

# **BURTON TWINNING COMMITTEE**

The twinning committe have got some incredibly exciting news to share with the village. After many years of hard work, we are pleased to announce that later this year Burton-in-Kendal will officially become twinned with Paris!

Many of you may be unaware of the work undertaken by the Twinning Committee, as they have been working secretly for many years to bring off this exciting coup. The committee have been visiting Paris regulalry to try to entice the Mayor to twin his great city with Burton. After much persuasion we have finally received this confirmation email from the mayors office:

"C'etait une surprise car je ne connais pas cette ville 'Burton in Kendal'. J'étais tellement étonné que les habitants pensent qu'une grande ville comme Paris sera jumelée avec cette minuscule ville dans le nord de l'Angleterre. C'est une blague! Un poisson d'avril! Je suis désolé mais pas de chance."

Residents of Burton will obviously be keen to know what this will mean for the village. For a start, you can expect to see many Parisians visiting in the months to come. # PARISH COUNCIL SKETCH

The most recent meeting of the Parish Council took place on 20th March at BMH. Burton News was in attendance on your behalf to examine the goings on behind the scenes of this mysterious organisation. Burton News would like to extend our thanks to the Parish Council for their very kind donation which will enable us to continue producing the newsletter for another year. However we would like to point out that this will in no way affect our editorial impartiality or wliingness to hold those in power to account.

One of the first points of note was the Chair's welcome to a new business in the village in the form of the Royal Oak which had opened just an hour before the meeting began. It was agreed that it was good for Burton to welcome new businesses, and was a reflection of the vibrancy of the village. One councillor was already able to vouch for the quality of the Loweswater Gold beer even though the pub had literally just opened the it's doors for the first time. You really cannot fault our councillors for their eager support of new businesses.

The first items on the agenda regarded traffic through Burton and Clawthorpe. A proposal has been made to reduce the speed limit on the road from the A6070 through Clawthorpe from 60mph to 30mph, for the part of the road that passes by the houses in Clawthorpe. Secondly, an investigation has taken place into the logistics of a crossing near Burton Morewood school. There are practical issues that prevent this from happening, so attention now turns to whether funding can be found for a crossing patrol.

Money has been allocated to the village for improvements to playground. As noted in last month's Burton News, Cllr Vicky Hughes is putting together a working party to decide how best to spend this money. A new notice board has been procured for the village and discussions took place about a suitable location. The bus shelter near Green Dragon Farm was suggested as a suitable location as there are few other suitable sites towards the south of the village.

Discussions took place about renewing the Emergency Plan for the village. This was last used during Storm Desmond in 2015, so it is worth reviewing again now ten years later. The Emergency Plan would allow the council to respond quickly, and call upon volunteers to provide support quickly to help local residents. When the Emergency Plan is enacted all volunteers are covered bu the Parish Council's insurance.

There is a vacancy on the Parish Council. If anybody is interested in becoming a councillor then they need to regisrt their interest with the clerk Christine Davidson at parishclerk@burton-in-kendal-pc.gov.uk, and then an election can be held. If no one wishes to stand then the Parish Council are able to co-opt somebody that they choose onto the Council without an election being required.

# **News from Burton Memorial Hall**

Our April coffee morning is a week earlier this time, on Saturday 12th April, so as to avoid the Easter weekend, and once again we'll have delicious homemade cakes on sale, and we'll have Kingsharp in the car park again from 10am until 12 noon to sharpen your blunt things. Everyone is welcome, and the proceeds help keep the hall running.

I'm still looking for your family stories for the 80th anniversary commemoration of the end of WW2, I've had several really interesting ones sent in so far, but I'm sure there are many more out these just waiting to be told. Your story doesn't need to be about Burton, although it can be and those are just as welcome - on the 1939 Register taken at the outbreak of WW2 where I can see those listed who have passed away now, there are 43 people I can see who were marked as having a volunteer role within the village itself, from ARP wardens to first aiders, land army and auxiliary fire service, and I'd love to hear the memories from the families of those people. But we want to be able to show what the families of people who live here did during the war, not just military service, but your memories of how it affected your life - e.g. were they evacuees or about spending the night in an air raid shelter, how rationing affected them and what recipes they used to make the most of what food there was, or did anyone have a wedding dress made of parachute silk? There are so many stories to be told, so please do share those from your family so we can include them in our display at the hall. If it's easier to talk rather than write them down I'm happy to arrange to come along and have a chat and make notes or record your memories. Just give me a buzz if you'd like to do this.

