It's that time of year again....... A Note from the Post Office about Christmas Posting 2022

Where did 2022 go?? The information we have so far about last posting dates was produced before the Royal Mail & Parcelforce strikes, so we cannot be certain of the effects that they may have. The Village Post Office will remain open, our normal hours, to accept your parcels. A leaflet with useful information is available in the Post Office but I have summarised the latest recommended posting dates below:

Remember that parcels sent outside the U.K. need to have a customs form attached, these are available at the Post Office Counter. Also remember to put your name and address on the top left hand corner of the front of your package; this will enable Royal Mail to return your item should overseas customs authorities refuse it entry into their country.

The usual reminder about size and weight for parcels sent abroad using Royal Mail. The maximum total of (length + width + height) is 90 cm (approx 3ft) with the maximum single dimension of 60cm (approx 2 ft). Also, the maximum weight is 2 kg. It is really easy to exceed these and then the parcel would cost a great deal more to send via Parcel Force. It is sometimes cheaper to split a heavy parcel and send two packets.

Dangerous Goods

To comply with national and international regulations governing the carriage of mail, and to ensure that mail in transport does not present a danger to the general public, Royal Mail must restrict or prohibit certain items from their network.

So this year we will once again have to ask you what are the contents of your parcels; not just because we are being nosy or looking for gift ideas ourselves, but because there are restrictions on items containing, for example, batteries, nail varnish, perfume, aerosols etc.

Lithium batteries (the type commonly found in mobile phones and laptops), cannot be sent alone, and for international mail they must be packaged in the equipment. Beware, some countries do not permit the import of lithium batteries at all

As always, come & ask us at the Post Office Counter for further advice. Gill.



Roger Reports...

From the County & District Councils

Council News

This last month there have been full no District or County Council meetings. In any case business of these soon-to-be-defunct bodies is dwindling as is attendance by members. But for those of us who are left, much routine work continues.

Cumbria's Development and Regulations Committee received a satisfactory safety report on sports grounds providing for 500 spectators. But we were reminded that local committees and Parish Councils must keep up to date with monthly inspections of village playing fields.

On environmental matters I have asked for help from a £600,000 Environment government grant towards combating Ash Tree Die Back, but I was told that no assistance could be provided to private owners of contaminated trees even though, I argued, that the costs of felling them may be beyond the means of many owners and so die-back trees would be left standing. I am also bothered about the 'drowning' of trees on the mosses following rises in water level caused by climate change.

In 'our' Lower Kentdale Division stretching from Heversham marsh and through Holme and Burton mosses to Hale Moss, skeletons of trees are obvious as are the almost perpetually full drainage dykes. Here the Environment Agency is the monitoring authority, again, the costs have to be met by landowners.

Socially we have had discussions on poverty following reports that inflation in costs of food and non-alcoholic drinks has risen by 12% since June. We were worried that some users of food banks found it difficult to access the agencies responsible for issuing the necessary tokens. Particularly, I wondered how far national 'poverty statistics' took into account rurality and sparcity. I pointed out that unless one has a car (and can afford to run it) in the countryside, it may be very difficult to obtain an all-year-round supply of fresh fruit and vegetables. Already, the local Committee has contributed £20,000 to relieve child poverty.

I remain busy as Vice-Chairman of The Police and Crime Panel and am pleased to report an uplift to 1,349 officers, the highest number in the Force's history. Plans to integrate the Fire and Rescue service with the Police Force are going ahead. In the meantime, we will have to start thinking about the coronation celebrations. While already trying to keep warm, let's hope for a mild winter. Warm regards Roger.

Parish Council Report - Anita Shelton

Once again, there was only one resident of the village in attendance. All residents are invited to attend, and will always be welcomed.

At the Open Forum one of the Burton News editors, on behalf of the editorial committee, presented a request to the Parish Council for a financial contribution towards the cost of production. The Council agreed to consider this request at their November meeting.

In addition to the regular business matters, which were all addressed, it was proposed that a number of places within the village be registered as Assets of Community Value. An Asset of Community Value is a building or piece of land that is, or has recently been, used to further the social wellbeing or interests of the local community and could do so in the future. The aim is that, if the asset comes up for sale, the community will be given a fair chance to make a bid to buy it on the open market. The meeting agreed to submit nominations in respect of the village shop, the playground, the Kings Arms, the MUGA and the Memorial Hall.

Very little further information was provided in respect of the speed indicator devices at each end of the village, although it was acknowledged that traffic does seem to respond to the initial alert and reduce speed subsequently. Currently the device at the South end of the village records speeds before the 30mph zone is entered; the device will be adjusted to, hopefully, correct this.

