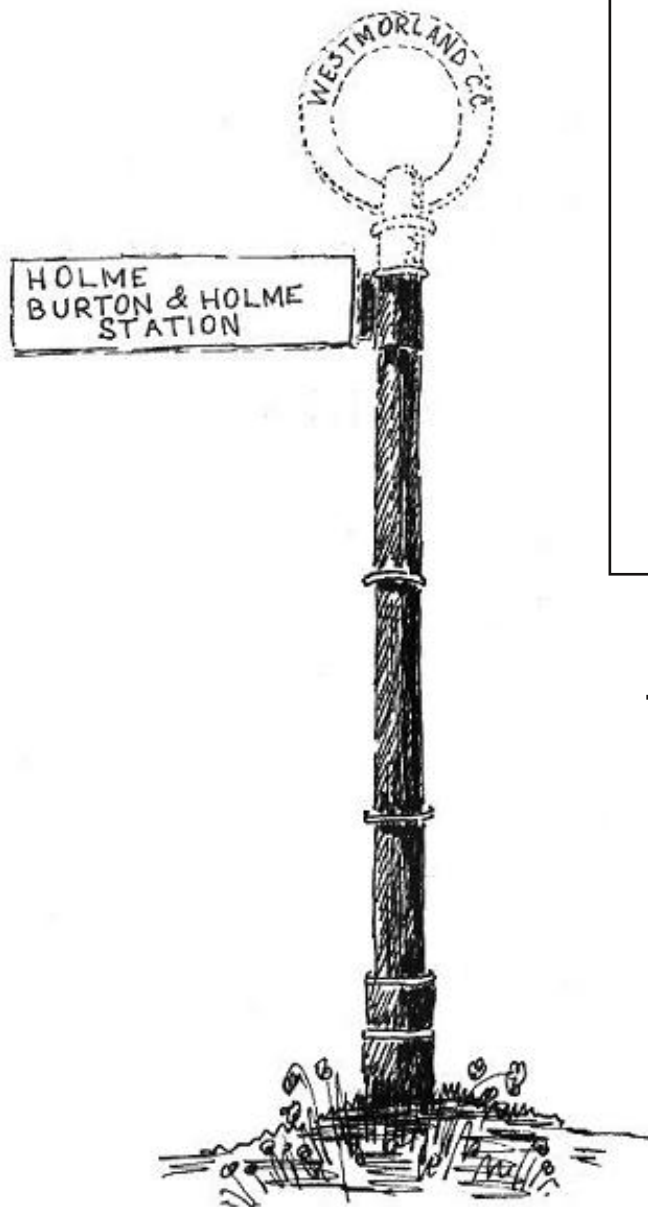

A BOOK REVIEW

Alan has lived in Burton for many years, and recently self-published his autobiography. We received a review of his interesting book below

One Who Speaks His Mind

There is some difference between one who speaks his mind, and one who writes it. Alan Hubbard's autobiography warns us to be prepared for his outspoken opinions, both moral and political. But in fact he blends his opinions almost seamlessly into his absorbing account of a life lived at times precariously but always capturing the vivid moments. His writing is fluent and the detail lifelike.

Born before WW2 in Salford, recalling the streets and his family and way of life, always savouring the good parts and the warmth of family and friends, he is able to be generous in his account of the life close around him while at times bitterly censuring the regime that gave rise to some of its inequalities and injustice.

Alan's life has not run smoothly, and he has seemingly made a bit of a silk purse out of a sow's ear. There have been challenging times, and amusing times. Impressive is the number of incidents which have led to the barring from various hostelryes . Having the

dubious honour of only myself ever being thrown out once (a hardware shop in Carnforth: still not clear what the offence was, but the owner went out of business soon after), we can only picture the raised voices and general kerfuffle that a convinced idealist, only too certain of his ground, can cause in a country pub probably unused to such hectoring outbursts.

Hectoring and contentious Alan's views may well come across in a late-night bar, but on the page they are hard to take issue with.

A natural sportsman, from a promising football interest rock climbing became his great passion, and he has climbed with and met many esteemed rock climbers. But his accounts of some of his most notable achievements in his sport do not dominate the book. He pays tribute to less demanding climbs of note, as well as the most demanding . I specially savoured his account of climbing Commando Ridge at Bosigran in Cornwall, an airy cliff crest with the sea thumping at its base.

Animals get a fair share of coverage too. His chapter on the dogs he has known throughout his life is warm and heartfelt. He has a real respect for the animal kingdom.

