Readers' LETTERS

On the 20th December I contacted Westmorland and Furness Council at 1 p.m concerning the pothole in the canal tunnel on Station Lane.

It was bad enough to cause a flat tyre. It has been getting worse for some time. At 10.30 on 21st December the highways crew arrived to repair it.

An operative said it was a repair which would not last long as the road under the tunnel needs a central drain to get rid of standing water.

He pointed out that if a flat tyre ensued, car owners should contact the council for reimbursement. The more complaints the greater the chance of a proper fix.

The council can only act if car drivers report potholes. They cannot spend time driving around to find them. An excellent response from Highways but they need to be informed.

Westmorland and Furness Council News from Vicky Hughes

The following is an update provided by Vicky Hughes, our local W&F councillor, to the Parish council:

A lot of the work of the new council has been around the rearranging of teams, for example in adult and children's social care, among others, to fit with the new boundaries. We are now starting to see vacancies filled although too many remain unappointed. This means that we can start getting on with the work and bring down some of the waiting times which have been too long and too numerous. Other initiatives, for example shared apprenticeships with the NHS, are being considered to help with staffing.

I am currently working with Healthwatch UK to hold a Health and Wellbeing Event at Burton Memorial Hall. The aim will be to better connect the community to third sector agencies to help battle loneliness, assist with socialising and addressing any health issues or concerns with the cost of living crisis. Some of the organisations we will approach would be Age UK, Cold to Cosy Homes, a mum's group, the local PCSO, Stroke Association, the GP Surgery (if they are available) and, Carers UK.

My local ambition is to work closely with my parishes to understand the needs of the community. The following are some examples I have already identified:

- A safe crossing for Burton Morewood School, the road is very busy and there are always parked cars obstructing the view for pedestrians. A safe crossing would benefit the whole community and would assist with keeping speeds to a minimum.
- A reasonable speed limit through the village of Hutton Roof, currently 60mph (national speed limit). There has already been one "near miss" last year on this stretch of road.
- The foot bridge over the canal in Holme is in serious disrepair and is not currently scheduled for repairs.
- Finally, Mansergh Parish council would like to purchase three defibrillators for their Parish.

I also want to add that I am currently looking at supporting the school through my local allowance to purchase some outside storage bins for the children's outside sports equipment, this is in its early stages and I will update you if there is any news.

I'm also chasing up the resurface work for the footpath that is outstanding for the new housing estate to ensure residents have safe access to Main Street from the new development – something that the Parish Council requested when the plans were submitted back in 2019.

I look forward to continuing all of this work in 2024. Happy New Year!

It's a date in Burton & Clawthorpe! History notes by Kath Hayhurst

Two of my great, great grandparents were married in Burton church on January 2nd 1841, by the Rev. Bryan Waller, vicar. They were Robert Longmire and Nanny Taylor. The bridegroom was a bachelor of 29 and a butcher of Troutbeck. The bride was a spinster of 24 , no occupation given.

The couple had 9 children in total, but 3 sadly died as babies. In the 1851 census Robert was recorded as a butcher and tenant farmer of 90 acres, at Low Lickbarrow, Troutbeck. He employed 3 male and 1 female servants. Robert died in 1863 at 51years old and Nanny, his wife became a laundress. The 1871 census has her living in Staveley. She died in 1879 at the age of 62.

Their eldest son, William Taylor Longmire, became an Artist, some of his paintings can be seen in Townend, a National Trust House in Troutbeck. There were several articles about him in the Cumbria & the Lake District magazine last year.

Robert and Nanny's fourth child, Mary Anne Longmire, was my great grandmother. She married her 2nd cousin once removed William Benson Longmire - so her surname didn't change. The Longmire family can be traced back to 1560 when my Great x 9 Grandfather William Langmyer was farming in the Lake District.

If you are interested in tracing your ancestors, The Cumbria Family History Society will be holding their annual conference, in Burton Memorial Hall, on June 1st

