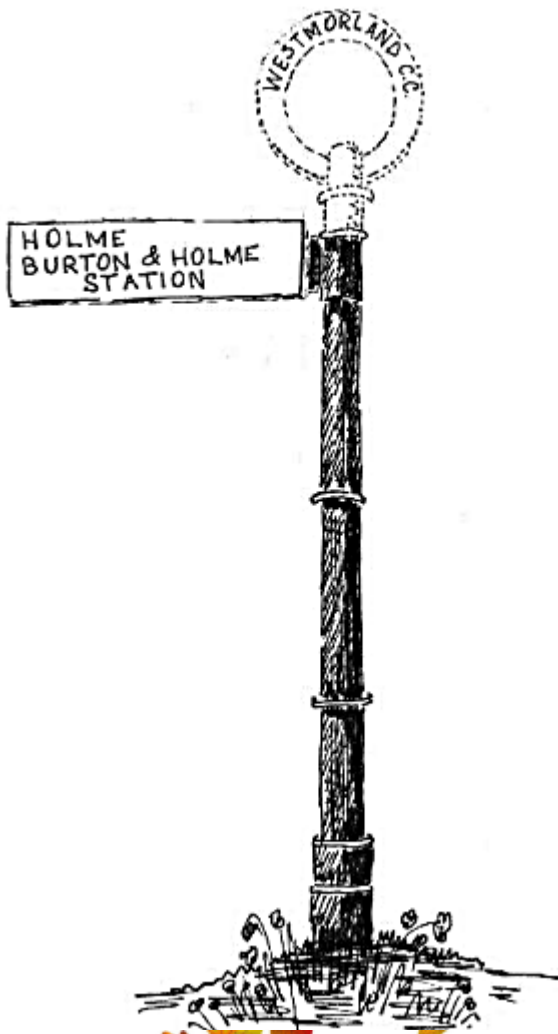

Burton-in-Kendal Swift Group

Swiftwatch Count 2023

The swifts have now left us for the skies over Africa, having nested successfully again in Burton, thanks to the property owners who have allowed access. Our village is part of a growing nationwide effort to protect these amazing birds and provide more nest sites for them.

The Royal Hotel has been used by swifts for many years. The work on the hotel has brought about some interesting results. Swifts are normally very loyal to their nest sites. Some have proved their loyalty by flying in between the scaffold to continue to nest in five of fourteen recorded nest holes.

Others appear to have moved to the new Oak Court houses behind The Royal where seven of the ten holes have been used this year. Renovations often lead to a complete loss of nest sites. In this case, thankfully, the builder agreed to leave entrances to nest sites open and also to create new nest sites in his new build.

The total of 25 sites used this year equals the highest previous total in 2018. There may be more, as it is only by close observation that they are spotted as they fly straight into the holes at about 40 mph. Turn your head away and you miss them. Our weekly records can be seen on the Facebook site set up and managed by Matthew.

Watching the swifts as they fly high into the clouds, before gliding down, sometimes forming screaming parties is a joy. How many is hard to say, but the highest count at one time was 30 in July. This is similar to previous years

In the new Meadow Close houses there was a report of swifts using some of the built-in swift bricks, but this was not confirmed. Whilst they are close to the village centre it may take a few years for them to be used, though some might already have been checked out for next year.

Thanks to members of our group for coming along and spending time gazing at the skies and spotting swifts entering their nests.

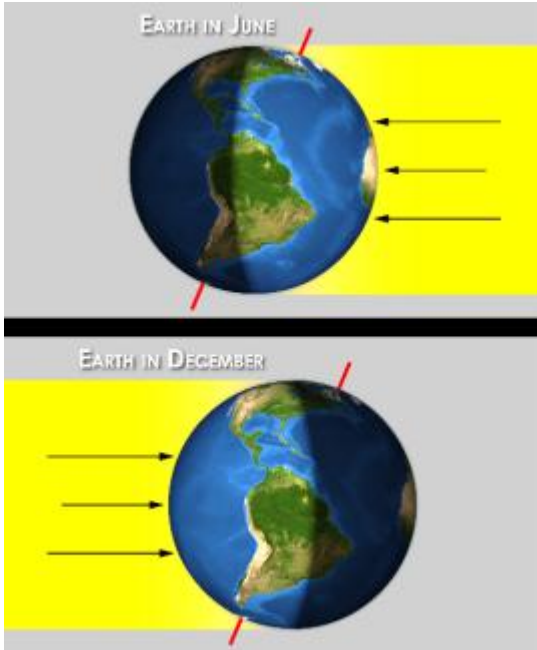
The plaque on the outer wall near the South entrance was erected by the Burton Parish Council. The image below is a transcription of the text added over a photograph of the plaque.