A really good read. I was sorry when I reached the end. Maybe it IS opinionated in places, but you might well have to think twice before you disagreed with him !

Roger Reports...

From the County & District Councils

After 16 months of Lock Down and 128,000 UK deaths the announcement of a relaxation in Covid Restrictions is debatable. To some liberation day on the 19th July marked a return to work and welcome social freedom ; to others restoring unrestricted association gambled on the July break becoming not another lull before the plague bout returns. Even so, for good or ill 'freedom' came too late to prevent many summer events being cancelled. At Milnthorpe both the popular Art Exhibition and the Horticultural Show will not go ahead for a second year. But the **Branch Library (Milnthorpe) is to re-open with reduced hours. For times please contact 015395 63040.**

Happily, Westmorland County Show which, for the first time will be on two weekdays, will go ahead in the second week in September. Already, in July busier roads and the sight of a few passengers on the hitherto empty buses trundling through the villages had already indicated more activity. Unfortunately our proximity to the badly infected Lancashire towns, from which a huge proportion of Lakeland tourists come, spells risks for our area. Yet while anticipating a tourist influx, swollen by continued restrictions on overseas travel, Cumbria Covid Cases peaked in north Cumbria rather than in South Lakeland's tourist traps. Carlisle with more than 300 cases per 100k per week is now higher than the England Average but lower than the North West average.

In 'a fingers crossed statement', Colin Cox, Cumbria County Council's Health supremo added, that 'the Cumbria peak will be lower than in Bolton and Blackburn'. I am told that some house to

house vaccinations patrols have gone round in Kendal and Barrow but not, yet, in any local villages. Thanks to the vaccination programme, admissions to hospitals remains low. Fortunately, our two local hospitals are expanding their facilities. I can now have my six monthly CT scan check-up in a new X-Ray suite in Westmorland General Hospital . Lancaster Royal Infirmary has new operating theatres and I'm sure all users will rejoice that LRI is building a new 500 space car-park.

Overall Covid has ceased to be as frightening as it was at the peak of the epidemic. In January it was the top cause of UK deaths ; now it is number 20. Hopefully hospitals may now be able to reduce the back log in treating other conditions. Meanwhile Councils have to tackle the Social and financial costs of the epidemic. Because of home working domestic burglaries have dropped and quiet roads have cut motor crimes. Although , reduced social mixing was expected to contribute to a rise in domestic abuse, cases in South Lakeland remain steady with 946 reports in 2020 compared to 983 in 2021. One clear indication of hardship is that the number of households in temporary accommodation has increased from a SLDC annual maximum of 27 in 2019 to 33 in 2020. The financial effects on Councils are even more complex and will take time to analyse –so I'll report on them later. In the meantime let us enjoy the summer. All the best –Roger.

PC Observations...

JULY 2021 MEETING

The July parish council meeting started as most have been doing recently, with frustration that yet again there was no Police Report. County Cllr Bingham was asked to see if he could exert his influence at a higher level to get this sorted.

The Open Forum first of all dealt with an email about traffic on Main St. Specifically, it has been noted that buses often wait in The Square, with engines running, if they are ahead of their schedule. This is not only adding to pollution in the middle of the village but causes traffic congestion at what is now the narrowest part of Main St. The clerk would write to Stagecoach asking for the waiting area to be away from the village centre.

It had also been reported that Slape Lane is overgrown and largely impassable. A suggestion was made that a 'self-help' working party group might tackle the offending vegetation. The council stated that this could not be a council led venture and the clerk has reported the problem to Countryside Access.

Following on from last month's letter about issues around the Boon Town development the clerk had written clarifying a couple of points. Additionally, residents had had a meeting with the contractors and (I think) some of the issues were resolved or explained.

County Cllr Bingham's report noted that there were currently 2016 COVID cases in Cumbria. He also reported a rather alarming occurrence when reporting a problem to a department at Cumbria County Council. Having given the correct address of a location as Holme, Carnforth, he received the answer that as Carnforth was not in the County it was not their responsibility!

Then back to traffic and parking. Aware that this is a perennial problem for the village, the council have decided to appoint a Parking and Traffic Working Group. This will comprise of Cllrs Bailey, Wilson and Wren, whose remit seems to be to deal with all matters relating and investigate possible options and solutions. Just a simple task then!

It was also decided that all cllrs should have a Council specific email account. The clerk will set this up and it should ensure that all dealings of the council are transparent and auditable.

