PC Observations...

of the Parish Council meeting by John Mackness

Usually the March PC meeting starts with the Annual Parish Meeting. However due to the virus, this was cancelled and the public was asked not to attend but to submit questions and/or suggestions by email or telephone. Since the March PC meeting, Chairman Paul Rogers has stood down and Alan Wren has taken over with Sarah Colyer carrying on as deputy chair. Sarah has prepared a short annual report, which will be available in due course on the BN website - www.burton-in-Kendal-pc.gov.uk.

The Parish Council meeting did in fact take place. However, with the public not attending – the Open Forum is usually very interesting – discussion was limited. Understandably, there were a few absentees at the meeting but five councillors did attend.

The main outcome from the meeting was the launch of a community help initiative for residents in self-isolation. The council and local residents are setting up this community volunteer group and any resident needing shopping, prescriptions, meals or any errands should contact Lesley Bailey on (01524) 782984 or (07564) 525226. Several Agenda items were deferred because of the effects of the virus on the attendance. It was left to councillors to celebrate the improvements to the Square, progress with flood defence work during the year and the developing B4RN broadband cabling installation on the east side of the village.

Looking forward we have developments related to the beautification of the village, backed by Historic England which are aimed at improving the appearance of roads and pavements, the buildings and spaces in Burton. In addition, the completion of flood defence work and the B4RN broadband scheme.

NATURE NOTES by Bryan Yorke

Well! the dickie birds have not stopped flying through our area because of the coronavirus, but it may even be a question of whether I am allowed or not to go and check on them over the future days! I live in hope that it will be OK and let's just take it one day at a time and for today it's still all systems go I am pleased to report!

Spring migration has now begun with Meadow Pipits crossing over Burton, Dalton Crag and Hutton Roof. I have to be up at the crack of dawn, and it's so worth it to enjoy the first hour or two seeing them coming through whilst they are always calling out with their simple little "tist" call. I wonder just where they are off to... As I write (20th March 2020) I am getting roughly about 20 birds per hour passing over the Crag, but this will increase daily over the coming days. They keep within a tight corridor when they are coming through and can be seen $\frac{3}{4}$ way up through Dalton Crag (deforested) near the large gully on the right hand side, or anywhere along the same line towards Farleton where the large sloping pavement shows. I'll let you into a little secret! If you are lazy and want help with your counting of the Mipits, go up Dalton and keep your eye on Sky the Skylark and he will tell you just when a Meadow Pipit is passing through, because he is on constant guard of his own territory and will fly up each time a bird is passing through to escort it through his territory...only joking! But it is true this is just what Sky gets up to at this time of year.

There are also Chaffinch coming through and I always wonder why on

earth do they pass through Burton in a South East direction, the very same direction as they did on their way out last Autumn? I would have expected them to go North! It's always been a mystery to me! On the East coast all the birders tell me their Chaffinch also head South at this time of year. The reason being is that their birds are expected to be of Scandinavian origin and they are heading South until they reach the shortest North Sea crossing from Kent. By the way talking about Chaffinch, up until yesterday we still have large numbers in Dalton Crag enjoying the Beech Mast in fact I counted over 600, so dispersal for breeding is very slow, but would expect this to change any day now.

A nice surprise today (20th March) at 0630hrs whilst stood watching at Mike Taylors Fields, I looked to the South, and counted over 3,300 Pink Footed Geese coming out of the Morecambe Bay area or they may have been even further down the coast towards Blackpool, and there were raft after raft of them heading somewhere one the line with Caton and to an East/North East direction, maybe Kirkby Lonsdale. The movement went on for at least half hour. I think this could well have been the birds leaving their winter quarters on our West Coast and then heading North and onward back to their breeding grounds in Iceland. Another bonus today was seeing two early Sand Martins making their way North. In the last two days massive amounts (thousands) of Red Throated Divers have been passing North over the East Coast and early this week the vismig watchers down at Winter Hill Bolton got a nice surprise when they also witnessed a party of 4 overhead. Terns and Kittiwakes are on the ready for their overland

HISTORICAL FOOTNOTE

The King's Arms - Coaching Inn.

In 1694 the Rev Thomas Machell, 'the Antiquary on Horseback' recorded 'thence to Burton, a small, market town where there is a good cross and some good Inns (which he did not name) lately built. Here I lay but slept but hard'. A century or so later he would have travelled by coach and stayed at either of Burton 'Post Inns', The Kings Arms or The Royal Oak-later called the Royal Hotel-both of which architecturally date from the eighteenth century. Burton's lesser hostelries included the Blue Bell, near the church, The Globe in Main Street and Green Dragon on the edge of the township.

Around 1800 Burton was a booming centre for stage coaches using the Heronsyke to Eamont Bridge Turnpike Road which went right through Westmorland. Being 10 miles equidistant from Lancaster and Kendal it was well suited as a venue for changing horses. In 1829 Parsons and White's Directory advertised stages from the Royal as 'Royal Mail to London at half past 1 mg (morning); to Kendal etc 12 at night, The new times to Carlisle etc at 12 noon and to Manchester, Liverpool etc at 1 afternoon. The Telegraph to Manchester at half past 10 mg and to Kendal etc at half past four in the afternoon, the two last also stop at the King's Arms'. Under the unusual control of a female licensee, Agnes Burne, The Royal was clearly the leading house.

