PICKLEBALL

From Tea Time to Mosh Pit: The Violent Evolution of Modern Pickleball

Ah, the "Good Old Days"; Picture it: the year is 2016. You and your opponent are dinking the ball back and forth at the speed of a leisurely Sunday stroll in the Lake District. Your paddle feels like a flimsy slab of plywood—or possibly a rejected cafeteria tray from the local infant school. You wait, and you wait, and you wait patiently for them to make a mistake.

Well, wake up, buttercup, because ten years later, that era is as dead as a dial-up modem. Today, pickleball has evolved into a high-octane thriller. Modern paddles pack enough carbon-fibre juice to launch a ball into orbit, and today's players are faster, stronger, and significantly more chaotic. If your entire strategy is still "I'll just dink and pray"; a teenager wielding a weapon made of space-age foam is going to aggressively blast you right off the court.

Enter: Controlled Aggression

The most feared players on the court right now aren't just relying on soft shots. They are mastering the unholy trinity of the modern game:

The Drives: Whipping blistering but controllable forehands across the net.

The Attacks: Speeding up the ball when the opponent is least expecting it.

The Soft Resets: Absorbing that incoming heat and dropping it perfectly into the kitchen.

The Calm and the Violence

The modern pickleball point merges a lulled, zen-like dink rally with sudden, violent ankle-level drives, leaving players feeling like they've wandered into a mosh pit while holding a cup of tea. To survive this shift from calm to violence, players must utilize smart blocks and resets to steal momentum back rather than hoping for opponent mistakes.

End of Season Update – May 2026

The Kendal & District Senior League was completed at the end of April. The League Awards Presentation Evening and KO Cup Final was hosted at Burton on April 29th. Thanks to Ben O'Flynn and Simon Waring for arriving early and helping to set up. Thanks also to Susan McGeechan for serving refreshments and light snacks throughout the evening. Congratulations to Division 1 Champions, Burton A, who finished 5 points ahead of arch-rivals Natland A. The destination of the title went to the final match in which Burton A clinched it with a clinical 30-3 demolition of Crook A. The victorious Burton A squad consisted of Ben O'Flynn, Gary Deakin, Peter Baxendale and Chris Knowles.

Burton B achieved a very creditable top half finish, with 5th place in Division 1. Burton C were comfortable winners of Division 2, finishing 92 points ahead of second placed Kirkby Stephen A. Congratulations to the successful Burton C squad of John Fitzgerald, Graeme Wheelhouse, Bryan Walker and Tony March. Burton D finished 5th in Division 2. It is hoped that we will be able to enter an additional team in the KDTTL next season, probably in the new Division 3 which the League is hoping to introduce if there is sufficient interest from new players.

The development of junior table tennis at Burton Table Tennis Club has progressed nicely this season with 5 Burton juniors playing in the Kendal & District Junior League. The next round of Junior League matches is expected to take place in October. Since the taster sessions at the end of February, a further 12 junior players have attended at least one of our junior sessions on a Thursday teatime. The final Junior session will take place on Thursday, May 21st, followed by the summer break. Junior TT will resume on Thursday, September 3rd @ 5.00.

Attendance at the Adult Social sessions, 6-7 on a Thursday, has improved steadily as the season has gone on and 14 players, including 4 Division 2 Burton TTC players, have attended at least once over the course of the season. The next step may be to consider the possibility of an extra session midweek, during the day, if there is sufficient interest. Adult Social TT will resume on Thursday, September 3rd, 2026 @ 6.00.

Painful truth

Dear Friends

The side of my jaw is numb all the way to my ear and I've been warned not to chew on that side for two days. Yes, I was at the dentist this morning having a filling replaced.

Why do we subject ourselves to such pain? My mouth hadn't been hurting at all, until the dentist got to work! But of course I trusted the dentist's judgment when she told me that there was some decay that needed to be treated, even though I was unaware of it. Disease is a bad thing, but not knowing that you need treatment is more serious. Even while I was suffering the pain of treatment I did find comfort in knowing that a skilled practitioner was doing me good.

Complaining sticklers (aka 'Pharisees') followed Jesus everywhere grumbling about what he was doing and saying. They strongly objected to him eating at the home of a tax collector (notorious for cheating and for collecting taxes on behalf of the hated Roman invaders). And they grumbled that the other dinner guests were 'sinners' who had openly flouted moral standards and laws.

But Jesus said that he hadn't come to treat people who were well. Doctors and dentists focus their efforts on those who are sick, and Jesus claimed to be a doctor for our souls with the power to treat our deepest disorders. "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners." (Mark 2:17)

Christian congregations are not places for people who are good and who want to shine up their gold stars. They are for those who know they are sick and are willing to entrust themselves to the painful but effective treatment of Doctor Jesus.

The Pharisees, of course, did not need such treatment. They were good people, at least in their own eyes, 'who never did anyone any harm'. Maybe if they hadn't been so quick to dismiss Jesus he would have been able to tell them about their undiagnosed disease and counsel them to come to him for a cure.

IT'S A DATE IN BURTON - KATH HAYHURST

13th June 1840 - Whit Wednesday

We were also favoured with the procession of the Mechanics' Club from Holme which, in conjunction with the others, rendered the scene a very imposing one.

PARISH COUNCIL SKETCH

This month's Parish Council meeting started with the election of Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson for the next 12 months. It was proposed that Councillor Mason-Hornby be elected for a further year. The motion was passed unanimously. Councillor Wren has been Vice-Chair for the last 12 months, and was re-appointed for the next 12 months. The following councillors were appointed to various committees. Cllr Hughes will be the representative on the Burton Education Committee, Cllr Daly will continue on the Memorial Hall Committee, Cllr Wren will be the representative on the Quarry Liaison Committee, and Cllr Isherwood will be the representative on the school Board of Governors. Representatives were also appointed to several working parties.

In the Open Forum, several members of the public were in attendance. The first resident to speak wanted to raise an objection to the planning application to change use of a field in the west boundary of Curwen Woods Estate from agricultural use to a secure dog exercise area. Concerns were raised about an increase in traffic that would result in this change of use, as well as the noise from the dogs using the new facility. Questions were raised whether further facilities would be required in the future, as the business grows. In response those who have made the application argued that they were merely trying to provide a new facility for the use of the village, and would be of benefit to the village.

When this planning application was discussed by the Council later in the meeting, concerns were raised about the volume of use, although it was also felt that it would be positive to have this facility accessible to residents in the area. During public consultation the council received 48 comments in favour, and 7 against. It was therefore proposed that the Parish Council should recommend to WFDC that the application is approved but that there should be strict conditions on traffic movement, and that there should be no special events held on the site. This proposal was passed unanimously.

In regards to traffic calming, the clerk of the PC has asked someone from Highways department to come along to the village to assess any suitable traffic calming measures, but they have refused to come, stating that they are too busy.

In other news...Meadow Close to Boon Town footpath is still ongoing. Again representatives at WFDC have said that they are too busy to deal with this at the moment. In regards to the replanting of 19 trees, the holes are ready for the trees, and the Market cross is due to be repointed. There is still one vacancy on the PC. The Playground Working Group are in the process of applying for grants.