The PSiCA and drainage work saga is not over yet. Work should start again in 2/3 weeks - possibly has started by the time you read this - and will result in a road closure on Wednesday and Thursday nights. Additionally, further flood relief work will start to the west of Main St

Other items on the Action list, a possible market and provision of skate park or similar are progressing, but slowly. And finally, SLDC are still looking for a name for the Boon Town development

despite having been told some while ago that the council's suggestion is Middy Croft.

The date of the next meeting is Thursday 19th August at 7.30pm.

The Word From **BURTON MEMORIAL HALL**



Readers will know that all the legal restrictions brought in to deal with stopping the spread of Covid have now been removed, but despite that, the Hall still has a duty to provide a safe environment for its hirers, so here's a summary of what that means in terms of Covid.

The Hall will retain its existing provision of hand sanitiser and anti-viral wipes, and hirers are encouraged to continue wearing masks indoors wherever possible, especially if there are vulnerable people attending their sessions. The QR code posters will remain in place and hirers and attendees are encouraged to scan them on entry to the premises, likewise hirers are requested to continue completing the attendance logs for their sessions and popping them in the collection boxes by the doors. By doing so you will be helping the NHS Track and Trace service. Hirers will also still be covered by the Special Conditions of Hire which require that touched surfaces are cleaned with the wipes provided at the end of the session, and all rubbish generated during the session should be removed to the outdoor waste bin at the north end of the Hall. Our kitchens are now fully open once more.

The Hall committee has undertaken an

updated Risk Assessment of the premises to ensure it remains a Covid-secure building, and hirers are requested to review their Risk Assessment or, if they haven't yet done one, to create one for their activity please. A copy of this when completed or updated should be sent to the Hall secretary/manager Helen Dawson either by email or in print.

To help keep the people who attend your sessions safe it is recommended that the use of hand sanitiser (or hand washing) continues, especially so for those groups using shared equipment or who play table games, etc., and that good ventilation is provided by keeping windows or doors open during your session. If you need any other advice about staying safe in your sessions at the Hall please feel free to give me a call on 01524 781306.

By the time you read this column it is planned that work should have started on the replacement of the two main entrance doorways with double-glazed uPVC units. These will help keep the Hall more secure, and will also retain heat during the colder months. Our thanks go to The Hadfield Trust for their grant which has helped to make this work possible.

You may also have observed the new car park signs in place - these are a reminder that the car park is private land - but that the Hall committee has no objection to occasional parking whilst residents pop into the village shop or drop off/pick up children from school so long as there are spaces and hirers don't need them. The Bridge Club will be resuming their sessions on the 4th August and every subsequent Wednesday, which means that there will be a demand for

spaces in the car park on those evenings from around 6pm until 10pm. The weekly visit by the Fish and Chip van each Tuesday will also continue, so please remember to leave the spaces in front of the three small north end windows clear so they can park there, then we can all continue to enjoy our chippie teas

NATURE NOTES by Bryan Yorke

These months seem to be whizzing past! But the air has been filled with orchids for me and more orchids after spending each day over the past month or two studying these special flowers we are so lucky to have and on our very own doorstep. And it's so good to get photos or measure them or just put two and two together to try and see similarities between this and that! I guess if we want variety then up on Burton Fell we have it. Dark Red Helleborines is the main orchid for me, but it does not stop at that, they come in the regular red colours (all different shades of reds), and then we go almost to the other end of the spectrum and have Pallens varieties they are usually just a yellow or a green version, it's very special and in some years we have as many as 10 up there, but this year has been poor for the Pallens with only 4 on show. We also have the Bicolors which again are a variety with the sepals red or purple and the petals mainly a yellow, but the contrast makes them look very special. I still have not mentioned the hybrids we have with a very complicated feel to the name of *Epipactis schmalhauseneii*. We don't have many of these but certainly we will have about 5 or 6 tucked away on the Fell. I am constantly checking through them to see if I can find another hybrid. This year I did find one, and gave it a Specimen No and it just so happened that the number is 100, but the name does not reflect how many! It's showing already a fabulous amount of 60 flowers. No! it's almost the record, that's held by Specimen 15d which managed 62 flowers. The Dark Reds will be long gone by the time you read this, but I am still busy with the Broad Leaved Helleborines, a lot larger plant which

are known to grow up to one metre. We have several hi-vigour specimens on the Fell. I won't go into the many varieties with these other than two which are coming through and that's the "Chlorantha" (white flower) and the "Purpurea" (purple flower). I'll be checking behind every bush!