Meanwhile in the hall, the weekly Warm Welcome Wednesdays are still ongoing, each Wednesday afternoon from 12.30pm until 4pm, with a hot lunch at 1pm. Numbers have risen since these sessions first began, and now average over 20 people each week all coming together for food, chat, mutual support and companionship. If you've not been and would like to attend please just me know so we can ensure that there will be enough food for everyone.

Also on Wednesdays, from 6.30pm-8.30pm, is the Knit and Natter group, where (to be honest) there is often more natter and laughter than knitting, but it does produce those fabulous post box toppers that adorn the box outside the post office, and are now spreading to the smaller one at Clawthorpe! Again, if you'd like to join in you'd be very welcome (and there is cake every week too!)

Finally, a call out ahead of our Annual General Meeting on Tuesday 3rd June, in that our treasurer has indicated that, due to her ongoing work demands, she will not be standing for re-election this year, so we will once again be seeking a new treasurer from June. # IT'S A DATE IN BURTON BY KATH HAYHURST

9 February 1828 'The Lancaster Gazette'

To be Let by Proposal for a Term of Years, all that old established and well-accustomed Posting and Travelling House, called the King's Arms, situated in the centre of the market town of Burton-in-Kendal, which has, for a number of years, been conducted by the owner, Mr. John Dixon, who is wishful to retire from business; together with the extensive stabling, coach-house, cow-house, brewhouse and granary, with an excellent bowling green, orchard and large garden, and about 16 acres of excellent meadow land in the highest condition. The buildings are all of recent erection, the house convenient having two large parlours, bar and two kitchens, on the 1st floor; large assembly and drawing rooms, with three bedrooms on the second floor; and six bedrooms on the 3rd floor with a good attic above - all cellared underneath. The King's Arms Inn possesses the most desirable advantages for carrying on an extensive coaching and posting business, having four coaches passing and re-passing daily. Proposals, in writing, will be received by the said John Dixon, the owner.

# A Good Day?

Dear Friends,

"What is wrong with the world?" If I asked you all this question I would receive a large assortment of answers! Whatever you think of the Bible, its ancient answer does make sense of the world that we live in:

We are created to be God's ambassadors, his agents in his world. What's gone wrong is that we don't want the job. We would rather serve a different 'god', one who doesn't restrict us or expect us to serve him, a 'god' who leaves us free to pursue comfort, wealth, approval, success or self-indulgence. We might say our family is all that matters to us, or the good of the nation or the planet, or we might be fully committed to an 'ism' – they can all be ways of serving the goals we choose.

Our hymns are 'I did it my way' and 'No-one tells me how to live my life' but a whole world of people pursuing their own agenda leads to the darkness that we experience – irritation, selfishness and loneliness through to hatred, violence and war. Darkness with glimpses of light that make our hearts ache with a deep sense that life should be better than this. 'Do whatever makes you happy' does not make us happy.

And the relationship that is most damaged is with our Creator – we want life and all his other gifts but not his authority over us. How could we complain if swift judgment followed?

How amazing then if our Lord should don our garb and wade in to take our mess on himself. "He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree." That tree was the

cross from which Jesus cried out as he allowed God's wrath at our sin to fall on him, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me!"

Thorns – a symbol of creation against us – were made into a crown and pressed into Jesus' head. Iron – a gift in the rocks from our Creator – was shaped into nails to kill him.



And that terrible day became known as 'Good Friday'.

# RECIPE PAGE

Dear Burton in Kendal folk

I once again would like to share another recipe with you from Northern Ireland. I was over in Belfast a few weeks ago and this is a very popular no bake recipe. I do hope you will try this one... easy to do and is popular with many people.

## **FIFTEENS**

# **INGREDIENTS:**

15 marshmallows quartered ( or 60 mini marshmallows)
15 digestive biscuits .... Crushed
15 glacé cherries quartered
7 oz or 200 grams of condensed milk
Desiccated coconut

#### METHOD:

- 1. In a large bowl add crushed digestives, marshmallows and cherries.
- 2. Pour in condensed milk and thoroughly mix together.
- 3. Using baking parchment approx 12x8 inches or larger.... Sprinkle desiccated coconut on it, then add the mixed ingredients along the middle of the paper (to form a log about 2x2 inches)
- 4. Roll up the parchment so it forms the log and is covered with coconut. Wrap tightly and then wrap in clingfilm and place in the fridge.
- 5. When it is firm to touch ....slice into 15 pieces (or thereabouts)
- 6. Put the kettle on and have a brew/ coffee