Almost Dark Skies Over Burton

As I write this we have in Burton just started to have true “astronomical darkness” again, for a short period in the middle of the night, the first time since the second week in May. “So what?” you may well be thinking. Well as astrophotographers looking deep into the cosmos at ridiculously faint objects, this true darkness really matters for gleaning the detail from deepsky nebulae.



But why does it vary at all, and have you ever taken a moment to think about the mass of terminology we have for describing what we all take for granted – night and day and the transition from one to the other? Dawn, dusk, twilight(s), sunrise, sunset, golden hour.... I’m sure you can think of more. As with so much of what makes our home planet such a magical and incredible place, it is that 23° tilt we have on the axis the earth spins on with respect to the sun giving us changing amounts of daylight and darkness. Yes, it is responsible for our seasons and all that that implies, but also what we all take for granted – this ever changing cycle of night and day length the further one moves from the equator.

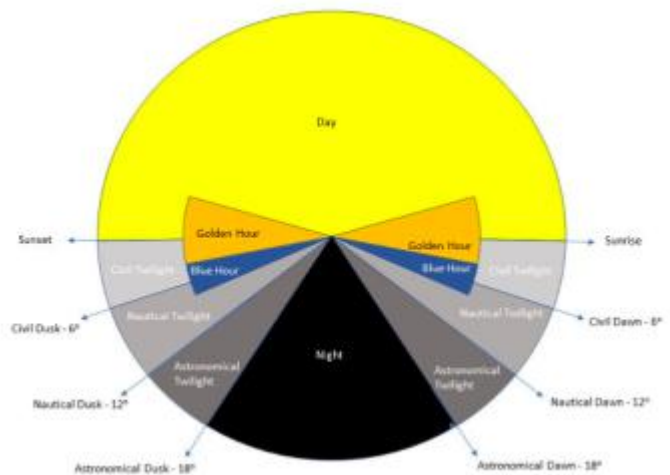
The terms “sunrise” and “sunset” are pretty self explanatory in the sun appearing to slide its way above and below the horizon respectively at the start and end of a day. But what about some of the others? “Dawn” and “dusk” tend to be used as all-encompassing terms for the three stages of “Twilight.” Yes there are considered to be three and although they are all part of a continuum, they do have their own specific criteria.

The Three Types of Twilight

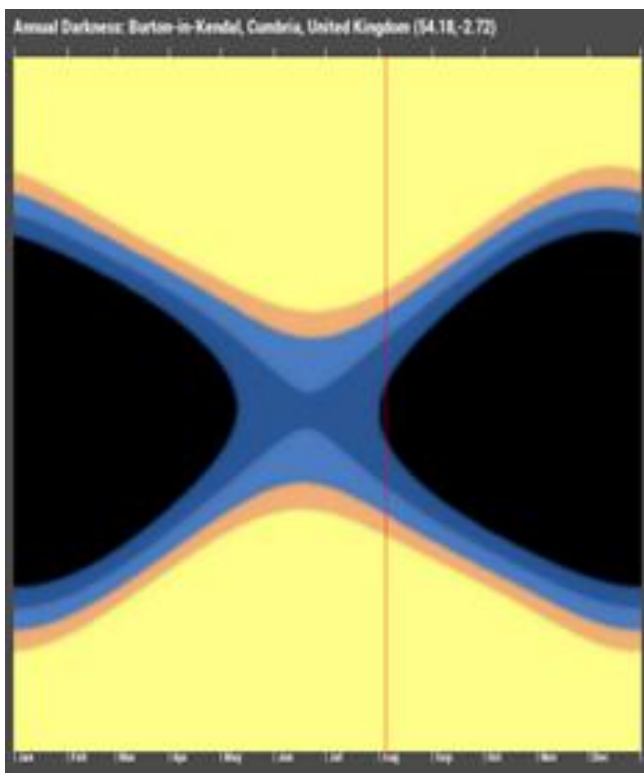
In its most general sense, twilight is the period of time before sunrise and after sunset, in which the atmosphere is partially illuminated by the sun, being neither totally dark nor completely lit. However, three categories of twilight are defined by how far the sun is below the horizon:

