, like this year, would expect them to be back with us on 4 August 2016 (no bets please!)




surprise as I sat astride was strong elephant bristles, totally unexpected but bearable. Then came the lowering process. Again done so tenderly.




