PC Observations...

Reporting from the
Parish Council meeting

Eight out of nine parish councillors, the county and district councillors, two members of the public with planning interests, and reporters for the Gazette and BN were at the meeting. It was a pity more residents were not there because this was another Parish Council meeting in which the sum of many small things highlighted the value of this most local part of local government.

Chairman Alan Wren read out the monthly police report which noted only one non-traffic related incident. A resident had reported, on the following morning, having seen a suspicious male in their garden on the previous evening. The majority of traffic reports concerned obstruction of the roads by the school and the resulting dangers. Once again Alan had talked to our PCSO to ask her to attend council meetings but the police management are adamant that a PCSO's time can be better utilised than attending all the PC meetings in their area.

Planning matters took up most of the meeting, with consideration of the revised plans for the Church Bank Gardens development and the revised

plans for an extension to a property on Morewood Drive. In both cases the Council seemed pleased that the plans had been revised to meet the objections raised by residents and the Council. In particular the Church Bank Gardens development seemed to the Council to offer a better layout with more open space. It was left to one of the new councillors, Sarah Colyer, to remind the Council that the proposed development did little to protect the existing hedgerows as required in the planning guidance. The owner of the Morewood Drive property had come to explain the changes he had made to meet the previous objections. After debate the Council raised no objection to any of the planning applications. However, Jane Hopwood reminded the Council of the importance of following the Standing Orders and taking a formal vote before deciding an issue.

As an aside, this seemed to me a sensible and timely suggestion for a bit of formality especially with new members of the council to consider. It might also be an idea to politely ask the District Councillor not to sit as part of the Council. This is confusing for the public. Sitting at the edge makes clear their role of being in attendance to report on matters, when asked, and to be interrogated on the performance of SLDC.

The Chairman also reported on the Green Dragon Farm Development Brief meeting attended by councillors and authorities, such as highways and utilities. The main point of discussion was around the need for light industry in the development and where, in relation to the housing, this should be sited. A comment by the district councillor implied that SLDC had already privately decided on the need for light industry – a bit worrying since one of the aims of the consultation is to decide the “overall vision for the site”. By the time BN comes out the public meeting will have happened and residents will have had the opportunity to give their views. However, the consultation doesn't close until 21 July. Check out the SLDC Development Briefs website page for details.

The Clerk had been busy researching speed indicator devices. The going price was over £3,000 and the Council decided to ask suppliers for more details. Paul Rogers, the wise voice of experience, asked that particular attention be paid to the warranty and maintenance arrangements.

During Councillors' reports (always the best bit) Moira reported that grant funding is coming in to resurface the MUGA. Alan Wren had repaired the zip wire in the playground. He had also attended the quarry time extension

public exhibition. Francis Mason-Hornby asked, following the resurfacing of Dalton Lane, that central white lines be omitted from the narrow stretches to encourage safer driving. And David Haigh reported that he had done a litter pick at Plain Quarry (in the finest tradition of a Council which gets on and does stuff.)


Finally our County Councillor, when asked, gave a comprehensive report on his activities with the Highways department – which I am sure will be reported elsewhere in BN.

Trust me!

"We know that you have been badly served by those who came before us. They made promises that they didn't keep, but my party will be radically different. Trust me. You've had enough of dishonest, self-serving and weak leaders – wait until you see what I will do for you!" (Hopeful politician)

Roger Reports...

from the District & County Councils

Now that the elections, are for the time being, over I have concentrated on local matters. I have now toured the entire ward twice with the highways engineers checking on what has been done, needs doing or what has not been done properly. Though NOT a complete list, Burton's highways 'issues' included: Moss Lane - sharp drop edges to be filled with stones, pot holes by the demolished pub need filling, white lines at junction with Station Road to be monitored, 'Post Office Lane' and Main Street near The Creamery to be checked regarding effectiveness of recent flood protection work, junction markings at Boon Town and Main Street to be completed, resurfacing of bottom end of Boon Town road to be assessed, pot hole on Tanpits Lane near St. James Drive to be filled, on Tan Pits Lane 'can the kerb be extended to relieve drainage problems?', Mowbray Drive footpath to be assessed for resurfacing and a pot hole to be repaired, Church Bank can the notice be altered to state where the Church Bank Gardens houses start?, 'what progress has been made about plans to extend the footpath as far as Sandy Gap?', 'can we step up speed monitoring to support repeated

requests for a lower speed limit to beyond Clawthorpe?', Clawthorpe Lane edges need filling and Pipers Lane to be assessed for future surface dressing. We have also been asked if the area outside Shoemakers Cottage on the corner of Neddy Hill is council property so that we can put it down for resurfacing.

Regrettably, I have received further complaints about SLDC's failure to collect refuse and, along with residents, I am exasperated by the time it takes to get through to the Council, the delays in making a quick response and the repeated reassurances that the 'new' (nine months old) scheme is working perfectly! Similarly, when a suspicious looking person was reported to me following recent thefts, I repeatedly failed to get through to the police by dialling the 101 number until long after the potential offender would have left the area. I have raised this fault with our new Police and Crime Commissioner.

My work on the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Enquiry has now concluded and the committee will report to the cabinet in September. I remain unhappy about the lack of residential accommodation within Cumbria for seriously disturbed young people who are now 'sent' to Prudoe in

Good news includes the progress of 'Connecting Cumbria' to Superfast Broadband. The government is being asked to fund the last 5% of the programme to reach all rural areas. Whether this will improve communications between Councils, the police etc with the community awaits to be seen!