Even so, Richard Dixon's King's Arms was evidently a substantial establishment judging from the

Advertisement for its sale: " To Be Sold By Auction by J. G. Oulden on Wednesday and Thursday the 6 and 7h may 1829 at the Kings Arms Inn Burton-in-Kendal: All the Valuable Household Furniture Post Horses, Harness and Husbandry Utensils The Property of Mr Dixon (who is retiring from Business). Consisting of Four Posted and Camp Beds and Hangings, Feather Beds, Bolsters and Pillows, Bed and Table Linen, Mahogany Chairs, Tables, Chests of Drawers, Swing and Pier Looking Glasses, Carpets, Fenders, and Fire Irons; and Excellent full sets of Brewing Utensils, Dairy Utensils, and all kinds of Kitchen Furniture. Six Post Horses and Harness, Carts, and Wheels, and Cart Gears; and various Husbandry Utensils. P.S. The Horses, Harness, etc. Will be Sold the Second Day'. Mr Dixon got out at the right time as the coaching trade disappeared with the arrival of Railways in 1839: but happily the King's Arms has successfully survived. RKB,

Roger Reports...

From the County & District Councils

**[THIS ARTICLE WAS RECEIVED IN
EARLY MARCH BEFORE LATER
CORONAVIRUS DEVELOPMENTS]**

Council business in March, as in February, seemed to be all floods and finances. Although I heard of no houses being flooded, I failed on 20th February to reach Burton from any direction and had to do a U -turn at Clawthorpe as Ewan Mill lane was also flooded. That night I only got to the Parish Council by going via the A6 and Tarn Lane! My main complaint this time is that there were insufficient 'Flood' and 'Road Closed' signs. I have, however, stressed that drainage problems near the Creamery in Main Street and in Tanpitts Lane and Neddy Hill should be examined as thoroughly as were similar problems around the Square.

At the Parish Council the main issue concerned complaints about the Church Bank development combined with criticism of SLDC's planning department. As the problem had peaked during my illness my colleagues Brian Cooper and Tom Hanvey have been dealing with the matter. But I am, enquiring about alleged 'legal difficulties' that, for 20 years, have delayed the surfacing of the road. Over the years I have often raised this neglect including and at public meetings when the developer has 'promised' that the original as well as newer roads would be brought up to adoptable standards. I am also urging that roads should be surfaced near new dwellings as soon as they are built not, as now, only when the whole development has been completed.

Last month I reported South Lakeland's and the County's Police budgets for 2020 -2021. The County's Council Tax fixed after the last BN deadline increased for both the general rate for Adult Social Services by 1.9%. Also there have been extra National Government Grants of £600,000 for Special Educational Needs and of £1.6m for cycle ways and buses. At the County Council I supported an opposition proposal for grants, from a reserve fund, for the needs of sensory disabled people (blind and deaf) which was defeated. On the District Council I am to receive a written answer to a question about whether debts are collected by council officers or by court bailiffs. Many years ago I supported a successful campaign to prevent bailiffs operating after dark. Finally the County Council is supporting a 'Prom Bank' so that expensive garments worn by 16 year olds for Prom Celebrations can be donated so that less well off youngsters can be suitably arrayed for their next year's party- either for a cut price or for free. So in this way, at least, we are moving with the times.

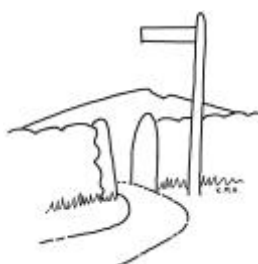

Vicar's Letter...

Having become used to all the wonderful benefits of today's medical skill it has come as an unpleasant surprise to find that a tiny virus can bring such chaos, fear, financial ruin, suffering and death. We can't blame the virus: this little string of RNA is just doing what it knows best, reproducing itself as fast as it can, and doing it rather successfully. And if there is nothing beyond the material world, as some assert, then there's no-one to blame, except the politicians who always get the blame.

But if like me you believe that this world is created and ruled by a loving God then you may be perplexed or angry. Why would God allow a virus to do this to us?

Actually, the same Bible that shows us God's love says so much more about him, and gives us many reasons why his world is full of suffering and futility. Here's just one of them: Since we must all one day give an account of ourselves to God our impartial judge, everything in our lives that reminds us of our frailty and mortality brings, along with the pain and the tears, a healthy prompt to stop thinking that this life is

Burton Memorial Hall Management Committee have decided to close the Hall with immediate effect in response to the Government's advice about social distancing and the prevention of the spread of the Coronavirus. **The decision will be reviewed every three weeks.** All keyholders are expected to respect this decision and not to attempt to access the Hall for any reason.

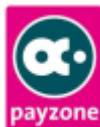
