

Burton Fell Walkers Walk reports September 2024

Levens Park [Wednesday]

Our Wednesday walks are less than 5 miles and at a slower pace. A group of 9, including 3 new members started out from Levens Hall. We walked along the undulating left hand side of the river, spotting 3 black fallow deer ahead. But where were the goats?

Our leader Mike led us up to the infilled canal, with its incongruous canal bridge in a field. We looked across to Sedgwick House, built in 1868 according to the information board. Coming back to Levens Park, we followed the other side of the river. Still no goats, but some interesting old trees around. Then the smell hit us. Not Mike's socks, but the famous Bagot goats sitting calmly by the path. After many photos, we carried on to well-earned refreshments at Levens Hall cafe.



Heversham Head [Sunday]

This was an afternoon walk, approx 5 miles, 500 feet ascent. A group of 6 headed away from Heversham. The leader Sarah was aided by the group to find the tricky field exit onto Woodhouse Lane. Crossing Dallam School playing field, our first tea break was at the top of the hill. We explored the fields and green lanes of Hincaster and the Levens estate, before climbing up to Heversham Head trig point. The rain clouds greeted us, but we still had views of Whitbarrow, Arnside Knott and Farleton Fell. We passed the toposcope, down towards the visible church spire, noting a field of 'teddy bear sheep' (maybe Southdowns?). Our walk finished in the very large Heversham Church, with its parish chest and Northumbrian cross.

Finally a comment from a new member: "After much consideration I have just become a member of the Burton Fellwalkers and have completed two walks with them. I thoroughly enjoyed both walks (5 miles each) and found everyone very welcoming, friendly and helpful. I think it's a great way to meet new people and get out into our beautiful countryside and I can definitely recommend it. I just wish I had done it sooner!" [A Burton resident]



Burton Bowling Club

End of season report

Not to be outdone by the Table Tennis Club (to which huge congratulations for its successes as reported last month) our bowling club has had it's own *annus mirabilis*. For the first time in it's recorded history, the club's Kendal League A team won the First Division championship. This league boasts a very high standard of the game, and some very experienced and successful players are spread around the clubs in the Division.

In addition, the club's Kendal League B team won the championship of the Second Division and with it, promotion to the First Division for 2025. This gives rise to the prospect of the A and B teams playing each other twice next year which will no doubt put everyone on their mettle. Further success was provided by the Morecambe League B team who won the Fourth Division of the League and gained promotion to the Third for next year. This was a particularly creditable achievement as, owing to a combination of factors, there were occasions when fielding a full eight players was challenging. This in turn led to some additional recruiting of players as the season progressed, including some new to the game but eager to be involved.

The club has decided not to enter the Floodlit League this year, and so the playing season is over for now. The opportunity is being taken to carry out work on the green to preserve and enhance the bowling surface, and a major project is under way to renew the boards around the edge of the playing surface which have become rotten in many places. The Club acknowledges the financial and other support provided by the Recreation Trust.

Night skies over Burton – Extra!


Hello all, it has been great to see how many of you are managing to capture and post a few images of the recent auroras – let's hope for a few more good displays as we move into the darker evenings.

There is another celestial visitor I thought you might like to keep an eye open for as we run into October – Comet C/2023A3 Tsuchinsha.

The Asteroid Terrestrial-impact Last Alert System (ATLAS) telescope in South Africa discovered Comet C/2023 A3 on February 22, 2023. Additionally, observers at Purple Mountain (Zijin Shin or Tsuchinshan) Observatory in China found the comet independently on images from January 9, 2023. Therefore, the comet also has the nickname Tsuchinshan-ATLAS.

At discovery, the comet was still 7.3 times the earth's distance from the sun and extremely faint to all but the highest-powered telescopes. It is believed that it completes an orbit around the sun every 80,660 years.


Comet Tsuchinshan-ATLAS is blazingly speedy. It's tearing through the inner solar system at 180,610 miles (290,664 km) per hour, over 80 km per second relative to Earth. You can see its amazing speed with a small telescope. You can watch the comet's location gradually change by comparing its exact position against background stars just 15 minutes later. It therefore makes it really difficult to obtain stunning photos.



At present, it is still approaching the sun but after the comet gets closest to the sun, it will swing around passing relatively close to Earth. As it does so, it passes almost directly between Earth and the sun, making it challenging to view. In early October the comet will be in the dawn sky but starting from around October 13th to 14th, Comet A3 will be easier to spot on the following evenings. That's thanks to the comet's great speed, which will cause it to appear higher in the western sky on the following nights. At present it is hoped that it will easily be visible with the naked eye but comets are famously fickle and so often disappoint. It is unlikely that it will be as bright as Venus but here's hoping!

So, if we are lucky enough to have a clear sunset and afterglow let's hope we can have the opportunity to have a glance at this cosmic snowball.

Comet C/2023 A3 on October 14, 2024, one day after closest approach to Earth. Facing a western unobstructed horizon just after sunset. Checking on the Stellarium app or online version will keep you up to date.

Vicar's Letter...

Switching the labels

Dear Friends

We're now well into the new academic year and, in schools and universities, students are busy studying our world - everything from ants to whales, from the behaviour of electrons to the motion of stars, from the chemical processes in leaves to the shock waves of a thunderstorm.

But what do they think they are looking at? A fascinating and beautiful world shaped by mysterious and unchanging forces but without ultimate meaning? Or the work of a craftsman who is outside his creation, and who has an eternal purpose for all he has made?

Does it matter?

If there is no Creator then perhaps it doesn't matter whether we realise that, or whether we take comfort in myths about God. Everything will disappear one day anyway.

If there is a Creator then scrubbing him from our studies of his world is a big problem. There is a basic injustice to removing or falsifying the artist labels in a gallery. We're also denying students the most valuable benefit of their studies in science, maths, geography, music or art: "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they display knowledge" (Psalm 19:1-2) And this speech is not dry information about the ultimate power in our universe, it is a letter from the One who made us in love, who knows the purpose of our lives and who has entered his world in his Son to restore us to Himself.

When the Cavendish laboratory was built in Cambridge in 1874, a Bible verse was carved into the oak entrance doors. In that building men would discover the electron, the neutron and the structure of DNA. The second Cavendish lab was built in 1973 and the same verse was inscribed above its doors: "The works of the Lord are great, sought out of all them that have pleasure therein" (Psalm 111:2)

Cavendish III has just been built in Cambridge and will open next year. I understand that Psalm 111:2 will once again be displayed - a reminder that everything that is studied is a work of the Lord, the great God who has revealed himself in his creation, through his son Jesus Christ, and in the pages of his eternal Word, the Bible.