It's a record! We have more Swifts nest in Burton this year than at any time during the past three years (since we have been counting.) At the time of writing (20 June) we have recorded no less than 22 individual nesting sites. Lots more immature Swifts will have accompanied the adults on arrival and will remain for a few weeks before setting off back on the long journey. Usually these non-breeders (which can be non-breeders until their third year) will set off on their return journey to Africa around the middle of June, whilst the mature birds don't leave until their young have fledged, which can be anywhere from about the third week in July to mid-August.

The adult Cuckoos are also on their way back, having started to leave the UK from about the 15 June onwards, and this departure will carry on until the first weeks of July. The successful young Cuckoos will start to leave us during August. It has always amazed me in that these young birds do not

have any guidance or help by their parents to negotiate the journey back to Africa, it's all down to their own volition. To think all this navigational stuff was programmed into that small egg. Also interesting to get several reports of a Cuckoo being heard over on the Farleton side.

Most of our regular migrant species have all returned OK and numbers at first counts seem to be reasonably stable (but not at all sure with the hirundines!) Although after saying this I still feel that maybe the Spotted Flycatchers are struggling with very few records again this year. And besides the migrants I am struggling to record Yellowhammers this year, but hopefully I will get some better counts over the coming weeks. During the month I have had further records of single Hawfinches being seen in the Dalton and Burton areas. Also a Ring Ouzel was recorded in early June near Whin Yeates. A rare sighting of a Firecrest near Dalton Hamlet.

Butterflies this month have included a fabulous display and the best for years of the migrant Painted Lady with several being seen in Dalton and on the Common from the 6 June onwards. Also on the same day I recorded the emergence of the Small Pearl Bordered Fritillary which could be seen throughout Dalton, Lancelot and the

Common and drastically increased in numbers over the following days. Also in the last few days (20 June) we have been honoured with the emergence of the first Meadow Browns, and Large Skippers. Also seen in numbers are the Speckled Woods.

We have done extremely well this year with the Fly Orchids showing at five different sites on Hutton Roof. Also starting to show are the early signs of the Broad Leaved Helleborines and the Dark Red Helleborines, but we should get the best of the Dark Reds from about the middle of July and the best of the Broad Leaved following on and into early August. This year will be so special with the Orchids, and I can't wait to further research our special hybrids the *Epipactis Schmalhauseneii* (hybrid between the Dark Reds and Broad Leaved of which we have about 20 in total). Also it will be so interesting to see what sort of Palens variants we will get this year (a rare variation of the Dark Red Helleborine). If we are lucky we may also get the Green Flowered Helleborine or the Heath Fragrant Orchid.

The Lily Of the Valley and the Angular Solomon's Seal will have gone over by now. Some of the other plants which have started showing since last month have been Heath and Limestone Bedstraws, Crosswort, Lesser Meadow

Rue, Hairy Rockcress, and soon we will also get Biting Stonecrop; hopefully we will also get the rare Pale St. John's Wort, and the Northern Bedstraw etc.

Our Swift Bird Study Group meet up on a weekly basis on a Thursday evening at 8.30pm at the Memorial Hall and if anyone wants to join us they would be most welcome.




Burton Memorial Hall

1956 - 2016

Sixty years ago, on 21 July 1956 the Foundation Stone for the Memorial Hall was laid in place by James Caunt, esq, J.P. It took many years of fund-raising from 1940 by a large and active committee to be able to raise enough for the work to go ahead. Also present on the day were Mr Joe Brown (architect), Rev. J Phillips, Mr Peter Cummings (Chairman) and many villagers.



The building works took almost a year from the laying of the foundation stone, and the hall was officially opened in May 1957.





Historical Footnote...

WET WARS

Most local people know that in the 1745 Rebellion Bonnie Prince Charlie and his Scottish Jacobite forces advanced and, later, retreated through Burton.

Yet, a century earlier, the village was affected by longer conflicts swirling around South Lakeland during the Civil Wars between Royalists or Cavaliers and Parliamentarians or Roundheads.

In 1643 Sir George Middleton of Leighton Hall gathered local Cavaliers and splashed across Morecambe Bay to Furness where they were defeated at the Battle of Swarthmoor. Next year, retaliating Royalists under the Sir Marmaduke Langdale swept through South Westmorland.

But, going on into Yorkshire they were defeated at the Battle of Marston Moor. Afterwards, fleeing Royalist remnants were harried near Burton by Parliamentarians advancing from Lancaster under Colonel Briggs.

Traditionally they skirmished at the top of Dalton Lane on a site now marked by 19 trees 'one for each man killed'. Then, after a lull of two years, during the

Second Civil War, the whole area was assailed by a 20,000 strong royalist Scottish army under the Duke of Hamilton, who, the inhabitants moaned, 'brought lice and Presbyterianism with them'.

Meanwhile, in July 1647, Royalist troops, crossed the Irish Sea from Ulster to Lancaster, and then meandered around Burton until they joined the Scots near Kendal. At this point they encountered Kentdale's most notorious element, the weather. It rained and rained.

Forced to shelter for a week they stripped the district of human food and, also, of horse fodder safeguarded from the sodden summer's scanty hay crop. They then squelched southwards in the unremitting deluge. Going via Hornby, they evaded Roundhead forces in Lancaster, only to be eliminated by Oliver Cromwell's Ironsides at the Battle of Preston on 17 July.

Finally, to the relief of residents, out of the original 20,000 invaders a mere 800 cavalry and 1,200 foot trickled back, in the northward retreat, through Burton and, still, it kept on raining.