Civil Twilight; Begins in the morning, or ends in the evening, when the geometric center of the sun is between 0° & 6° below the horizon. Under these conditions, absent of fog or other restrictions, the brightest stars and planets can be seen, the horizon and terrestrial objects can be discerned, and in many cases, artificial lighting is not needed.

Nautical Twilight; Begins and ends, when the geometric center of the sun is between 6° & 12° below the horizon. The term nautical twilight historically refers to sailors being able to take reliable readings via well known stars because the horizon is still visible, even under moonless conditions. Absent of fog or other restrictions, outlines of terrestrial objects may still be discernible, but detailed outdoor activities are likely curtailed without artificial illumination.



Astronomical Twilight; Begins in the morning, or ends in the evening, when the geometric center of the sun is between 12° & 18° degrees below the horizon. In astronomical twilight, sky illumination is so faint that most casual observers would regard the sky as fully dark. Under astronomical twilight, the horizon is not discernible and moderately faint stars or planets can be observed with the naked eye under a non light-polluted sky. Point light sources such as stars and planets can be readily studied by astronomers under astronomical twilight. But diffuse light sources such as galaxies, nebula, and globular clusters need to be observed under a totally dark sky, when the sun is more than 18 degrees below the horizon.



This chart shows how night and day (as well as the three types of twilight) vary over a year in Burton. At the equator this would appear a series of near horizontal bands for each stage whereas at the poles and high latitudes it would show separated lobes of darkness on either side and 24hour daylight through the centre months marking the times of the midnight sun (Northern hemisphere). The Golden Hour (sometimes referred to as the Magic Hour) is often defined as the first and last hour of sunlight in the day when the special quality of light due to the low angle of the sun yields particularly beautiful photographs.

Vicar's Letter...

Growing up

Dear Friends,

On 24th September it will be 10 years since I began as the minister of Burton and Holme. I sometimes think that nothing has changed much in that time (I don't look that much older!) but children are an inescapable reminder of the passing of years. Those who were in Reception when I began are now entering Year 10 to study for their GCSEs and many of those who were in the top year at our primary schools are now working or at university. As of July, we no longer have teenagers in our own family.

Children, of course, are meant to grow up! Parents and teachers have a responsibility to train children, to pass on wisdom and a love of learning and maturing, so that they grow in body, mind, character and abilities. But that's not enough, for our children or for us. Because we can only grow up to be like our teachers or our parents. And that means sharing the same disappointments in life and the same destiny – decline and death – that our teachers and parents faced.

God's Word says that children and adults also need to grow up in Jesus because he is the head of a new human family that will not be subject to frustration and decay. If we want to know what it is like to be truly human then we must look at Jesus – loving, trustworthy, self-controlled and fearless. If we become part of his family and grow up to be like him, then we will share in his glorious and forever-secure future. And in the same place (Ephesians 4) Paul says that church ministers have a foundational responsibility to make sure that the truth of the Bible, spoken in love, is bringing people to maturity in Christ.

I hope that you've been growing in Christ. I'm sorry if I've not been a help to you in that. I wish I could have been more fruitful over the last 10 years but I hope that you'll give me a chance to help you in the next 10, whether that's through our Sunday Services, our regular study and discussion groups like Christianity Explored, or in conversation whenever I meet you.

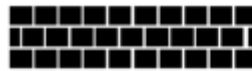

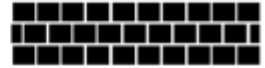