Burton Bowling Club

The season has finally wound to a conclusion and it has been a good year for the Club on the playing side. The Roll of Honour includes Burton's own Carl Dobson who won the Morecambe League's Presidents Day Cup, Paul Kissock of our Morecambe League team who finished at the top of the League individual Merit Table, the Veterans Team won the Second Division Championship in a nail-biting finish on the last day of the season and so gained promotion to Division One next year. In the Lune Valley Floodlit League our team finished second and at the time of writing have one further match to play in the Floodlit Pairs Cup. In the Kendal League our A team finished 6th in Division 1 and our B team 3rd in Division 2.

Thoughts are already turning to next season, as it is necessary to carry out Autumn and Winter greens maintenance to ensure a satisfactory playing surface. Already the green has been scarified, slit seeded, over seeded and had a top dressing applied under the watchful eyes of Russ Coates, Nick Watts and other helpers. It is hoped and anticipated that there will also be an upgrade of the floodlights by next season.

The Club's AGM will be on Thursday 10th November at 7.30 in the Memorial Hall. All members are urged to attend.

HISTORICAL FOOTNOTE by Roger Bingham

BUDGET TIME ---- 1798.

It is around about now that County, District, and Parish councils set their annual budget and receive the audited accounts from the previous year. Two hundred and twenty-four years ago there was no Parish Council, and the townships of Burton and Preston Patrick were ruled by St. James's Church Vestry Meeting which, with the Overseers of the Poor, conducted day to day local administration.

The Vestry also acted as His Majesty King George III's collectors for an extra tax called a "Patriotic Contribution towards the Defence of the Country" in the war against revolutionary France. Burton's contribution was recorded in a letter sent to Thomas Sill Esq, the local clerk.

"Sir, - I am directed by the Committee of Merchants, Bankers, Traders and other inhabitants of the Metropolis, to acknowledge the Receipt of your Favor (sic) dated the 7th inst. Remittance 96:0:0: subscribed at Burton in Kendal in the County of Westmorland.

The Committee desire me to express, on behalf of the Public their warmest thanks and to request a continuance of the laudable Exertions you have already made in support of a cause which involves the existence of the country & the Preservation of every thing that is valuable in Society. I am Sir, Yours:- Samuel Lord.

Secretary to the Lord Mayor The Mansion House, London."

Incidentally it is interesting to see that a letter posted in reply about the 11th was replied to from London only three days later. It also shows how much communications had improved in the last half of the eighteenth century. In 1745 it had taken four days for the news to reach Kendal that Bonnie Prince Charlie and his Jacobite rebels were in Penrith - 30 miles away.

By 1798 Burton was on the main stage-coaching route thanks to the new toll roads like the Heronsyke (Burton) to Eamont Bridge (Penrith) turnpike which ran through Westmorland. One wonders how it is that despite modern IT that His Majesty's King Charles III's Whitehall Civil Servants often take longer to reach us up North.

In 1798 the wardens were William Roberts, Roger Dickinson, James Evans junior, Thomas Shepherd, and Edwin Harrison. I hope they were impressed by Whitehall's efficiency but perhaps they just grumbled about the government's exorbitant exactions and inefficiencies in the manner of local government functionaries in every age!

Centuries ago many countryfolk believed in the existence of witches and took measures in an attempt to ward off a visitation by the aforementioned. One measure that could be used was to buy or even manufacture a talisman in the form of a witches mark which could be displayed in a prominent place on your premises.

These "marks" took the form of a circular piece of lead inscribed with a geometric pattern which was usually around three inches in diameter or (for the younger ones) 5 cms.




This item, found locally, would have been used in one of the older cottages or other premises where it would have been relied upon to do the business.

Vicar's Letter...

Dear Friends

"Owe no-one anything" says the Apostle Paul. He cannot mean it is always wrong to borrow because Jesus says not to "turn away from the one who wants to borrow from you", but he is saying it is good to pay what vou owe. We know how we feel when someone fails to repay what we lent them, but we also know that anyone can get caught in a debt trap – illness, redundancy, divorce, inflation and a thousand other things can suddenly leave us unable to pay what we've promised. God commanded the nation of Israel to have compassion for the debtor while making it possible for them to repay what they owe. If the economic predictions are right we are going to need lots of that wisdom in the months ahead.

A number of churches in this area, including our village church, have provided the resources for a CAP Debt Centre in Kendal: www.kendaldebtcentre.org This is up and running and providing free help for people in Kendal. We now want to find a way to offer the same help here in our village because it is not just needed in our big towns. The Debt Centre do not give money; they give compassionate and practical longterm support, handling all the communications with banks, and other lenders, while their clients gradually set themselves free from debt.

"The borrower is the slave of the lender" says the Bible. That's very true, we are not free when we owe money. It's always best not to get into debt with anyone, and it's good when people become debt free.

Our government recently discovered how little freedom they had to do what they thought was right while our nation still owes so much - £2.4 trillion at the last count of national debt, or £35,000 for every man, woman and child. We are slaves to the lenders.

One more Bible comment about a mountain of a different kind of debt that we owe God because of our disregard of his laws. We cannot clear this but God has himself paid the price to cancel "the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross." 