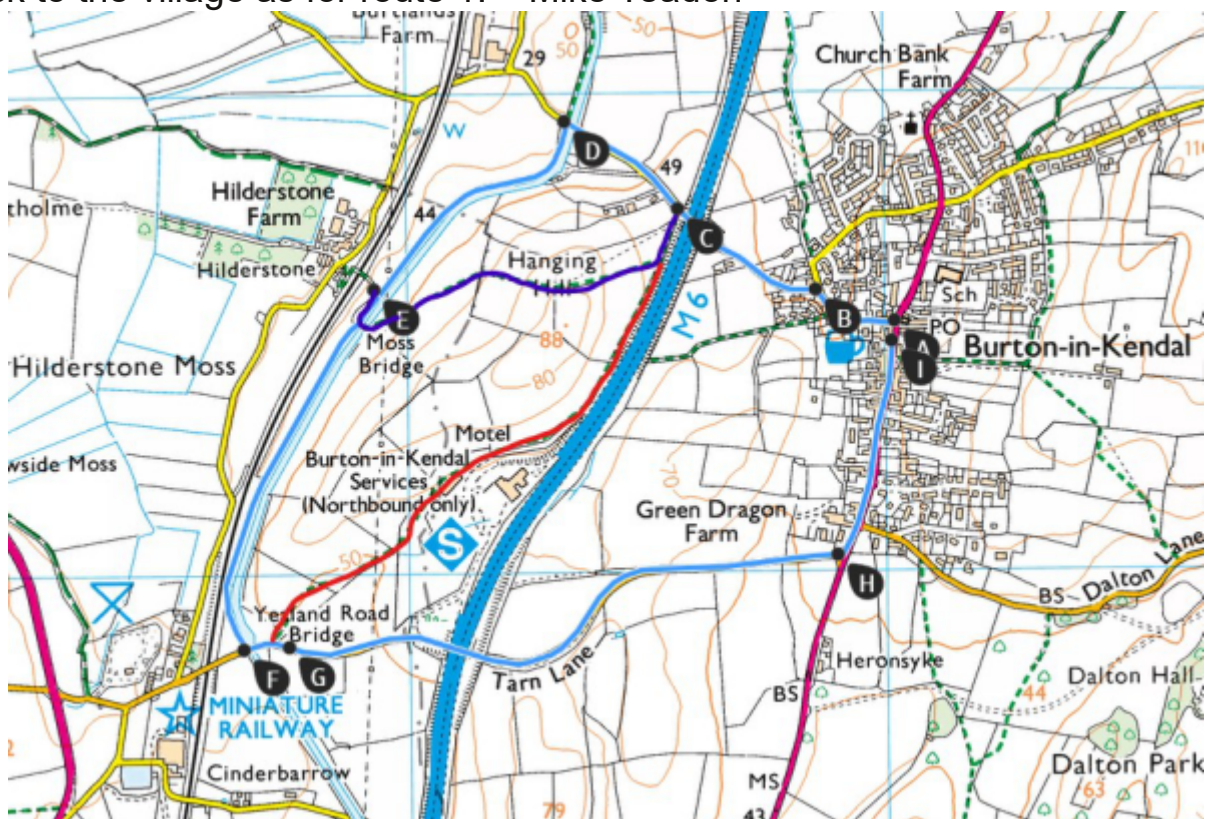


Mike's Meanderings Around Burton

There are many lovely walks around our village and now that Spring is just round the corner, it is an ideal time to get out and enjoy them. The first of these will be known to most villagers so is included mainly for people new to the village. It is approximately 4km and should take about an hour at a normal pace, it also makes a good run in dry weather. Set off anywhere in the village (shown from the PO on the map A), turn west down Neddy Hill or Tanpit's Lane, then along Drover's way (B) to Station Lane, head west again along Station Lane, to the other side of the bridge over the motorway (C). First route is to carry on down the hill under the canal aqueduct (D) up steps on Lt on to the tow path and bear right along the tow path to the second bridge along which is on Tarn Lane (F), join Tarn lane by going under the bridge and up the steps onto the road, turn right and cross the bridge back along Tarn Lane, back over the motorway, over the hill, down to the south end of the village at Green Dragon Farm (H).

There are two alternatives: One joins C to E using a footpath signposted "Hilderstone" on the right just past the M'way bridge. The path starts at a stile, cross this to a fenced track and then a gate on the right. Follow the track over two more stiles (sheep in fields) to regain the canal towpath at E. Turn right onto the towpath and follow route 1 back to the village.

The third route joins C to G and leaves the second route at the end of the fenced track, going through the gate in front of you rather than the one on the right, following the motorway fence over two stiles, past the back of Burton West service station, to end on Tarn Lane next to the canal bridge, turn left back to the village as for route 1. Vicar's Letter...

In the open

Dear Friends

Have you ever been blamed for something you did not do? Even for a minor classroom offence the false accusation can sting. Especially if others knew who really threw the ball of paper but no-one was prepared to speak up.

For the postmasters who were accused of theft, their anger and despair must have multiplied as the years went by without a way to prove their innocence. And that is just one example among many in our country where people seem to have concealed, distorted or spun the truth to suit themselves. How can we live in such a nation without despair?

Here's three convictions that, if they were widely held, would transform life in a world of lies:

1. Objective truth exists. Whatever is true is true for you and it's true for me. There's no such thing as 'my truth'. Believing that truth is relative leads to the depressing conclusion that nothing is certain and no-one's word is better than another's. But there is truth that is objectively, eternally, truly true because there is an eternal God who is not part of creation and who knows and speaks the truth about all things. "I am the Lord, and there is no other ... I, the Lord, speak the truth; I declare what is right." (Isaiah 45:18-19)
2. Always speak the truth. With very few exceptions (like preventing enemies causing harm) we should always speak truthfully. We do this because we want to live in an honest nation, and because we don't want to destroy ourselves by giving lies a foothold in our hearts. But most of all we speak the truth because God commands it: "You shall not give false testimony against your neighbour." (Exodus 20:16)
3. Trust God to judge justly. Human justice is always prone to fail; no-one can discern the truth about everything. But God will judge justly. No facts will be forgotten and no cover-up will survive. God knows every keystroke on every Horizon terminal in every Post Office. "And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, and books were opened ... [They] were judged according to what they had done as recorded in the books." (Revelation 20:12)

Perfect justice is appealing, until we remember that our own lies will be exposed too. How will we survive such an examination? Can God forgive and still be a just judge? I'll answer that next month.

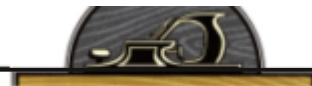

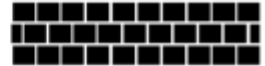
