

Parish Council Annual Meeting – 21st March 2024

Chairman Mr Mason-Hornby welcomed 3 members of the public and Councillor Vicky Hughes to the meeting. After agreeing the minutes of the 2023 meeting the Chairman made his report, and thanked Christine the Parish Clerk and his councillor colleagues for their work over the past year. The Council has 2 vacancies and is keen to fill them - nominations for the 2nd May elections close on 5th April.

It has been a quieter year for the Parish Council, as local planning applications have reduced quite a bit, perhaps due to economic conditions. The Council has successfully ensured the registration of 3 village amenitiess as 'Assets of Community Value' – the Memorial Hall, the Playground and the MUGA - more are planned.

As highlighted in their articles in the last 2 editions of Burton News, the Parish Council is extremely keen to engage with the village community to shape its policy and action plan for the coming years. It is being supported in this by the charity ACT (ACTion with communities in Cumbria). Carole Barr from ACT gave a short introduction on how community led planning can be conducted. We can expect to see more on this in coming months – please do get involved!





As always, it's been a busy and eventful spring term here at Burton Morewood Primary School. From fundraising to skiing, singing to gardening; our staff, as ever, are working incredibly hard to ensure the best opportunities and learning for our children.

In February, Year 5 and Year 6 children travelled to Manchester Arena to participate in the Young Voices event, the world's largest choir! Children from hundreds of primary schools gathered together to perform songs together. It was a truly magical experience that children, parents and staff enjoyed enormously!



Our School Council have been fundraising for their chosen charity; 'Wheels for All', which supports the Inclusive Cycling programme that embraces children and adults with disabilities and differing needs to enjoy cycling activities. This term, the Council children planned and delivered a 'Circus Day'! Children paid a £1 'fine' to come to school dressed in circus themed clothes and take part in a range of skills like juggling and spinning plates! They raised a total of £175 which, when added to previous fundraising initiatives, makes a total of £340 this year!

We also welcomed back John and Poppy Spens, the founders of The Brickworks charity, to talk to us about the next phase of our support for Macedonia School, our twin school in Uganda. Due to evolving circumstances in Uganda and South Sudan, many of the children who attended Macedonia School are now returning to South Sudan, leading to the school's closure. We are hoping to twin with a school called Yei in St Phillips, Lizera to continue to support the children and families in South Sudan via the fantastic Brickworks charity.

World Book Day 2024 saw our school family coming to school dressed as a 'word'! We had lots of fun guessing what word we had dressed as – some were easier than others!

We also celebrated all things reading in a variety of ways; this included a 'Book in a Box' competition where children recreated scenes and characters from their favourite books in a shoe box. We were blown away by the amount of entries and how AMAZING they were!

Our commitment to our Eco Schools award continues throughout the school. Year 6 children have discussed and planned improvements to outdoor areas and many of our children have been involved in practical tasks such as path tidying and bulb planting. Burton Morewood's footballers have enjoyed playing matches this term, making use of our great local MUGA facility. They showed great football skills and team spirit in all the matches!

This week we held our annual dance event, Strictly Come Burton! We were dancing through the decades with each class choosing a song/dance craze from the past. We had 80s leg warmers, 20s flappers and 50s rock and roll amongst others! It was great fun and made even better by our guest judges Graham 'Anton' Burrows, Sarah 'Shirley' Colyer and Brian 'Craig' Whalley!

This term has seen two classes taking part in skiing lessons at Kendal Snow Sports Centre as part of our ambitious and extensive PE curriculum. Our Year 5 and Year 4 children have learnt new skills and made great progress in their skiing thanks to Mr and Mrs Thexton's great tuition.



Now over to our Year 6 'Roving Reporters'

Nursery children have been reading Jack and the Beanstalk, learning about starting and ending a story. They have been learning about the numbers 1-5 and shapes; circles, squares and triangles! Their project is "Long Ago". They have been comparing old toys to those of today. *Nikita & Latoyah*

Reception's project is "Starry Night"; they have been learning about nocturnal animals, astronauts, watching Neil Armstrong land on the moon and listening to stories from the National Space Station. Linked to this, they have been reading the stories Whatever Next, How to Catch a Star and Owl Babies. They wrote their own story about How to Catch a Star and in maths they have been subitising – that is knowing how many without counting. *Rafe & Sebbie*

School Report continued......

As part of their project learning, **Year 1** have been learning about the "7 continents and the 5 oceans". They have also studied shelter, shade and hibernation and have built some amazing shelters as part of their forest schools afternoons. For "Strictly Come Burton", they danced to the 1950's song Jail House Rock by Elvis Presley! Mrs Duckworth came in to help Year 1 with some lovely baking for Mother's Day treats. In English, they have been writing information fact sheets about animals. *Joshua and Sebastian O*

Year 2 have been learning about "Coastlines". They have found out about Whitby past and present and have written some holiday adverts. They enjoyed a visit from Diana from the R.N.L.I. In maths they are learning the 2-, 5- and 10-times tables. In science, Year 2 have been learning about plants and have planted daffodils outside. *Harry & Sebi*

Year 3 have been reading the book Escape from Pompeii. They have been using it to find verbs, pronouns and present progressive verbs. They are trying to write their own newspapers. In maths they are learning about fractions (especially unit and non-unit fractions). In Design and Technology, they are making robots using CAM mechanisms. *Alexander & Kiki*