Wow! It's been great for butterflies with again the main topical interest seems to have been the High Brown Fritillaries of which our stronghold at Holme Stinted Pastures is still ranked as one of THE best places in the whole of the UK to see these rare beauties. This year Jules and company (from Edge Hill University) who are carrying out her Ph.d studies has been there most days observing and monitoring were the High Brown have been laying their eggs. From the odd brief conversation she tells me they are doing OK this year. Also this year I have seen plenty of it's cousin the Dark Green Fritillary. It's been superb for the Grayling which is probably the king when it comes to having limestone areas for its home. It always interest me how the butterfly lands and within a split second or two will fall over on its side with the side always facing into the sun! When somebody first mentioned about Grayling I thought they were talking about a fish! Also had Northern Brown Argus, Dingy Skipper, Large Skipper, Small Heaths, Meadow Browns and the fabulous Ringlets which have spread like wildfire in our areas.

When I am up on the Fell I am constantly reminded that the Green Woodpecker lives here and I hear them yaffling along with all the young ones as well. I have had Tree Pipits up there, the sky some mornings have been filled with lots of our local Swifts, Swallows and House Martins hawking

the skies collecting insects especially for their young which will be well on their way. To think by the time you read this most if not all our Swifts will be well on their way back to Africa. Our Cuckoos are I believe now already back in Africa and their young ones will leave us about mid-August to make their way back unaided. OK folks enjoy your nature.....

If you have never been you don't know what you are missing this village tradition is a sight to behold if your new to the village come along and see what it's all about, you won't be disappointed.

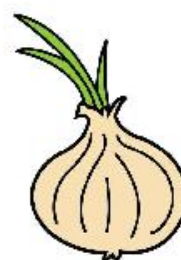
The Onion show only happens once a year come and be part of it.

Vicar's Letter...

Making Headway

Dear Friends

What's been happening at church? Services are now returning to normal with singing and unmasked smiles again (though people are of course free to use masks if they wish). It's been great to see the congregation returning to the building over the last 7 months with some new faces too. Come and join us – you will be very welcome!

We love to be involved as much as we can with Burton Morewood School but that has been difficult this year. However the Open the Book team have been producing excellent narrated videos of Bible stories which have been shown at the school and I was able to video my own assembly presentations on Mark's Gospel to send in. From Easter I have been able to speak to the whole school on the playing field on Thursday mornings – and it didn't rain even once! Just recently Yr 5 and 6 students wrote lots of thought-provoking questions for me to attempt to answer in a 50 minute 'grilling' and we finished the term with the Year 6 leavers' service in church. We hope that even more will be possible from September.

Alongside raising funds to repair the church vestry – thank you to everyone who has already contributed to that fund – we have also been repairing the Atkinson Room roof (this work paid for by the congregation). While investigating rain-water leaks we discovered that the 16th Century roof needed urgent work. Moving the chancel wall in 1870 had weakened the structure and more recent rot in

the rafter ends had added to the problem. We expect that the repairs will be finished during August.

And if you have been wondering about the digging around the back of the church we have been finding out where the storm-water drains go to – the answer ... nowhere! So in the autumn we hope to lay new pipes from all the gullies to proper soakaways within the churchyard.

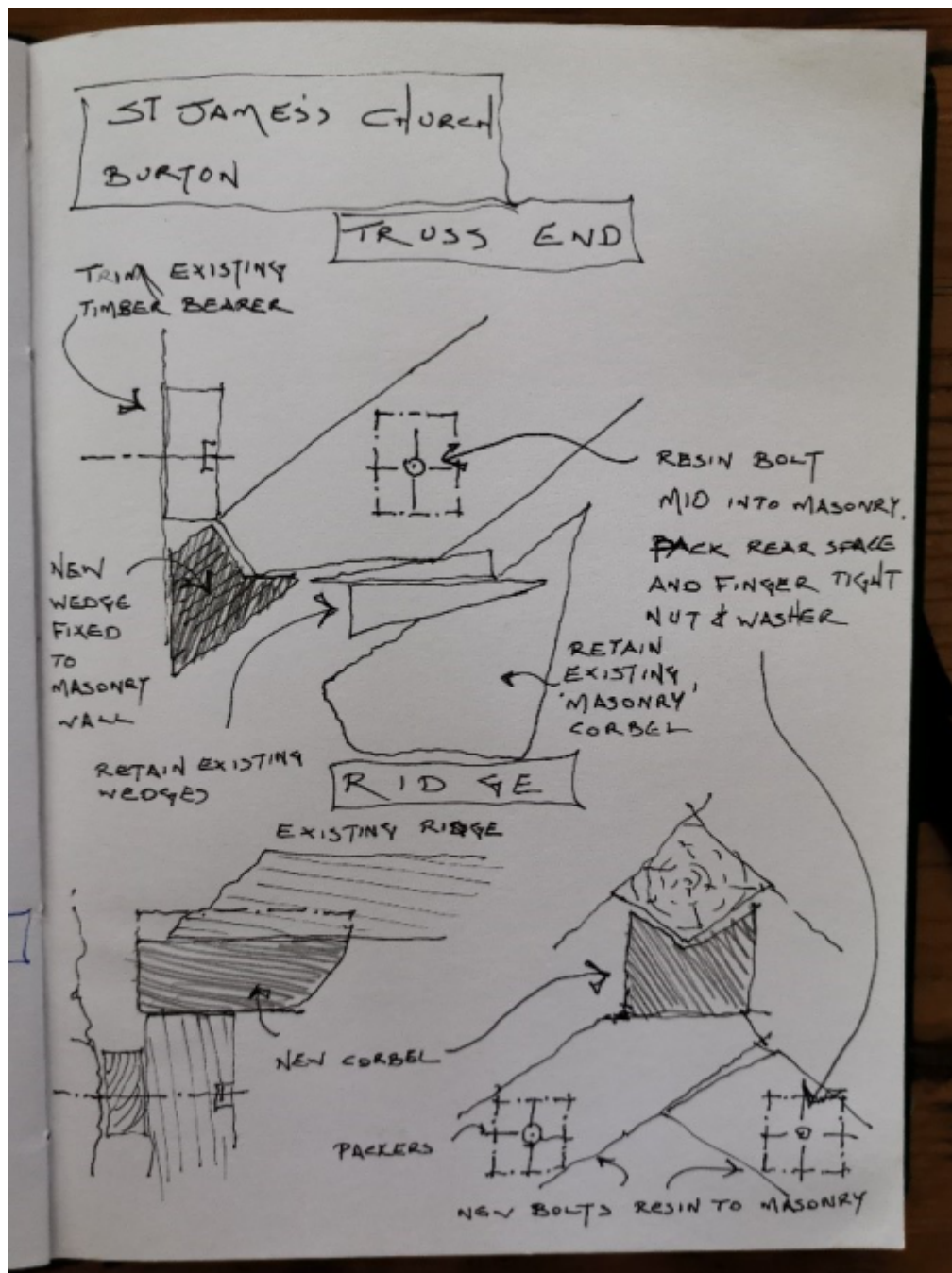

HISTORICAL FOOTNOTE

by Roger Bingham

Burton's 'highly respectable Show' 1849.

Late summer is the season for our village Horticultural Shows invariably held in August and September. In the mid nineteenth century 'The Burton Floral and Horticultural Society' staged one of the district's most distinguished shows. It was also one of the oldest. Milnthorpe held its first horticultural show in 1878 and its current show dates only from 1941. Later Burton's Horticultural Show merged with the Agricultural Show where the garden produce classes were popular features until the Show's sad demise following the 2001 Foot and Mouth Epidemic.

Clearly Burton show was already well established when the Westmorland Gazette reported in September 1851 that 'Burton's annual exhibition was held in the School room on the ninth instant. The attendance was highly respectable, but perhaps not so numerous as it has been on former occasions. The show of flowers was good and exceeded the expectation of all present as an impression had gone abroad that on account of the unfavourableness of the season many varieties had not come to perfection.

The Competition for dahlias was very close, and took the judges some time to award the respective prizes. Edward Hornby Esq., of Dalton Hall was the most successful competitor. The heaths and greenhouse plants exhibited by James Cropper Esq., of Burton and William Sharp Esq., of

Linden Hall were splendid. A collection of seedling fuschias(sic) shown by Mr Carden were much admired as was his collection of Gardenias. The judges paid Mr Smith, gardener to Mr Carden, a very high complement for his skill in rearing such perfect specimens. Richard Gillow Esq., of Leighton Hall, Richard Atkinson Esq., of Kirkby Lonsdale and Mr Garnett of Burton were also successful exhibitors in flowers fruit and vegetables and carried off numerous prizes. The fruit shown was not so large but was still very good. In the vegetable department, there was an abundance, and of first rate quality. The potatoes were the best we ever remembered. The judges were Mr Ward, gardener, Sizergh Castle and Mr Brown of Dallam Tower whose decisions gave general satisfaction. RKB.