Year 4's project is "Misty Mountain, Winding River" and they have been writing a narrative poem about walking up a mountain. They have also had a visit from Mrs Colyer who talked about the mountains she has walked/ hiked in the past years. They have been learning about equivalent and improper fractions in Maths and dancing the Lindy Hop from the 1950s. *Mikey & Amelia S*

Year 5 have been learning about decimal numbers. In English, they have been writing a non-chronological report about allotments. Their project "Sow, Grow and Farm" is about farming and foods. Year 5 have had many visitors like Mr Jeffery (a maths teaching student), Mr Thexton (who came in to talk about astronomy) and Irene (a professor at Lancaster University). In Design & Technology, they have been learning about the seasonality of food and made a seasonal soup. In Art they are learning and creating light and shadows through drawing and sketching. *Thomas & Amelia T*

Year 6's project is "Frozen Planets". We have been learning all about the Arctic and Antarctic, the geography of these fascinating parts of our planet and the history of the exploration and race to the South Pole. We have studied the biology of animals and plants who survive in the Arctic and have created our own classification keys. In English, we are doing lots of work on grammar and punctuation to help us with our SATs preparation. We have been learning about adverbials, hyphens – colons: and semi-colons; to name but a few. Our current class novel is The Wolf Wilder by Katherine Rundell, an exciting story set in the times of Russian revolution. In maths we have been learning about ratio and algebra and are continuing to work hard on practicing our arithmetic skills. *William & Jack*

Burton Fell Walkers - Walk Reports

Alcock Tarn & Rydal Water Walk, 16th March - 8 miles, 1000 feet of ascent

We left the Memorial Hall at 8.30am to drive to a lay-by above Grasmere from where we started our walk. The weather forecast promised dry and partly sunny conditions with rain later. The first, steep, section (on the path that starts by the Swan Hotel) was taken at gentle pace. The surrounding fells were initially shrouded in mist and it was lovely to see landmarks such as the 'Lion & the Lamb' (Helm Crag) gradually appear as the Sun rose higher. Wrens sang loudly nearby and we saw large quantities of frog spawn in and around the becks that run alongside the path.

The route took us underneath the rocks of Butter Crag, with splendid views of Stone Arthur on the other side of the gill, to each the delightful Alcock Tarn. We took a break to enjoy the wonderful views down to Windermere and across to Coniston and its surrounding mountains. It is Helena's tradition to lead a 'birthday walk' on the weekend nearest her special day, and we were delighted to enjoy the delicous cake and wine she brought along to celebrate.

From the Tarn we walked down the path to the A591 where we crossed over to take the path to Rydal Water. It's a date in Burton & Clawthorpe! History notes by Kath Hayhurst

A charity board in Burton church states that in the 1657 will of John Hutton from Hindon County Durham, he left the residue of his money to the master of the free Grammar School in the village.

In 1688, a document in Kendal archives records that a John Lucas was granted a licence to build and erect a schoolhouse upon land given by John Hutton of Burton. John Lucas had to lay the timber of the schoolhouse upon "ye gable end of the said dwelling house", and it had to remain for the use and privilege of John Hutton etc. The document was signed by them both and two other men. In addition, three men made their mark.



Presumably the date on the lintel of the property, 1689, as shown in the drawing above, refers to when the building was finished.

A tablet in Burton church refers to a John Lucas of Holme. When he died in 1794, he left money for charitable purposes.

The later date on the lintel, 1785, was during the ministry of another John Hutton , he was said to be the longest serving vicar in Burton, 1764 -1806.


The Grammar School is also recorded on different tablet in Burton church; that of John Parkinson, Surgeon and Apothecary. He bequeathed £800 when he died in 1797, to the Grammar School of Burton to assist the poor (20) boys and (14) girls. Kath Hayhurst.

Míke's Meanderíngs Around Burton

This walk takes you to the East of the village and through Dalton. There is a lovely wooded area just before you reach the road to Dalton which is at its prettiest in the Spring. There is a small, unavoidable section of road passing Home Farm and you may choose to come back to the village via Vicarage Lane rather than braving the still very muddy Slape lane. Some of the stiles are narrow and there is one climb with steps over a wall.

Start at the Square, go up Kidnapper Lane, the entrance is in the northeast corner next to the Royal's south wall, at the top go through a stile to the right, bear to the left and walk diagonally across the field in a south easterly direction to a kissing gate. Again, cross diagonally to a narrow style – keep to the path (crops). The path now leads onto Dalton Lane (B), turn left walk up the lane till you pass Home Farm on the left and a little farther on, there is a footpath sign (C). Cross the field (sheep) and aim for the left edge then the left-hand corner of the field under the trees.

There, a stone stepped stile leads over the wall on to a lane, turn left towards Roses Cottage and in front of its gate turn left on a path into the woods. Meander through the woods to reach the gate on the other side on the junction of two lanes, your first choice is to turn left to walk through the hamlet of Dalton over the hill and down Vicarage Lane back to the village. The total length of this walk is 4km. Alternatively, you can follow the route on the map (D-E) which continues along footpaths through Storth Woods to Slape Lane and back to Vicarage Lane. This adds 1.3km and avoids a road section but I would wait until we've had a dry spell – or wear your wellies and be prepared to wash the dog!
